Our Guests

Guest of Honour: Juliet E McKenna

Juliet is a fantasy author living in Oxfordshire. She originally studied Greek and Roman history and literature and this is reflected in the realism that she brings to her work: her readers don't just have a sense of being in a fantasy world, but a *real*/fantasy world. She currently has 14 novels in four series in print, and the final draft of her fifteenth book is with her publisher. Juliet regularly teaches classes in writing and is part of The Write Fantastic. Juliet is also chair of the 64th Eastercon, Eightsquared, and so is a bone fide Big Name Fan – all whilst raising a family. She is also an accomplished martial artist.

Guest of Honour: John Meaney

John's first book *To Hold Infinity* was given to attendees at Concussion (Eastercon 2006) and was one of The Daily Telegraph's Books of the Year. Now he has ten books in print covering four series. John writes SF, fantasy, and near future thrillers. He too is a martial arts expert (we could be the first Eastercon to have author guest seniority decided by *jiyu kumite*). Originally studying physics and computer science at the OU, he used to be an IT professional, trainer, and occasional hypnotist. Now he writes full-time. And despite what Carolyn has been saying for six years, the actor who plays Chief O'Brian is *not* his brother.

Guest of Honour: Jim Burns

Jim Burns has been a professional SF artist since 1972 when he was paid for his first commission. Since then he has won a Hugo three times and a BSFA award 12 times. His work is instantly recognisable, as we've all grown up with it. As a nice tie-in, he has illustrated several of John Meaney's book covers (several of which are on display in the gallery he kindly supplied for the Satellite 4 website), and gave us the iconic Spaceport Glasgow image for Interaction's souvenir book. Jim is an almost-permanent fixture at Eastercons, but has never been a GoH – until now.

Fan Guests of Honour: Alice and Steve Lawson

Alice and Steve should probably have been Fan GoHs long before now. Both have won the Doc Weir Award (Steve in 2006 and Alice in 2010). They were both on the committee of LX, Paragons I & II, Illumination and Intuition. Alice is now the co-chair of Loncon 3, the 72nd Worldcon (having been deputy

chair of the bid committee), and Steve is running membership. Steve is the inventor of the double sided membership badge and Alice is well-known as the only one who can keep Steve in line.

Special Guest: Terry Pratchett

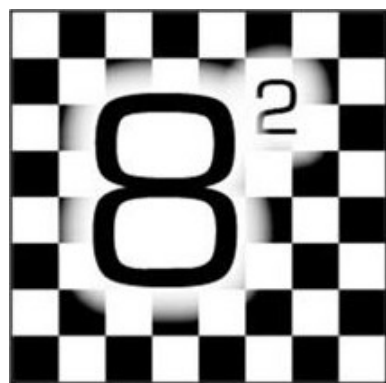
Does this man really require an introduction? He has been publishing books since 1971 and has written 39 best selling *Discworld* books. Some of Sir Terry's many awards include a knighthood, an OBE, the Carnegie medal, eight honorary doctorates, the 2012 Bollinger Everyman Wodehouse award for comic fiction, and the World Fantasy award for lifetime achievement. He has been accused of literature, but continues to write fantasy despite that. His works parody real-world subjects such as opera, movie-making, banking, the postal service and are often filled with fantasy and SF in-jokes. His books have been adapted for radio, television, theatre, games and music. We would love to hear a rendition of "A Wizard's Staff has a Knob on the End" at Satellite 4.

Guests Emeritus: Ken MacLeod, Iain M Banks, Charles Stross

Satellite 4 would never have happened if the committee hadn't had the opportunity to cut their teeth on Satellites 1, 2, and 3. In recognition of our previous GoHs' help in getting the series off the launch pad, the Satellite conventions have awarded them the title of Guests Emeritus, which grants them life membership of all future Satellite conventions. We are hoping that all three will be able to make a showing at Satellite 4.

Introducing the Spaceship of Honour

It's a tradition of Satellite conventions to have an official mascot, and we'd like to introduce Voyager 1 as Satellite 4's. The JPL-built probe visited Jupiter and Saturn on the official part of its mission, sending back the first high-quality pictures of the gas giants and their attendant moons. This plucky little spaceship went far beyond its expected limits, and has recently celebrated its 35th year of operation. It is well on its way to being the first human artefact to leave our solar system entirely, taking its famous golden record who knows where, and is predicted to be good for another ten years of operation at least. They really don't build them like this any more, and in honour of its achievements and its creators', we've decided to dub it our Spaceship of Honour.

