Since you're reading this, chances are that you are already an **Orlando in '92** Presupporter. Maybe you also have one of our T-shirts, have attended some of our parties, or even have contributed your time, talents and/or money to our Worldcon bid. However, we do have one more favor to ask of you. The efforts of the past 3+ years will be nothing more than a fun exercise in futility unless our supporters remember to **Vote**.

In order to vote, you must have your membership in Noreascon III, the Worldcon to be held Labor Day weekend in Boston. The address is:

If you cannot attend Noreascon, you can buy a \$20 supporting membership, for which you will receive Noreascon's publications, the right to nominate (deadline March 15) and vote for the Hugo Awards, and the right to vote for the site of the 1992 Worldcon. If you're planning to attend Noreascon, attending member-

ships are \$70 until March 15, then \$80 until July 15.

The deadline for Noreascon III preregistration is July 15, 1989. After that date you will be able to buy a membership only at the door.

In early May, Noreascon will send out the site selection ballots. You can vote for the 1992 site either by mail or at Noreascon. When you vote, you will have to pay an advance membership fee of \$20. (Washington D.C.'s suggestion that the fee be increased to \$30 has been officially vetoed.) This \$20 buys you supporting membership in the 1992 Worldcon regardless of who wins. As a Presupporter and voter, you'll also be eligible for the lowest possible price on an attending membership for MagiCon.

So before you forget, before you even finish this issue of the TOHO, send your money in to become a member of Noreascon III. Right now, it's the most important thing you can do to help us bring the 1992 Worldcon to Orlando.



## An Informal Interview With Orlando In '92 Co-Chairman E. Thomas (Tom) Veal

**BT:** The first SF con I remember seeing you at was Westercon 30, but I recently read you actually started a science fiction club ten years before that.

**TV:** Yes, I was a co-founder of the Yale Science Fiction Society, a distinguished group that met scarcely at all but gave great amounts of egoboo to those of us who started it.

**BT:** And when you finished at Yale you went to law school at the University of Illinois, where we met in 1971.

**TV:** That's right. Having learned that I could not make a living in the Classics, which was my major at Yale, I became a lawyer. Shortly after finishing law school, I got trapped in pension planning. I'm currently a specialist in employee benefits law for Touche Ross in Washington, DC. Formerly, I blush to admit, I was a government bureaucrat. Before that, I practiced law in Chicago and in New York.

**BT:** Living in the DC area, is it difficult to co-chair the Orlando bid?

**TV:** Obviously, it would be impossible if we didn't have the very strong local committee we do. With two Co-Chairmen in Florida,

this isn't a "remote control" bid. For my own part, I'm normally in Orlando several days each month, either for bid committee meetings or on other business. More recently, I've been negotiating to buy real property in Florida. It's one of the most fascinating and diversified parts of our country.

In addition, on the theory that one has to try to keep track of the area, I subscribe to The Orlando Sentinel, which gives incredibly thorough coverage of news that is of interest to someone who's trying to run a con in Orlando. The DC committee isn't half so well served by the Washington media. I think I have read more about Florida in the past year than any native Floridian. . . assuming that there are any native Floridians, which I doubt.

**BT:** Oh, come on. We have one on our committee: our Treasurer, Susan Cole.

**TV:** That's right. We sought out the only person who was born in Orlando, lived her whole life so far here and never moved away, and got her on the committee.

**BT:** Let's get back to your fannish history. When did you first become really active in fandom?

**TV:** Shortly after I moved to Chicago I started getting involved in convention running. I was in charge of hotel liaison for Windycons 8 and 9, and Chairman of Windycon 10 in 1983. I was also General Counsel of ISFiC, Windycon's parent body, and was on the ISFiC Board for two years.

At Chicon IV, the 1982 Worldcon, I was in charge of hotel liaison, as well as being their General Counsel. I was also on the Chicon Publications Committee, wrote a number of things for the Progress Reports, did the Restaurant Guide and moderated a couple of panels.

**BT:** In fact, since I was running a programming department for Chicon IV, you and I worked together quite a bit there. That was one of the reasons you became the second member of the **Magicon** bid when I asked you to be my Co-Chairman during Confederation, the Atlanta Worldcon.

**TV:** I was obviously under the influence of something. . .

**BT:** Bidding efforts involve a lot of traveling. What are some of the conventions you've attended on behalf of **MagiCon** over the past two years?

**TV:** Well, of course, this has been a good excuse to get back to Chicago for Windycon and Capricon. I've been out as far as Norwescon in Seattle and as close to home as Evecon and Disclave in DC. I've been to Philcon, Lunacon, Balticon, Archon, Cactuscon and, of course, Nolacon. Not to mention our fine Florida conventions: Tropicon (which was founded by our fellow Co-Chairman, Joe Siclari), Necronomicon and, here in Orlando proper, OASIS, which will be coming up again the week before Memorial Day.

