## APOLOGIA

Now this PR3 is out quite early, so that we can sort out the room bookings as soon as possible. We are hoping that there will still be space to accept Memberships at Easter. To assist us in keeping on top of things, it would be very helpful if you would return the Booking Form even if you do not want a bed or are not coming to BECCON.

## AND SO TO BED.....

The most important part of this P.R. is the Hotel Booking Form, so let us review the aspects of this.

### 1) MEMBERSHIP STATUS.

Rooms may only be booked by full attending members, so please first check your status with the listings at the back of this P.R. The categories used are,

**MAIN LIST** - You joined in time to have a priority option on the room bookings, and will have a white Booking Form. We cannot, however, hold a room for you indefinitely. We must therefore ask you to return the form by 1 March 1985 to obtain your priority.

**ROOM WAITING LIST** - You joined after we had really closed membership, on the understanding that you might not get a bed, and you have an orange Booking Form. If you want to try for a bed, you can return it immediately, but we will not deal with it until after 1 March 1985. The cut-off date to obtain this degree of priority is 1 April 1985, then, if there are still any beds available, they will be offered to;

**MEMBERSHIP WAITING LIST** - Who are not being sent this P.R. at the moment, but will be contacted later if rooms are available.

**NO BED REQUIRED** - You stated when you joined that you would definitely not require a bed at BECCON. A Booking Form is, however, enclosed with parts A & C deleted, and it would be appreciated if you would complete the rest and return it.

### 2) HOW TO FILL IN THE FORM.

#### Section A.

Fill in the type-of-room boxes by inserting a number to show the order of preference (1=most preferred, 2=next best etc.). Please note that, as with most modern hotels, there are VERY few single rooms.

Now fill in the nights-required boxes with a tick for each night you want a room. Note that the Convention will start at approx 6.00pm on Friday, and end at approx 11.00pm on Sunday. We will be running films throughout the night on Saturday.

It will assist the Committee greatly if anybody not requiring to book a bed still completes and returns the form.

## RICHARD COWPER - BECCON 85 G.O.H.

As we announced in PR2 we are very pleased to have Richard Cowper as our Guest of Honour this year. As usual we will be producing, with his assistance, a full Bibliography to go alongside the Convention programme booklet.

However, to tell you something about his life and career, we present the following potted bibliography.

He was born into a literary family in Dorset in 1926, but went to school initially in that hotbed of SF - Norfolk. (Well. . . Aldiss and Fanthorpe to name but 25 authors!!)

After the war and after attending Oxford University he became a teacher. He started publishing stories in the 40's under the pseudonym of Colin Murry and his first novel was written in 1951.

Until 1967, when the appropriately named novel "Breakthrough" was published, almost all his work had been mainstream fiction. The main exceptions to this were two volumes of autobiography. Since Breakthrough almost all his output has been in the Science Fiction field, including novels, stories and articles. This successful transition helped in his decision to become a full time writer in 1970.

He has been happily married since 1950, and now lives on the south coast of Devon.
