Eating at Wincon

The College is providing Wincon III with breakfasts for resident attendees only (it caters only for meals at set times, preordered at least 10 days in advance), so for other meals we must rely on the resources of Winchester itself: since the city is one of England's foremost tourist attractions, these are not inconsiderable. There is no comprehensive guide to Winchester's eateries, nor can we hope to create one here, but we will highlight what we think the most relevant and proximal establishments for Wincon attendees.

Pubs

Winchester is plentifully endowed with public houses, most of which serve some food at some time in the day. Wincon can personally recommend the following as providing value-for-money food and acceptable to excellent beers etc. We suggest that if possible you check table availability in advance:

The Exchange - (Tel. 854718) Corner of Southgate and St Clements Streets. Open 10:00--23:00 (Mon--Sat), 12:00--15:00 and 19:00--22:00 (Sun); food served 12:00--22:00 (Mon--Sat), 12:00--14:30 and 19:00--22:00 (Sun). We recommend the kangaroo steaks and burgers!



The County Arms - (Tel. 851950) Corner of Romsey and Queens Roads (a little west of the Hospital). Open all day; quick snacks and main meals served 12:00--14:00 and 18:30--21:00. The Wincon Committee's principal rendezvous.

The Jolly Farmer - (Tel. 852665) Corner of Andover and Boscobel Roads (just north of railway bridge). Open all day; food served 12:00--14:30 and 19:00--21:00. Recently refurbished as a 'Hogshead' realale house.

The Roebuck - (Tel. 865412) Stockbridge Road opposite Langton Close. Open all day; food served 12:00--14:00 and 18:00--22:00 (Mon--Sat), 19:00--21:00 (Sun). Popular venue, with a pleasant conservatory.

Other nearby establishments include:

The Green Man - Corner of Southgate and St Swithuns Streets. Hot & Cold Bar Food. This is regarded as the College Student's pub.

The Railway Inn - St Paul's Hill. Prime live music venue; food unknown.

Take-Aways

The following are the most convenient, but see also under restaurants etc:

Lust Paradise - Indian (Tel. 877797). Corner St James Lane and Southgate Street (closest such to the College). Open 12:00--14:30 and 17:30--24:00, 7 days/week.

Golden House - Chinese (Tel 840626). Next door to Last Paradise. Open 18:00--24:00 (Fri--Sat), 18:00--23:00 (Sun).

The New York Pizza Co. - (Tel 840384) Upper High Street. (Free) deliveries 12:00--

15:00 (7 days) and 18:00--23:30 (Fri--Sat), 18:00--23:00 (Sun--Thu). This is also a restaurant, open 18:00--23:00 (7 days).

Pizza Hut - (Tel 841155) 7 High Street. Deliveries. Opening times not listed.

Pizza Express - (Tel 841845) 1 Bridge Street. Eat in or take away (no deliveries). Optional service charge for parties of seven or more. Opening times not listed.

Restaurants etc.

One of the densest concentrations of establishments is Jewry Street, 15 minutes' walk from the College. Proceeding from its southern end one successively passes: Mr So Chinese Restaurant; Green's Wine Bar; Hunter's Restaurant; Maxwell's Bar; The Cellar Peking; Pizzaland; The Elizabethan Bar & Restaurant (in Nicholas Wallar's House, 1509); The Theatre Royal Bar; Oliver's Fish & Chip Restaurant & Take-away; and The Curry & Tandoori Centre Restaurant & Take-away.

Just round the corner in City Road are the Pappagallo Italian Restaurant and Laura's Restaurant, while just along into Andover Road are The Albion pub (open all day, though no food served), Duncan's Wine & Cheese merchants, and the Sun House Chinese Take-away.

Further places of interest might be Richeaux Restaurant & Tea Rooms in Godbegot House in the High Street, next door to The Royal Oak which claims the oldest bar in England. The tea rooms on the top floor of Beales Department Store in the Brooks Centre have been recommended to us as good value.

Site Plan of King Alfred's College




E St Elizabeth's Hall
