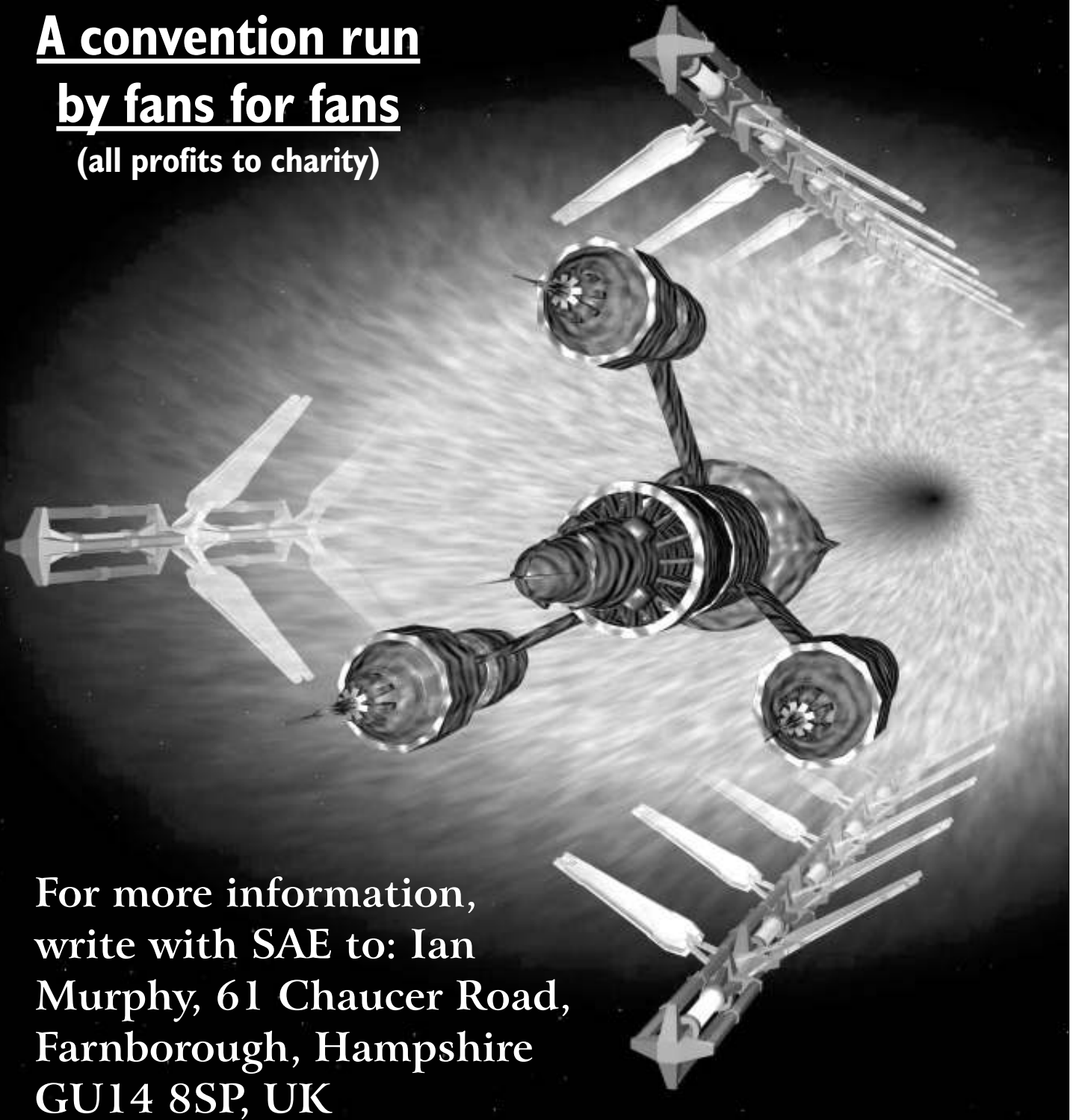

Volunteering

Like any other Eastercon, Olympus is going to need your help. Although we promise to work the committee to the brink of exhaustion and mental collapse, even they can't do everything - which is where you come in.

Odyssey needs volunteers in a lot of different areas, in order to help the convention run smoothly. Helping out is a great way to meet new people, learn new things, and have a great deal of fun while you're at it.

