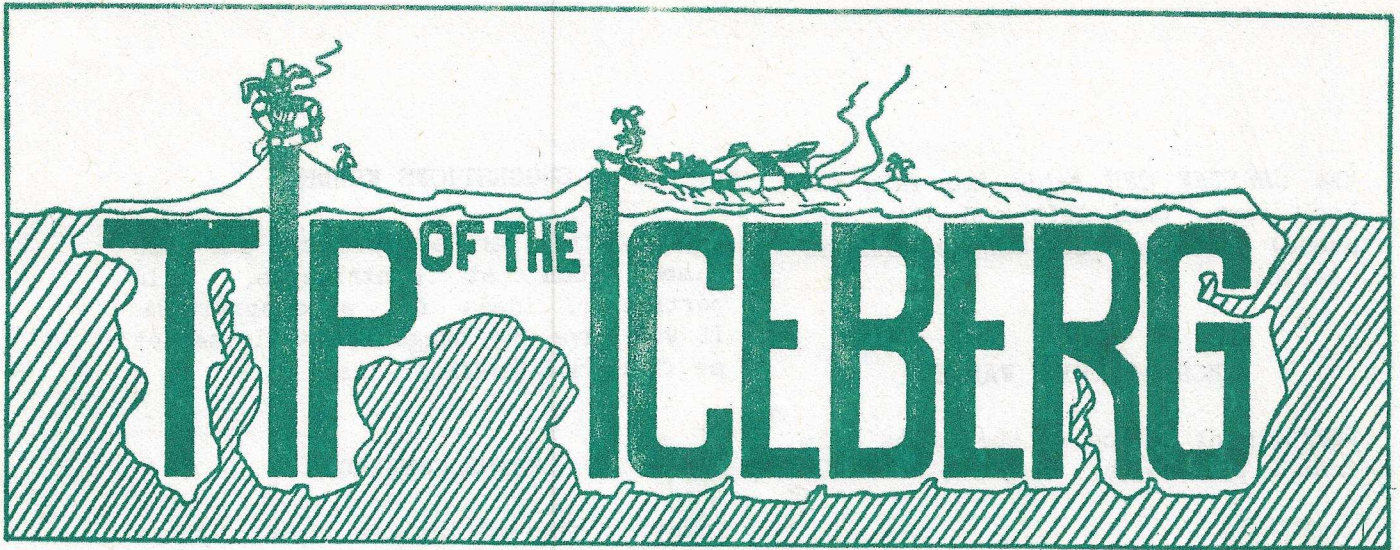

DARK WOOD SWORDS

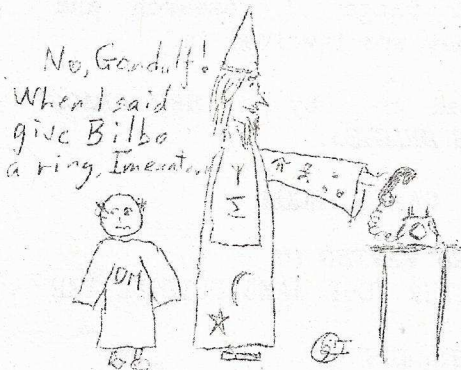

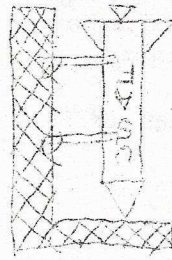



You'll have to wait to hear about this, but I guess it'll be something to get your teeth into.

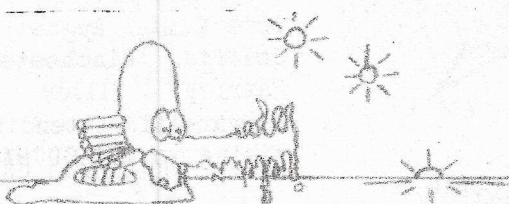
IMMINENT WORLD SHORTAGE II (? - Ed.)

