SYRACUSE THE CITY



PROJECT SYRAKON

Syracuse has been an active con bidder since '64 when the "Port-a-wagon Club" was formed. Its announced goal was to "restore competition to site bidding, not just to overcome lethargy and bring back some excitement and fun, but to prevent the disintegration and end of cons themselves." We were so successful that we almost won "out of turn" (by 11 votes)--defeated, happily, by a strengthened coalition. We still believe in our tenet: A CHOICE BASED ON MERIT, NOT ON DEFAULT. Now "in-turn", we believe we are the best for 1967.

"RP" OK?

We favor the principles of the Rotation Plan as vital to the spirit of world freedom. But our experience, we think, shows the RP needs revitalizing, that fanciful affairs in general (such as BAV & con bidding) need a forum. We pledge that the Syrakon will furnish that forum and work to make it succeed. As for programming, even at this early date, we know that our experience and connections, mixed with old and new ideas, will make it outstanding. 



The diagram shows the floor plan of the convention facilities at the Hotel Syracuse, the finest downtown hotel. Recently completely renovated, the hotel is also completely air-conditioned. The entire BLOCK-LOW tenth floor has been turned over to the Syracon for use. As you see, this includes a giant meeting-hall--ballroom--banquet-hall with balcony. The Fan Art Show will have the spacious East room, exclusively. The N3F will have Parlor D, 24 hours a day. Other parlors, such as E, are available for other organizations.



SYRACON 1967

An outstanding attraction is the private bar--named, coincidentally, the "Skylark Room"--with connecting lounges (A, B, & C) which will be in operation for our exclusive use. Connecting all these rooms is one main corridor, with only con traffic. Hotel restaurants and bars will be open until one a.m., with all-night eating places near-by. A bank of four self-service elevators lead directly into the middle of the convention area.

SYRACUSE IN 1967

Syracuse University is becoming one of the most important centers of science fiction activities in the world. Its library is now an archival agent for many famous writers, editors, fans, etc. in this field, as well as the Science Fiction Writers of America. Manuscripts and books are being collected, to be available for research and the general public. The S.U. Dean of Library Sciences is a "fan." English professor George P. Elliott and News Bureau Director Richard Wilson are s-f writers. University Regent Theatre has had a special cinema program in Fall 1965 of "13 Films of Horror, Fantasy and the Supernatural." Special pamphlets have been published such as an illustrated film program and the "Fictional Accounts of Trips to the Moon," copies of which were distributed at the Pacificon II. The university is the home of the Audio Archives and Edison Foundation Re-recording Lab. This activity, accomplishing what so many s-f fans have pleaded for: recognition, dignity, respectability, gives central NY fandom the firm ground for an s-f convention tops in fun -- and tops in significance.

TRICON PARTY Friday eve, Sept. 2, 1966 the Syracuse Bandwagon Club members held an "openhouse" party for all Tricon members---with lots of refreshments free. Traditionally con-site bidders have done so for years, so our rivals will be having theirs on subsequent nights. However, with four bidders and only three available evenings, Syracuse has invited Boston to be a co-sponsor; thus we demonstrate our sincere support of friendly competition and hope you will consider the Boston group as almost as close as the Syracuse in your affections.
