### UNICON LIVES!

The UNICON tradition is alive and well with the WINCON bid. Conceived at Consept in 1986, WINCON will continue the UNICON line into 1988.

### MHY?

We want to give you a convention you'll remember for a long time — and at a price you can easily afford. At the heart of WINCON will be a strong, sercon programme focused on SF as literature. To make this successful, we are working on a plan to attract more than one Guest of Honour within the limits of a small convention budget. In addition, we aim to have an alternative programme and all the usual UNICON fare, such as the food tasting, quiz and masquerade.

### WHERE?

King Alfred's is a teacher-training college set in beautiful wooded grounds 10 minutes' walk from Winchester city centre. It has an attractive mixture of old (c. 1862) and purpose-built modern buildings. Two of the more important from our point of view are the large Union bar and a 280-seater theatre with professional lighting and film equipment. Good single-study bedroom accommodation is provided in 4 halls on site. In line with our value-for-money policy, we expect room rates to be under 10 pounds.

Winchester is a small, pleasant city so steeped in history that William the Conqueror's curfew still sounds at 8.00pm daily. Its sights include the magnificent cathedral, King Alfred's statue (featured on our cover) and the mysterious Round table in Winchester Great Hall.

Modern transport however makes Winchester highly accessible. The M3 runs close by, there's a direct line to Waterloo and less than one hour away by rail is Reading, a major junction with direct trains to almost every corner of the country. Winchester is also less than half an hour from Southampton's Eastleigh airport.