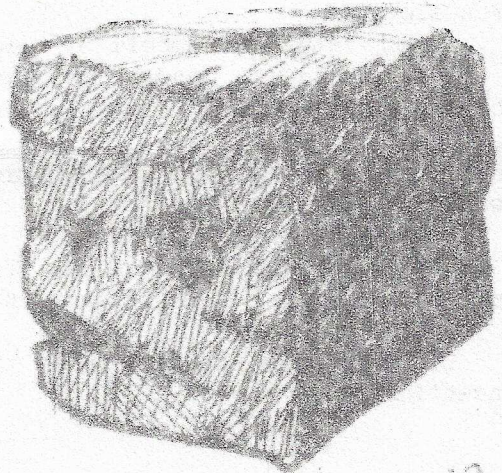

In addition there are numerous smaller suites each able to accommodate approx 80-200 into which we envisage locating the Fan Room, Dealers Rooms, Art Show and minority programme items.

There is also a 200 seat purpose-built cinema (16 mm/35 mm).

We have the potential for 48 [Ed. !!] bars, no that's not a misprint. Naturally our main bars will have real ale and live cider plus soft drinks, after all we only want the

best....

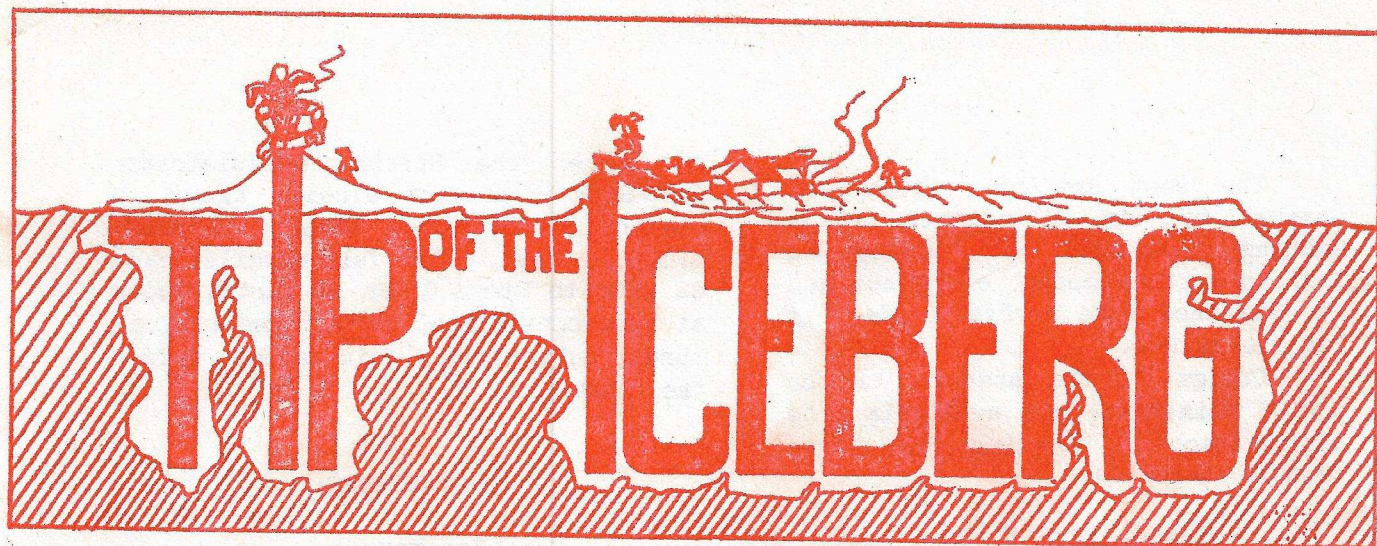

RICHARD THE RAMPANT: I get to play with lots of electronics and watch lots of mindless violent movies. And the kudos.

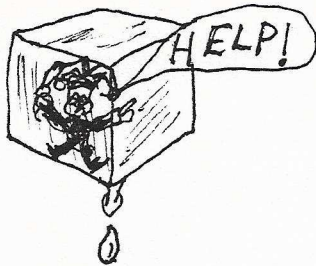
