Welcome to the real Season'03 programme and vital information book. We've tried to include all the details that we think you'll require to have a really great convention but inevitably we'll have missed something out that is vital. Please be patient: there will be somebody around to help you.

GENERAL INFORMATION

ART SHOW AND OPENING TIMES

The Art Show is located in Conference Rooms 15 and 18. The opening hours are 10am - 6pm Friday and Saturday. On Sunday it will close in good time for the Art Auction.

Remember: no drinks, food or smoking are allowed in the Art Show. Bags must be left at the door.

AUCTIONS

For the times of Auctions - see the convention schedule in the centre of this book. Please take any items you have for the Auctions to the Ops room.

AWARDS

There are two awards regularly made at Eastercon which the membership decides. The first of these are the BSFA Awards and the second The Doc Weir Award – given to a deserving fan who has otherwise gone unacknowledged. Ballot forms and ballot boxes will be available at registration.

BADGES

When you arrived at the convention and register you were given a membership pack including a name badge. Please wear this at all times or you will be challenged to ensure that you are a member of the convention.

Lost your badge? Don't worry, for £1 you can have another but you must prove your identity to the registration desk before we will issue duplicate badges – so bring some alternate ID along.

CHILD CARE

We have made arrangements for childcare. If you wish to make use of this service, please ask at the Ops Room.

CONVENTION DESKS

Convention desks are located in the dealers room. If you are running a future convention and would like a desk at which to promote it, please ask at Ops for a desk.

DCM

There will be a Duty Convention Manager available at all times. They can be identified by the worried look on their face, furrowed brow, a distinctive waist coat and a DCM badge. The DCM is in control of the convention and is there to act as a trouble shooter. Remember our motto "We're here to make a drama out of a crisis".

DEALERS ROOM AND OPENING TIMES

This is where you'll find all the sales desks for books, comics, collectibles, jewellery and all the usual (and unusual) things you find at SF conventions.

The opening times are:

14:00-18:00 Friday

10:00-18:00 Saturday and Sunday

10:00-14:00 Monday

The room is not closing for GoH items or similar. Dealers will have set up access from about mid afternoon on Thursday until they've had enough and from about 9:00 am on Friday.

Remember: no drinks, food or smoking in the Dealers Room (unless, of course, you are a Dealer). Bags must be left at the door.

DISABLED ACCESS

Anybody with mobility difficulties should ask at the registration desk, if they require assistance. The only programme area which is awkward to access is the Lakeside. Wheel chair users can get into this room via an external ramp – gophers will be provided to assist.

HALL COSTUME PRIZE

In addition to the formal masquerade competition on Sunday night we have decided to award prizes for the best hall costumes. All convention attendees will have the opportunity to vote for these awards.

In your convention pack, you should find three Hall Costume Tokens. Keep these handy throughout the convention. When you see someone wearing a costume you consider worthy of a prize then hand one of your tokens to that person.

Those collecting tokens should keep them safe and ensure they are handed in to Ops for counting together with the name of the costume wearer and a brief description of the costume (eg Jedi Knight, Slave Girl, Robot) by 12 noon on Monday.

The results will be announced during the Closing Ceremony. If you expect to have already left the convention by then you may nominate a representative to collect your prize. Please provide the name of your nominee when you hand in your tokens for counting.

N.B. A separate prize will be awarded at the committee's discretion to the best Buffyverse related costume spotted in the Bronze on Friday night.

INFORMATION BOARDS

These are in the Rotunda and we suggest you check them regularly. There are three types:

1. THE OFFICIAL NOTICE BOARD

Breaking with something of a tradition we are not planning to do a daily newsletter. Instead programme updates and important notices will be put up on the Official Notice Board. Please do not confuse this with the Members' Message Board. The Official Notice Board is for Convention Business only and any unauthorised notices will be removed.

2. MEMBERS' MESSAGE BOARD

There is a Message Board in the Rotunda for members' use. Any member of the convention is free to post anything here which they consider might be of interest to fellow fans (e.g. local restaurant recommendations, lifts offered/wanted). However, the committee reserve the right to remove anything that they consider offensive or inappropriate.

3. VOODOO BOARD

Here are some rules for its use:

1. On first arrival at the con, find your name on the board and put a tick next to it. (Americans should check the box!) This lets your friends know that you have arrived.
2. When you want to leave a message for someone, insert one of the pins provided in the space on the board next to that person's name. Write your message on one of the cards provided – include the intended recipient's name in capital letters at the top of the card – and place the card in the card index box provided, filing it alphabetically according to the recipient's surname.
3. When you see a pin next to your own name on the board it means a message is waiting for you. Remove the message from the box and keep it. Remove the pin and return it to the area of the board beneath the membership list. Please don't put the pins in the card index box.

LOST PROPERTY

If you find anything lost, please either hand it into the hotel or Ops Room.

