As well as the main hall, Owen's Park has enough smaller rooms to take the B.S.F.A. the B.F.S. the bookrooms, the art-show, and the poetry soirce - and anything else not requiring the capacity of the main hall. War games or chess championships for instance.

If you wish to eat outside Owen's Park there are many restaurants of various types and prices to satisfy all tastes within easy reach of the convention site. Should anyone wish to book into a listed hotel instead of Owen's Park these too are within the Owen's Park district.


Almost inevitably then, Owen's Park, a departure from the acknowledged routine will produce feelings of unease in traditionalists.

Car Parking

There are open parking facilities for up to 350 cars. A taxi and car hire service is also available.

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

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