**BT:** The first OASIS was another

chance we had to work together on a convention.

**TV:** Well, that's right. I came intending do nothing but attend the con, but I was immediately grabbed to work on the art show and given two assignments. One was to work on set-up and takedown, and the other was to buy art.

**BT:** I was in charge of the OASIS Art Show before health reasons forced me to resign, and it did come off very well, if I do say so myself. What other Worldcons besides Chicon IV have you been involved with?

**TV:** Well, at Noreascon in 1980, I took time out from the Chicon bid to work both in the masquerade and in operations, and at Constellation in 1983 I worked eight consecutive hours for the masquerade. At Nolacon I was pulled in by Ross Pavlac at the last minute for Program Ops and was Shift Supervisor, etc., for more hours than I want to think about.

**BT:** And you'll be working with Ross again at Chicon V?

**TV:** Yes. Ross is in charge of hotel liaison and I'll be one of his assistants.

**BT:** What are you interested in besides convention planning? For example, what areas of SF do you like?

**TV:** Well, my favorites are hard SF, alternative futures, and light, whimsical fantasy in the Incomplete Enchanter vein.

**BT:** You're also into gaming, are you not?

**TV:** I do a great amount of wargaming. I have what I think is one of the ten largest collections of wargames in the country, filling up the basement of my house.

**BT:** And you seem to have an inordinate number of computers.

**TV:** Somehow this stuff sort of gathers. I currently own five computers in addition to the one at the office. They all, of course, like all proper computers, have names and personalities.

**BT:** And now you are soon to become a professional writer?

**TV:** Well, I don't think people should be looking for my book in dealer's rooms, but John Wiley & Company should, sometime in the spring, be coming out with a work I am co-authoring on pension plan terminations.

**BT:** What do you personally feel are Orlando's best points as a Worldcon site?

**TV:** One important thing is that, in addition to having first-class facilities, Orlando offers a refreshing change of ambiance. **MagiCon** will not be held downtown in a big city. The convention center is on a quiet street with woods and a lake; I think it would be a nice change of pace for the Worldcon.

A second point, naturally, is that the Orlando area has so many attractions with a special SF or

fantasy interest. I hope that we'll throw such a great Worldcon than no one will want to be anywhere else during the core days. On the other hand, those who come early or stay late have a breathtaking choice of entertainment.

Finally, **MagiCon** has an experienced and hardworking committee. I've had plenty of opportunity to work with them, and I'm extremely impressed by their energy, intelligence and dedication to putting on the best possible Worldcon.

**BT:** So how do you envision **MagiCon** will be different from any other Worldcon?

**TV:** We will take the voting fees and move to Brazil. With full disclosure, of course.

Thank you for your support of the *MagiCon* bid. Your presupport dollars help us run a good bid, throw lots of good bid parties, produce a good bid-zine (at least we hope it's all good) and create other bits of assorted fannishness.

But if you really want a Worldcon in Orlando... there's just one way to get it there. **VOTE!** Only Noreascon III members are eligible to vote, so if you are not yet a member, join Noreascon now. Send \$20. to Box 46, MIT Branch PO,

Recently, we answered a detailed questionnaire from Noreascon III. We have condensed some info we thought might interest you :

*How many on the committee have run an SF*

Cambridge, MA 02139 (supporting membership for voting privileges & publications). If you are a member, don't neglect to VOTE!

By mail, or in person, voting requires payment of a voting fee, which counts towards your membership in the 1992 Worldcon. The lowest 1992 Worldcon membership rates will be available to those who vote in 1989.

So, presupporters, give *MagiCon* the votes to make Orlando in '92 a reality.

*convention together?*

ALL of our members have worked on conventions together in the past. Our committee members have helped run over 50 major conventions in a signifi-

cant manner, as chairman, directors or substantial portion of the committee. It would be impossible to include the hundreds of conventions we have worked. Joe Siclari alone has worked on over 60 conventions, chairing 8 of them.

*How many on the committee have Worldcon experience?*

Twenty-five (25) members of the committee have Worldcon & NASFiC experience at staff level or higher. These include 15 senior level positions (Worldcon Chairmen, Board Members and Division heads) and over 100 positions ranging from staff level to Department & Sub-Division Heads.