Convention Hotel – the Crowne Plaza

The Crowne Plaza has two fully accessible rooms and some rooms suitable for families — sleeping two adults and 1 or 2 children. Children (aged up to 15) will stay free in their parents room; however, if they are aged 12 – 15 years, they will have to pay for breakfast if taken.

Overflow Accommodation

We have arranged overflow accommodation at the Campanile hotel, the Hilton Garden Inn, and the Marriott Hotel.



Campanile

The Campanile is situated across the car park from the Crowne Plaza. They have their own car parking. They have five fully accessible rooms and two family rooms. Children up to 15 years stay free and are entitled to free breakfast (those 16 and above are classed as adults).

Hilton Garden Inn

Glasgow can easily be reached by road, (budget) airline from most major UK and European airports, and by rail. The convention hotel is less than 0.5 mile from Junction 19 of the M8, about 8 miles from Glasgow Airport, and a short train ride from Glasgow Central Station.

Programme

Satellite 4 will combine many of the features people have enjoyed about previous Satellite conventions – notably the strong science theme and the emphasis on fun – with the scope and variety of a typical Eastercon programme. We shall have talks across the breadth of science fiction, fantasy and science; and panel discussions covering literature, TV and films, (space) science, and matters of broader interest to the community, from publishing to the future of fandom itself. There will be readings, games, quizzes, tasting sessions, and workshops where you can try your hand at new activities.

A highlight of the convention will be items featuring our fantastic Guests of Honour and Special Guest. The programme will also feature a number of Day Guests – experts who will give interesting lectures on specialist subjects. We want to run some relatively novel programme items, and re-run some old Satellite favourites, but will be delighted to host regular Eastercon traditions.

Satellite 4 will have an Art Show with Auction, a Dealers' Room and a Real Ale Bar. We are currently in talks with the Kelburn Brewery, who supplied the beer for Satellite 3, and aim to negotiate special convention prices, on both food and drink, with the Crowne Plaza.

The Opening Ceremony will take place on Friday afternoon. We also hope to have a special event on Friday evening to mark the opening of the Art Show – more details to follow in future PRs! Of course no Glasgow Eastercon would be complete without a ceilidh, and a dramatic performance (hopefully with songs) by Glasgow's own Ian Sorensen. There will also be a themed disco, though we've not quite got round to choosing the theme yet, so feel free to contribute suggestions via our Facebook or Twitter pages. The formal closing ceremony will be on Monday afternoon, with Satellite's traditional Dead Laika Party in the evening (named of course in honour of the first dog in space).

The Ambassadors' Ball

There will no formal masquerade at Satellite 4. Instead we plan to hold a costume ball, similar to the very successful event at Illustrious. Our theme – shamelessly stolen adapted from our sister Glasgow convention Confounding Tales – will be "The Ambassadors' Ball". Delegations and dignitaries from all races, cultures, planets and universes (real or fictional) are cordially invited to attend this event of truly intergalactic importance.

Costumers will have the opportunity to be announced on arrival and to have their work judged by an expert panel. Short "dramatic presentations" can be organised by prior arrangement. We encourage you all to dress up, even if

you don't want your costume assessed. However, if you can't think of a costume, or aren't into that sort of thing, you are equally welcome to come-as-you-are and simply enjoy the spectacle.

(In keeping with the pacific nature of the event, a strict weapons policy will be enforced. Attendees will be allowed to bear side-arms, as long as they are peace-bonded; larger weapons may be displayed with honour at the bearer's presentation to the Ball, but must be secured before dancing recommences.)

A Neo-friendly Con

Satellite 4 will hold some special events aimed at easing the transition into fandom in general, and Eastercon in particular, for new members (our honourable Neo's). As well as having a first-timers event on Friday, we have appointed Gaspode and Gaspodia as our official Neo-Mum and Neo-Dad. They will be available for a period each morning to answer questions and help new fans plan their time so as to get the most from the convention. We are also looking for a few experienced fans to wear a special 'Neo-friendly' badge indicating they are willing to offer advice, or just chat, to first-timers on an ad hoc basis throughout the Con.
