FRIDAY

2.30pm - Durham Room - WORKSHOP: BIBLIOBASES - Please note that this will take place in the Durham Room (upstairs in the County Suite), not as printed.

8pm - King's Hall - THE VIEW FROM ANOTHER SHORE - Unfortunately, Krsto Mazuranic is unable to be present this weekend, but John Brunner has kindly stepped into the breach with a talk. What will the talk be about? Come and find out.

8pm - Games Room - ARE YOU PARANOID? - Introduction to the role playing game Paranoia, and introductory game. This will continue until the game is played out, which may be midnight.

10pm - York Room - THE NEW ERA PARTY - New Era Publications are kindly providing free drinks for an hour or so.

11pm - Arden Room - KEITH ROBERTS' DESERT ISLAND POEMS - This will take place in the Arden Room (not the Queen's Hall as advertised).

CINEMA

A note on the Cinema timetable. The rule is that the film will start on or after the hour it is shown as starting, and will end before or at the hour

it is shown ending as far as possible. When time permits, short films will be shown before the film listed in the slot.

Unlike most conventions, BECCON has 35mm film projection facilities, and we have taken advantage of these to acquire some films that are not available in 16mm, and to hire 35mm prints when this was possible. For this and other reasons, there are a few changes from the Cinema Programme as printed.

FRIDAY - 10am - JABBERWOCKY - Monty Python mixes black comedy with fairy tale in a medieval world.

FRIDAY - 12 noon - REPO MAN - 92 minutes - 1985 - This replaces First Spaceship On Venus. A stylish satire on America, flying saucers and everything.

SATURDAY - 2pm - MR VAMPIRE - 90 minutes (approximately) - This replaces 'The Silent Flute'. It's a kung fu vampire movie directed by Samo Hung, and is reputed to be excellent. Note that this is the only showing, and that you are unlikely ever to get another chance to see it.

SATURDAY - 11pm - LEGEND OF HELL HOUSE - Just a note to say that the fireworks are scheduled for midnight, but the film will not be interrupted unless the entire audience vanishes from the cinema. Of course, if they do then the film programme for Saturday night will slip.

SATURDAY NIGHT (SUNDAY MORNING) - 4am - REPO MAN - Replaces 'The Master of the World'.

Finally, note that the the Cinema will close at midnight on Monday. We may, if there is the demand, show 16mm films on request on Monday evening. However, 'Repo Man', 'Mr Vampire', 'Zu: Warriors From the Magic Mountain' and 'Animal Farm' are 35mm and will only be shown as programmed.

LATEST NEWS

About 130 people are in the hotel tonight. First arrival was Larry van der Putte, who came into Birmingham Airport at about 9.30 am. There have also been 7 walkins - not bad when the con doesn't start til tomorrow morning.

PROGRAM CHANGES (for Saturday)

6 p.m. Registration Desk - DEADLINE - for the Ken MacIntyre, Doc Weir and BSFA award nominations. These have to be handed in before 6:00 p.m. on Saturday. The Awards will be presented on Sunday evening.

6 p.m. Games Room - ROLE PLAYING GAMES WORKSHOP - John Dallman and Gary Statman will continue their discussion on the state of role playing games today.

9 p.m. Durham Room - DRABBLE WORKSHOP - A Drabble is a story precisely one hundred words in length (this is not a Drabble). Rob Meades, David Wake and the Birmingham University Drabble Project need 35 more in order to publish, so come and try your hand.

During the judging of the Fancy Dress - Queens Hall - SILENT MOVIE - the 42nd Squadron entertain us (the Mummers' Play is Sunday night), but asked us to warn people that this involves strobe lighting.

11 p.m. Kings Hall - I'M SORRY I HAVEN'T A CLUE - no longer in the Queens Hall, to save it from being squeezed out of existence between the Fancy Dress and the Fireworks.

11 p.m. Cinema - LEGEND OF HELL HOUSE - this film will continue during the Fireworks if there is an audience in the Cinema. Otherwise, the films time-tabled for early Sunday morning will run late.

Midnight - FIREWORKS - Fireworks are noise (Really? - Ed.), and these will be let off over the Lake to the rear of the Hotel. If your room over looks the pavillion and the Lake (as opposed to the car park), children or pets may be disturbed. You have been warned. 

LAST WORDS FROM BECCON

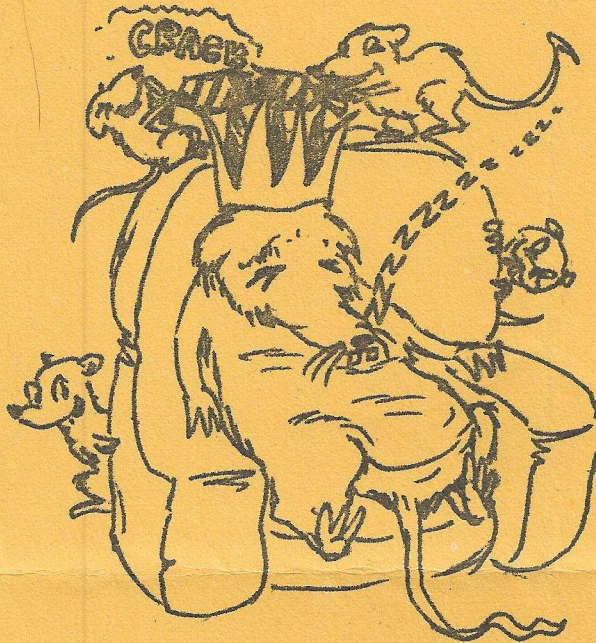
