STRANGELOVE, THE WAR GAME, DARK STAR, SLAUGHTERHOUSE 5, PHASE IV, CHARLY), SF on video- and audio-tape, banquet and speeches, humour, bookroom, auction, comics, "Dungeons & Dragons", art exhibition, awards, etc.
