
Cheap cold food will be available most of the time.

- TEA & COFFEE These will be available at all times, either in the lounge or on order in the bar, at the same price.
- RESTAURANT Normal restaurant service will be available, opening hours are 12.00 noon to 2.30pm for lunch, re-opening at 7.00pm for dinner, last orders at 10.00pm, except for Sunday, when last orders are at 9.30pm. In addition, the cheap food will be available in the restaurant whilst it is open.
- BAR Whimsey's Bar will be open to residents from 10.00am to 4.00am the following morning, except for Sunday night, when it will close at 3.00am. Non-residents can use the bar until 2.00am each morning.
