Restaurant Guide by Tony Morton

While the Chamberlain Hotel offers a very reasonably priced menu in the Princess Helena Restaurant and wonderfully cheap food in Naylor's Bar, I'm sure there are several people who are intent on trying the "local" cuisine in the vicinity of the hotel. So I give you: Places to eat out at Novacon (relatively close to the Chamberlain Hotel).

While the Chamberlain is slightly out of the city centre, there are numerous places close by to eat out at. Heading back towards the centre you will come across the city's CHINESE quarter; here there are number of good restaurants:

As everyone who has frequented "Balti Town" has their own favourites, you are best advised to ask a local to recommend one to you. Miscellaneous Information

DIRE WARNINGS: Please remember that the Chamberlain Hotel is in the business of providing beds, food and drink with a view to making a profit. Therefore neither they, nor the Novacon 25 committee, will take too kindly to people staying in rooms without paying, or bringing food and/or drink into the Hotel. Corkage will be charged at the rate of the equivalent cost of the food or drink if purchased in the Hotel. The Hotel have been very fair in their dealings with Novacon 25 and the committee intend to be as fair in return. We will back the Hotel in any dispute with people caught "crashing" on, or smuggling food or drink into, the premises.

CAR PARKING: As we mentioned in Progress Report #3, when you arrived you should have parked your vehicle in the hotel's car park. After which you should have been given a pink slip of paper which you exchanged at the Hotel Reception for a token.

This token will allow free access to the car park over the whole weekend. (Please note the token must be handed in when you check out.) Charges are £2.00 per car per day or £3.50 per van per day - very reasonable rates.

BOOZE: The Hotel is, unfortunately, unable to serve "Real Ale" but they have arranged for Kilkenny to be available in Naylor's Bar and have laid in extra supplies of Guinness for the weekend. (The mini-bar in the Highbury will be serving a more limited selection of drinks, namely lager, bitter and spirits.)

ERRATUM: Re. the advertisement for BEYOND magazine in the Programme Book; the contact address for BEYOND is - Parallel Universe Publications, 130 Union Road, Oswaldtwistle, Lancashire, BB5 3DR.

DISABLED ACCESS: This is via the ramp at the side door of the Hotel; which is situated on the right hand side of the building as you face the main entrance.

NO SMOKING: The Princess Helena Restaurant, the Highbury Suite, the Dealers' Room (Moseley/Westminster), Art Show (Alcester) and the left hand side of the Main Programme Room (Rowton, this being the side you enter from the main corridor) are all no smoking areas. Your cooperation would be greatly appreciated. (NB: The restriction on smoking in the Dealers' Room applies to customers not dealers.)

ART SHOW: Is in the Alcester Suite and will be open 10am-6pm on Saturday and 10am-11am on Sunday.

DEALERS' ROOM: Situated in the Moseley and Westminster (interconnecting) Suites. Open from 10am-6pm on both Saturday and Sunday (although closed for the Guests' speeches on both days). It may be open on Friday afternoon/evening - at the discretion of the dealers (as indeed are the above times).

HOTEL SHOP: This will be open from 7am until 8.45pm each day (later if demand appears to justify it).

NOVACON REGISTRATIONS: The registration table, which will be taking late registrations for Novacon 25 as well as selling memberships for Novacon 26 next year, will be open at the following times: Friday 4pm-8pm, Saturday 10am-6pm, Sunday 10am-approx. 5pm. The only exceptions to this will be during the guests' speeches when the table will be closed. (Membership of Novacon 26 costs just £23.00 at Novacon 25, rising to £25.00 after.)