*What is the expected membership rate schedule for the convention?*

At this time, it is too early to set the complete schedule of rates, but:

a. Those members who vote can become attending members at the lowest conversion rate we set. MagiCon presupporters will have their presupporting membership credited toward their conversion to an attending membership.

b. The initial conversion fee from supporting to attending for voters will be \$20.00. The rates for non-voters will be \$50.00 attending and \$20.00 supporting.

c. The conversion rate from supporting to attending for voters, and the rates for new attending members (who did not vote at Noreascon III) will be good until at least Dec. 31, 1989, and possibly later.

*List the benefits to presupporters if you win & the current number.*

Presupporters will receive a \$5 credit toward the conversion of their supporting membership to an attending membership. Presupporters receive a variety of other benefits during the bidding. There are currently over 1800 presupporters of our bid, more than any Worldcon bid has ever attracted.

*What is the expected weather?*

Neither we nor our competition can brag much about the weather as it is nearly identical. For the convention period the average daily temperature in Orlando is 82° F. In 1988, the average

humidity was 68% with an air quality index of 12 (where 0 to 50 is excellent). There are sometimes brief showers in the late afternoon; these cool things off.

*What transportation is available? (Distance from airport to facility?)*

Transportation to the Orlando area is plentiful whether by air or by land. We can give you directions by water but there is a fairly long portage.

The Orlando airport has the excellent national and international connections that you would expect from the #1 visitor destination in the world. It also has among the most competitive airfare rates available. By land, there is excellent rail and bus service. Near our facilities are interchanges from the Bee Line Highway, I-4, and Florida's Turnpike, with easy superhighway connections to I-95, I-75 and I-10.

The Orlando airport is 8 miles from our principal facility. It is a 12 minute ride on a \$9.00 shuttle. Rental cars are widely available at the airport at the most competitive rates in the country.

*What will be the principal facility?*

The Orange County Convention & Civic Center will be the principal facility of the convention. It is a modern, state-of-the-art 450,000 sq. ft. center of which we have reserved a 220,000 sq. ft. self-contained portion.

*List hotels & other facilities:*

Information on our hotels is listed in the table on the next page. Please note that we have indicated two hotels where we have *already negotiated room rates in 1992 dollars*, including one very nice hotel where the rates will be as low as \$33.00 per night. These rates will allow anyone on a tight budget to plan their convention well ahead of time.

Nearly 100,000 sq. ft. of space in our hotels will be provided at no charge. This is in addition to the 220,000 sq. ft. reserved at the Convention Center. The Center also provides separate offices overlooking the function space at no

charge. Since Florida is a "right-to-work" state, we can use our own fannish workforce for most activities.

*What are the parking rates?*

There is abundant **FREE** parking at all of our hotels. For those who wish to park at the convention center, there is currently a nominal charge of \$3.00 per day.

*Are there swimming pools?*

Every hotel in our package has AT LEAST one swimming pool. (The Peabody has two and the Quality Inn has three!) Hours typically run from 7 AM to 11 PM. We expect to be able to arrange for extended hours for the convention.

*What other facilities are there at the hotels?*

All of our facilities have a variety of amenities and special activities. They all have restaurants and can arrange for transportation to local attractions. Also: The *Peabody Hotel* has a Health Club with Nautilus Equipment, free weights, aerobic equipment, massage therapy, saunas and steam room. There are indoor and outdoor whirlpools and one of the swimming pools is double Olympic length. There is a "Children's Hotel" with full child care and entertainment facilities (and the hotel has a child care license so they can provide additional child care services during our conven-

tion). There are four lighted tennis courts, a game room, Delta Airlines and National Car Rental counter, three hotel restaurants (one open 24 hours), and transportation and tickets to local area attractions.

The *Clarion Plaza International* will have a sauna, whirlpool, lighted tennis courts, video game room, volleyball court, exercise room, two restaurants plus a buffet-style restaurant facility, and a business service center with FAX & copying services on the meeting floor. The *Quality Inn Plaza* provides a game room, gift shop, free local phone calls, free safe in room, a family dining room with buffet breakfasts & dinners (kids eat free). The *Park Suite Hotel* is an all suite hotel that includes a sumptuous breakfast buffet in the price of your room. A special feature of the *Orlando Heritage Inn* is its Dinner Theater.

The *neighborhood* around the hotels and convention center is new, clean, crime-free, of modern design, and built to cater to visitors.

