You may be wondering why, if you're going to Intersection, you should want to go to another convention the weekend before. After all, won't the Worldcon have everything you want? Amongst the multistream, split-site phantasmagoria, just how much time will you get to sit and talk - to really get to know people? Imagine: you have just found a fan whose fanzine writing you have admired for years but have never met before, but as soon as you get the pleasantries over with one of you has to go off to a panel, or the other really must get into the art show before it closes, and how often have you met up with someone at a Worldcon then never been able to find them again in the vast throng?

What you need is space and time to get to know people, to be able to charm that article out of them for your next fanzine, preferably before the convention. Much better to have one big party, with everyone together, plenty of beer and good food and a place to crash when the fun gets too much. Sounds like a convention to me.

Room Rates: Twin/double £20.50 per person per night
