The Yorcon Committee wishes to dedicate this convention to the memory of J. Michael Rosenblum, who died in Leeds on the 28th June 1978. Mike had been active in fandom for over forty years -- indeed, he was one of the prime organizers of the very first British SF convention, held in Leeds in 1937. During World War II, Mike's fanzine <u>Futurian War Digest</u> was at the very centre of British fan activity: from his home in Leeds, he virtually held fandom together during those difficult years.

During the 1950s Mike formed the Leeds SF Association and published the excellent fanzine, <u>New Futurian</u>. He became known as Britain's most assiduous collector of SF books and magazines: his library is undoubtedly the most magnificent private collection in the country.

Very sadly, Mike died just before his retirement from full-time work. He had been looking forward to re-dedicating his energies to SF book-collecting and to fandom. In particular, he had been looking forward to Yorcon, the first major SF convention to be held in his home city since 1937. A generous man, Mike will be sorely missed. He leaves a widow, Betty, a son, Howard, and a daughter and son-inlaw, Diane and Peter Barrow. We wish to offer them all our condolences and to welcome them very warmly to Yorcon.
