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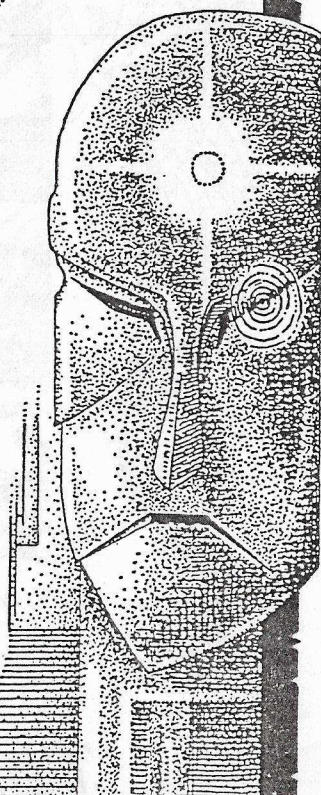

## Editorial

For those of you who were particularly interested in seeing and meeting Gene we offer our sincere apologies, but hope you appreciate that events are completely out of our hands.

## Brian Stableford

"The Science Fiction Book of Lists" tells us that Brian Stableford had published more than a million words before the age of 30. This remarkable achievement leads us to suspect that there might be more than one of him . . .

The first is the author of intelligent adventure stories teeming with xenobiological ideas like "The Hooded Swan" series, "The Daedalus" series and "The Asgard" trilogy. The second is the writer of intellectual "Scientific Romances" that adroitly blend genres, philosophical and scientific ideas: "The Empire Of Fear" and "The Werewolves Of London". The third is the short story writer whose "sardonic stories of the genetic revolution" (now collected in hardback by Simon & Schuster) have been favourites with *Interzone* readers over the last few years.

But that's not all. There is a fourth, Dr. Brian Stableford, who for many years was a lecturer in sociology and produced a stream of erudite articles for *Foundation* on the history of science fiction. The same person may be number five, contributing editor to "The Science in Science Fiction", co-author of "The Third Millenium" and contributor to "The Encyclopedia of Science Fiction", and also a sixth, Dr. Stableford who teaches SF writing at the University of Reading, runs a class at the City Lit, and wrote "The Way to Write Science Fiction". Well perhaps . . . But who is this seventh "Brian Craig" who writes "Warhammer" novels such as "Plague Demon" and "Zaragoz" and claims to be a pseudonym for "Brian Stableford"?

One at least of these seven is Guest of Honour at WINCON - see if you can find out which.

## Writers Workshop by Gwyneth Jones

The first writers workshop that I ever attended was in a suburban living room, somewhere in Brighton. I'd persuaded a women's magazine to commission me to write about aspiring writers, and I was gathering material. It was pretty brutal stuff. The guru told them what certain magazines would buy, and the disciples scribbled it all down. The atmosphere was about as intimate as that in a dentist's waiting room. The first time I participated in a writers workshop was at an English Milford in

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1984. There was no guru, no businesslike copying down of tips. It was pandemonium on the shopfloor sometimes. And yet an amazing amount of work was being done. Ideas were sketched into shape, pulled apart, put together again. Being a part of that group - commenting on other peoples writing and taking in the comments of others - was like writing itself; orderly disorder, chaotic discipline.

I intend to bring a fixed agenda to the workshop at WINCON II - but no rule book. I expect to abandon my agenda at once, rediscover it maybe half a dozen times before Sunday. In the mean time, (to our surprise) we're going to find that we've done a lot of solid work.

If you wish to be a part of the writers workshop fill in the accompanying volunteer form and send to the address on the back page. Be sure to do this as soon as possible because places are limited and will be allocated on a first-come-first-served basis.

## *The Programme*

WINCON II has opted to go for three programme streams - 'Home', 'Light' and 'Third' - the latter being the Fan programme. Within the programme two themes will be evident. The first, Images Of The Future, examines the way in which SF has been seen to treat particular subjects through video clips, panels and discussions. The second, The Art Of Story Telling, investigates the structure of the narrative and discusses whether the medium really is the message.

On top of all that we have items building on the parts of WINCON I that seemed to go well, including; a reprise of the Mammoth Quiz; a further look at the business of books, dealing with publishing for the single market; a follow up to Paul Dormer's talk on SF Opera cover's Fantasy Opera; and a new writers workshop run this time by Gwyneth Jones.

If you want to take part in any of this, or have some good ideas we haven't thought of, why not drop us a line or catch us up and force us to listen by buying us drinks!

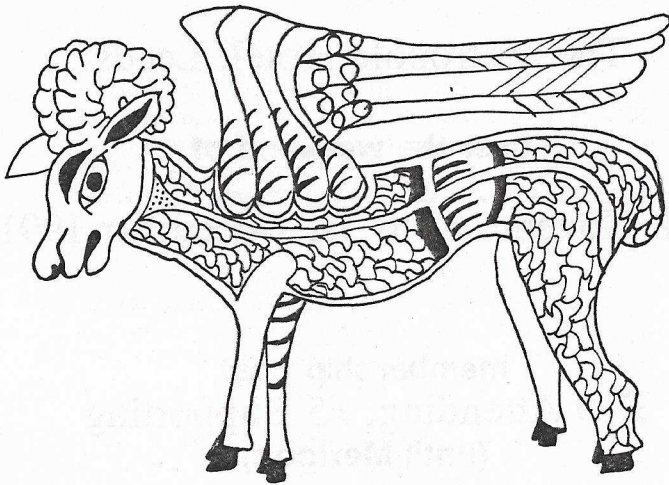
## *The Third Programme*
