





Friday: 2pm-7.30pm and 8.30pm-10pm N27 Registrations ONLY. 10am-3pm and 4.30pm-8pm Saturday: All Novacon/BSFG business Sunday: 11am-4pm and 5.30pm-7pm All Novacon/BSFG business From Saturday morning onwards the table will be: selling a variety of Novacon merchandise and publications from previous Novacons; selling tickets for Sausages at the Sausage and Oompah Evening (£2.50 per person); selling memberships to Novacon 28 (just £25.00 at Novacon 27, rising to £28.00 after the con); raffle tickets in aid of the RNIB's Books for the Blind Project: taking money for the Birmingham SF Group's Beer & Skittles evening.

Gophers: If you *have* volunteered to be a gopher or if you *wish* to volunteer please report to CHRIS MURPHY in the Ops Room (this is the Cloakroom. behind/beyond the bar in the Elgar Suite). If you have volunteered or wish to volunteer to help in the Book Room please report to NIGEL FURLONG in the Shaw (if you are facing the reception desk turn left and head down the corridor to the end).

As we went to press we were still looking for willing gophers to: keep the space between the Elgar's programme area and the adjacent bar clear, to reduce noise and congestion. (This doesn't mean having to act like Judge Dredd, just being polite and persistent.)

The Bar: Both the main bar in the Abbey and the bar in the Elgar will be serving real ale in the form of Sarah Hughes Pale Amber Ale (4% ABV) - as this has been ordered by Novacon and sales guaranteed by the con we would appreciate you drinking it all - it is also the cheapest beer at £1.80 per pint! Other beers on offer are Tetleys keg at £2.00 per pint and Stella

Artois at £2.20 a pint. Coffee is available over the bar for 80p per cup.

Raffle: If you wish to purchase tickets for the annual raffle in aid of RNIB's Books for the Blind Project, they will be on sale around the con and from the Novacon Registration table - Saturday onwards. In a change from established tradition, prizes will *not* be given out as the draw is made at the Award Ceremony. Instead prizes will be available for collection from a table set up near the Elgar bar *after* the ceremony.

Cashpoints:Leave the Abbey Hotel through the main doors to the road, turn right, through the Gatehouse arch, continue straight on to the junction, passing the Post Office, cross the road and continue straight on for Link machines, turn right and head down the hill for most other banks.

No Smoking: We would appreciate it if you refrained from smoking in designated "No Smoking" areas such as: the Shaw/Book Room (apart from dealers), the Worcester/Art Show, the Warwick Lounge, the Lounge Area facing the Hotel Reception Desk and the right hand side of the Programme section of the Elgar (that being the right as you face the stage, the side nearest the windows to the car park).
