Our committee is highly experienced and frequently committed. Tim Illingworth has been running conventions since they began in 1937, at least you'll think so if you meet him at 3.00 am on Monday morning in a room party.

The rumours of committee division published in Great White Shark are totally untrue, the stories about mass resignations written by Saloon Snake are also unfounded, nothing has changed since our last PR. Anyone found spreading such lies will be sent dead cats, unicorn excrement, copies of Battlefield Earth, the complete Perry Rhodan (in German), a crate of Powzie!, a weekend break at the Brighton Metropole, and a phial of bookworms. If this fails you will get a letter from our lawyer.

Conventions today are staid, stale and stultifying, they might as well be peas in a pod. Well, we promise you something different. The committee has learnt from past mistakes, cons in recent years have run too smoothly (with the glorious exception of Conspiracy), and have been far too well organised. We are using several approaches to deal with this problem.

In order to conteract the "floating convention syndrome", while using familiar faces, we shall use them in previously unknown contexts. Apart from essentials, like emergency repairs to the hotel fabric, we intend breaking up the old teams

and bringing in fresh blood.

We are starting with the committee itself. With rare exceptions jobs are being rotated, so no member has long enough in any job to attain conventional modes of thought. For this reason minutes of meetings are not being made, and contact between present and past committee members is strongly discouraged.

We glory in our own incompetence and neither need nor want to be rescued. We want to make our own mess, in our own way, in our own time (and yours). Would be rescuers at the con will have their train tickets taken from them and will be pointed in the general direction of Thurso.

The Programme

In keeping with the wilderness setting of our hotel we intend concentrating on "green" issues within SF, much of our program-

ming is in keeping with this theme.

The convention is set among the first forests in this area since before the last Ice Age. Watch the saplings grow, count them in our tree counting workshop with Rudy Rucker, or simply look on

as they blow over in the frequent force ten winds.

The local moorland and scrub supports a wide variety of fungi, join in the mushroom gathering expedition with two of our guests, or simply sample the results in our Sunday mushroom cooking and tasting workshop. We feel this should adequately compensate for the lack of Sunday opening in the hotel bar.

For the more active among you we have stag hunting with Mercedes Lackey and orienteering with William Gibson, for the less active, how about fishing in the private hotel loch? (Please make sure that any fishing tackle you bring with you is sufficiently acid resistant.

You may prefer to hire it from the hotel.)

We are trying to charter the tourist train "The Hebridean" for special excursions to the pub in Thurso for the railway buffs among you. For the technically inclined and the more adventurous we have obtained the use of the hotel jeep for making day trips to the Dounreay nuclear facility. Since the forestry tracks are often impassable in bad weather we would strongly recommend taking emergency food supplies and shelter if you are venturing far from the hotel either in a vehicle or on foot in the course of any of these activities.

Among our evening activities we will have fanzine readings by our Fan GOH Richard Bergeron, and filking sessions, one of the highlights of which is to be the bagpipe recital from Mike

Whittaker.

If there is sufficient demand there will be a bagpipe training session at 8.00 am on Sunday morning in the main convention room. You might as well join in, you certainly won't get any sleep after it has started. Weather and wildlife permitting, this may be moved outside at midday to allow for the start of the mushroom cooking workshop. A new convention prize, to add to the BSFA, Eastercon, Doc Weir and other prizes will be instituted at this convention. This is the "Rudolph", an elegantly tasteless china sculpture of a reindeer, presented to the convention committee that most shamelessly exploits the tourist potential of its chosen con site in order to tempt the maximum number of gullible foreigners to buy pre-supporting memberships. It will be presented at the gripe session.

The Site

But unlike other cons who make you this promise, we will bring you the full flavour of the Scottish Highlands. We have specially selected a hotel in the centre of the flows country of Caithness so vividly described the way.

For those times when you feel the need to escape the convention you can walk among the newly planted forests, the first since before the Ice Age, you can try your luck at fishing in the lochans surrounding the hotel, or you can get on the train and go anywhere.

Anywhere except Altnabreac.

This area is very unusual for Britain. It has practically no history at all. It was ignored by Neolithic man on his way to the Orkneys, no Iron Age farmers farmed it, no Vikings ever bothered to invade it, it was unaffected by the clearances since there was no one to clear from it, and it was bypassed by all except a few suburban hunter gatherers until recent times.

We believe that this atmosphere of isolation and total desolation will give the claustrophobic ambience that we intend to create in order to get the required number of vigorous discussions and the

correct degree of enraged dissent.

Getting there: One of Altnabreac's great features is its sheer inaccessibility, it is fifteen miles from the nearest paved road, thirty five miles from the nearest airport, and a mile and a half from the nearest railway station. We envisage most attendees arriving by train.

The hotel: is small by Eastercon standards, if you wish to have a room you will have to book well in advance. If you wish to stay in a more comfortable hotel you will have to stay at one of our overflows, but please bear in mind, the evening train service is limited.

Sleeping rough is discouraged by the estate and the foresters. If you are intending going hiking after, or during, the con we would advise you to pack your kit well away, or get advice from the locals as to the best place to sleep.

Facilities: are limited. We suggest that you do your shopping before coming to the convention. Going out for meals will also be

made difficult by the transport problems.

A Scottish breakfast of haggis and well salted porridge is being laid on for all of our guests, but members will appreciate that all snacks have to be ordered in advance so that the hotel can bring the food in by train.