Volunteers also earn our convention currency, "groats", as a token to thank them for their work. Groats will not work outside the convention but can be exchanged at-con for food/ beer at selected bars; are accepted by many of the dealers in exchange for shiny lovely things; and can also be traded for our exclusive convention volunteer t-shirt.

WHO WE NEED

We need people in the following areas:

Art show: organising the boardings, getting all the exhibition pieces signed up and mounted, bag-check and bid notifications, the auction that follows, and so on.

Gophers: General at-con runners, getting information and bits'n'pieces from A to B, whether it's a replacement microphone, a glass of water, or committee member. Our Gopher team will also be carrying out Steward duties, making sure that only convention members are in the convention areas, keeping food and drink out of the art show, etc.

Green room: The Green Room is mainly a place for programme participants to gather before their item starts, so Green Room staff would typically be trying to ensure that the right people for the next set of programme items are there, getting them a drink each as thanks for being on the programme, and encouraging them to go to their item in good time.

Newsletter: the at-con publication that carries news articles and reviews on convention happenings, programme changes, restaurant recommendations and scurrilous rumour and outrageous libel (as long as it's funny...) We need editors to feverishly pound away at collecting the reports and getting each

issue out. We also need photographers, who will be directed by the newsletter editors to take photographs of key events during the convention.

Ops: "Communications central." Ensuring that the programme is running according to schedule, getting programme changes out to the members, finding missing panellists, etc.

Registration: Making sure that everyone who turns up gets their badge, README and related stuff in an orderly fashion, signing up the walk-in membership, and so on.

Tech: Lights, sound, and possibly action, too. The tech crew are responsible for the microphones, mixing desks, cabling, projectors, and so on that are used during the main hall events such as the opening and closing ceremonies and the masquerade. They also supply tech facilities as required to the other programme rooms.

HOW TO VOLUNTEER

First - join the convention! You can't help us out unless you're a member.

Once you've joined, if you've got on-line access, you should be able to access your membership details via a web browser. When you go to the form for editing details, you'll find a "Volunteer!" section part-way down the form. Just check the boxes where you'd like to help. Note that if there are several people on the booking, all sharing the same address, there'll be a separate set of checkboxes for each person. Please use the "Other Notes" section to provide specific details as necessary.

Once you've selected the appropriate boxes, go to the bottom of the form, and click on "Modify Details". We'll get in touch with you.

The term “Renaissance Man” is probably over-used, but within our little community Paul Cornell is a man of many talents. He is, as far as I’m aware, the only person to have been nominated for a Hugo for scriptwriting (*Doctor Who*), for comics writing (*Captain Britain*) and in a written fiction category (the novelette, “One of Our Bastards is Missing”). That’s not the end of his skills either. He’s a prolific and popular blogger and tweeter, and he’s always willing to attend a convention and meet fans. Sometimes it

seems like he is everywhere. Perhaps he is. You never know what people get up to after they have played with a TARDIS.

Paul’s TV career is currently mostly on hold, but his comics career is blooming. DC has signed him up to an exclusive contract, showing how much they value his talent and reliability. He is having a very successful run on the venerable *Action Comics*, focusing mainly stories about Superman’s arch foe, Lex Luthor. And in *Knight and Squire*, a Batman spin-off, he may have succeeded in creating a comic that plays to the American desire for cute Britishness yet still has plenty in it for the British reader. If nothing else he and artist Jimmy Broxton deserve a place in the Guinness Book of Records for creating over 100 new British superheroes and villains in a six-issue mini-series.

The fact that the first issue of Cornell’s *Knight and Squire* opens with our heroes attending a pub meet with their fellow costumed friends and enemies is bound to raise a smile amongst UK fandom.

Paul's novel writing career is due to pick up in 2012. He had a couple of books out before he hit the big time with *Doctor Who*, but novels are a time-consuming business and he has only done short stories for many years. The new novel, apparently an urban fantasy crime novel, is due out from Tor some time in the next 12 months.