Conversely, if you've lost anything these are the places to ask.

MASQUERADE

Entries for the Masquerade should be notified to Alice Lawson. Please contact Chaos Costuming for further details. (See Hall Costume Prize)

MOBILE PHONES IN THE PROGRAMME

This is simple - turn them off !! Any fan disturbing the programme items because their mobile phone has going off will be given very dirty looks and fingers will be pointed. Please avoid this embarrassment and being an object of scorn by turning the phone off. Remember - you are on holiday - you do not need to receive calls!

PROBLEMS?

There is no such thing as a problem, only solutions waiting to be found. Bearing that thought in mind here are a few sources of solutions.

If you need anything to do with your hotel room, please ask at the hotel reception first. This is their job and they are there to help you.

If the scheduling of a programme item you are participating in causes you problems, please contact the Green Room manager as soon as possible.

If all else fails please go to the Ops Room.

SMOKING POLICY

No smoking in any public room except the Snooty Fox bar. Transgressors will be either used for target practice by Noel or given to Margaret. I know which one I'd opt for...

VOLUNTEERS

Helpers are always welcome at Eastercon - in fact without a substantial body of volunteers, the convention wouldn't function at all. So if you'd like to get in on the action, please check in at the Ops room. You will then be directed to appropriate section head.

WEAPONS POLICY

1. No real weapons under any circumstances.
2. Convincing fakes only allowed as part of costumes while the costumes are worn.
3. Toys turned a blind eye to, so long as the user is not being annoying.

Ops gets to decide what belongs in each category, and their arbitrary and unreasonable decisions will not be subject to appeal.

HOTEL INFORMATION

BARE FOOT IN THE CON

The hotel says no to bare feet - they don't want bloody carpets or bloody legal action.

CAR PARK

On arriving at the hotel, you will have taken a ticket from the barrier. This can then be validated by sticking it in the machine on the hotel reception. When you drive out put it in the slot in the barrier and it will let you out. There is a £1 per day fee for parking which will be added to your hotel bill.

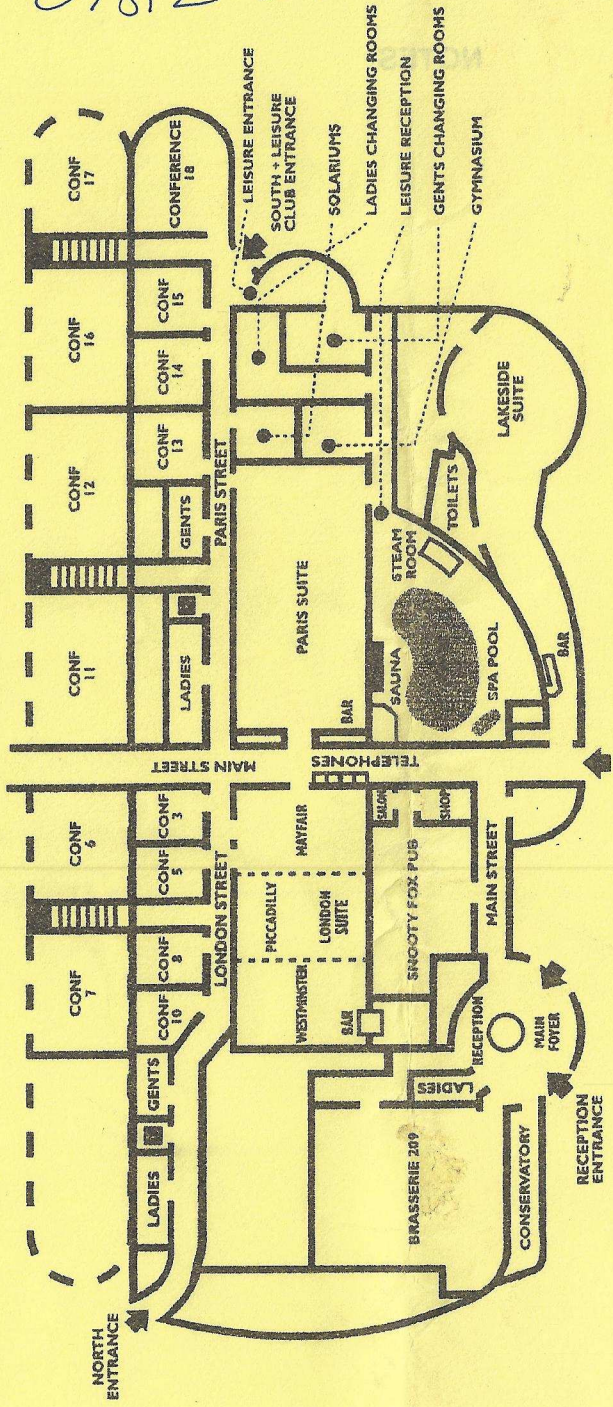