**FEAST.** We estimate that the total capacity (meals/evening) of all restaurants within a one mile radius of the principal facility to be 97,743 (actually 75,000 to 100,000), and within a 5 mile radius - 1.8 million (but who's counting). Let's see, that works out to one meal per evening for 1,800,000 fans OR 100,000 meals per evening for 18 *very hungry fans!*

*List some of the things fans would find interesting to do in your area when they're not at the convention.*

When you are not attending the convention you might want to:

Visit *Kennedy Space Center*, and tour a piece of our future. Walk on a one-acre map of the U.S.A. at *Places of Learning* (and visit a terrific bookstore). Eat Moroccan delicacies at the World Showcase in *EPCOT Center*. Get wet in "Pirates of the Caribbean" in *Disney's Magic Kingdom*. Find out what Harcourt, Brace, Jovanovich is doing to save endangered manatees at *Sea World*. Visit the world's largest collection of Tiffany glass. Tour the "House of the Future" - *Xanadu*, one of the Orlando areas most offbeat sights. Or even participate in a (supervised) archaeological dig into the past of the Seminole Indians.

There are **hundreds** more. For a selection, see our "92 Things To Do in '92" flyer. And remember, 1992 is the 500th Columbian anniversary and the 20th anniversary for Disney World. It's your guess which will be the more extravagant celebration.

*Are you planning any special, non-standard features or events?*

Because many Worldcon attendees can stay only for the convention and will not be able to visit the outstanding sites and attractions Orlando has to offer, we are making plans to bring a part of those attractions to the convention. One particularly exciting prospect: with Kennedy Space Center so convenient to our site, we are working on plans for special guests, speakers, exhibits and displays from NASA that would generally not be available to conventions in other areas.

By 1992, both MGM-Disney and Universal will have their movie studio/attractions operational, giving us the opportunity to plan for elaborate movie exhibits, previews, and possibly grand openings. We intend to work with Sea World to set up some fascinating displays on their nearby facility, especially in terms of the marine research done behind the scenes. MagiCon is fortunate in that we have plenty of exhibit space for static programming such as this. All of the aforementioned are anxious to cooperate and group tours/rates are certainly possible.

### **"Why We Want to Run a Worldcon"**

*Orlando, Where Magic Meets Technology.* The theme of our convention is echoed in our city, our local industry, our committee interests and our intentions.

The Worldcon is the place where devotees of science fiction and fantasy literature meet to celebrate the field. Our committee is eager to put on the field's annual reunion, and to provide the structure and programs with which we entertain, enlighten and educate each other about the riches of our field.

Our plans for MagiCon are to explore the ways in which science fiction and fantasy have meaning and interest to us, to take full advantage of our proximity to Kennedy Space Center and local marine research facilities, and to revel in the magic and adventure characterized by Disney's Magic Kingdom, Sea World and Xanadu.

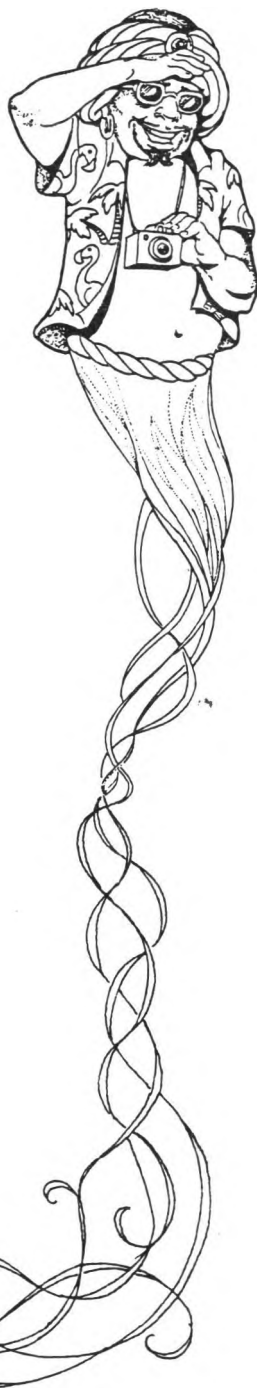

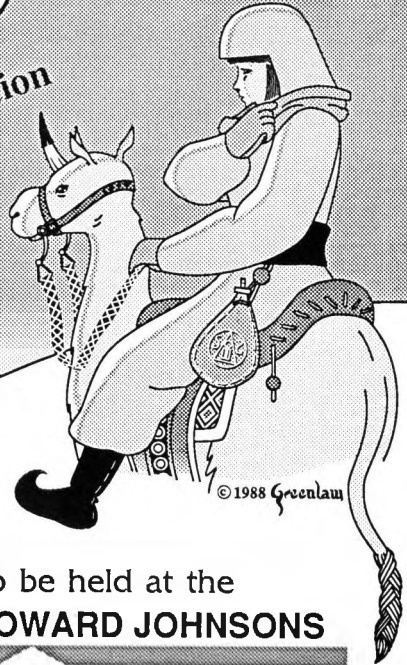