As with any modern writer who makes good use of social media, Paul's life is fairly public. We all know that he is a huge cricket fan. We are also following along with interest as his wife, Caroline, completes her training to become a vicar. That Paul is accepted and respected for his Christian beliefs in a community that so often derides religion is a sure sign of his exceptional nature. 🍀

Margaret Austin and Martin Easterbrook

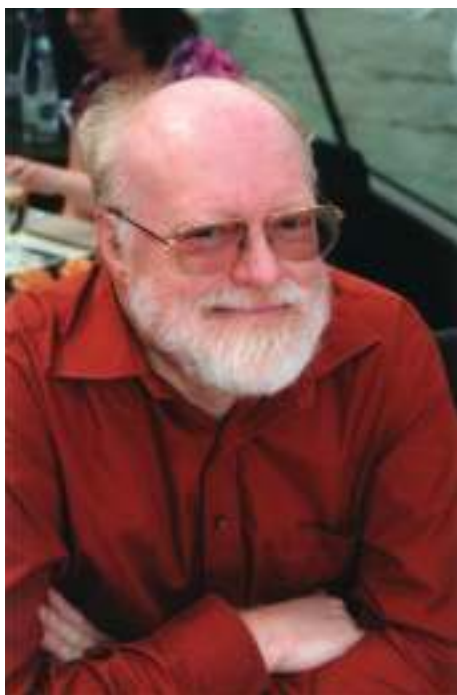

Odyssey's Fan Guests of Honour Margaret Austin and Martin Easterbrook have truly earned the honour as they have participated in almost every aspect of SF fandom: editing fanzines; organising SF conventions; writing fan-fiction; running SF societies; and their SF interests are equally diverse, spanning literature, film and tv, graphic stories, games and more. Much of the current UK fannish landscape has been influenced by them.

I recall meeting them both during the 1980's at various conventions. At that stage they had already been active for a decade and were 'big name fans' to me. In the decades that followed I've worked closely with both, most notably on the 1995 Worldcon in Glasgow which Martin co-chaired with me and where Margaret was my Deputy and director of administration. We are now working together on the 2011 SMOFcon in Amsterdam, for which they are running programme.

Given their interests, I thought it would be fun to focus on their 'origin story':

Martin's first organised fannish activities were in the 1970's as co-founder of the SF societies at Royal Holloway College and at the University of London. He then became editor of the UK news Fanzine 'Small Mammal' and began attending and organising SF conventions.

Margaret's first contact with fandom was in 1974 when she attended Britain's first Trek con in Leicester where she became a steward in order to get a room as the hotel was full.

Margaret relates: "Rather curiously Martin was a gatecrasher at this con although we never met at the time. He and his friend were evicted when found sleeping in the art show. As a steward I was warned to watch out for him! The story only came to light at a dinner party we attended together many years later. "

In the same year Margaret chaired her first con, a Star Trek Con in a village hall in Richmond with an attendance of around 100. She also wrote Trek fanfic for the hugely popular UK zines Alnitah and Grope, (ask her about the other fanfic she has written). Rog Peyton and then colleague Gerry Webb encouraged her to attend Novacon which she did with a group of (female) Trek fans. This was the beginning of the end as far as male domination of UK SF cons was concerned!

Both were now regularly attending UK and international cons, and they finally met 'officially' at the 1978 Eastercon, Skycon, at a Heathrow Hotel, where Martin dropped his wallet and Margaret picked it up and gave it back to him.

Since then both have become mainstays of UK fandom, and they continue to contribute time, energy and ideas, and most importantly encouragement to others to participate. 🌌



It is your programme, help us run it

STEVE ROGERSON

The programme for Olympus will have a strong emphasis on interactivity. This means that the panels will try to bring the audience into the discussion rather than everyone just listening to those on the top table. There will be workshops for fans to pass on their skills to others. There will be games, not just tucked away in a games room somewhere but as an integral part of the programme. There will be quizzes and competitions, some of which will run all weekend.

The programme will include evening entertainment such as a masquerade, a fan-run cabaret, a play, a disco, a ceilidh and more. Panels, games and workshops too will run late for those still wanting to be involved. And there will be filking.

The programme will be multi-stream for nearly the whole convention. As well as one or two literature streams, there will be separate streams for TV, science, films and other media. Even some of the video stream will be interactive with introductions and discussions about what is being shown.

There will be two fan streams – one for literature fans and one for media fans.

To achieve all this means having more programme items over the four days than the average Eastercon, and as such that means we will want far more of the membership of the convention taking an active part in the programme, whether on panels, running workshops, organising games and so on.

While we already have people in place now to run most of the streams, what is needed are volunteers, and we need a lot of them. So, if you fancy being on a panel, have a skill you'd like to share in a workshop, can give an interesting talk, would like to run an RPG or other game, then please let us know.
