Sue Dawe Underwood

ARTIST GUEST OF HONOR

Sue Dawe's first inspiration in art stemmed from the illustrations in the old Elson Readers that were read to her at an early age. Always interested in wildlife and animals, Sue began drawing her pets and other animals, especially horses. Deciding to be a veterinarian rather than an artist, she continued her education in large animal husbandry at Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo, graduating in 1977 with highest honors. While working for a veterinarian in San Diego, Sue began illustrating in her spare time, and after taking some art classes at a local junior college, happily launched into illustration as a full-time profession. In 1982 Sue left San Diego to attend classes at Art Center College of

a condo with her husband Michael, and their goofy Border Collie, Brandybuck.

Her interests include costume design, skiing, SCUBA diving, music and writing. She is a science fiction enthusiast, and describes herself as a "crazy *Star Wars* fan," frequently attending science fiction conventions and exhibiting her original work in the convention art shows.

Although Sue works on a variety of themes with different mediums, she is best known for her fantasy airbrush designs. Fantasy is her favorite subject to paint, and she likes to think of her work as a form of visual story-telling. Her illustrations can be seen on cards, posters, stationary, puzzles, porcelain, and back-to-school supplies.

S.P. Somtow

Somtow Papinian Sucharitkul (S.P. Somtow) was born in Bangkok, Thailand, and grew up in Europe. He was educated at Eton College and at Cambridge, where he obtained his B.A. and M.A., receiving honors in English and Music.

His first career was as a composer, and he has emerged as one of Southeast Asia's most outspoken and controversial musicians. His most recent compositions include a commissioned piece to open the Asian Composers Expo, and the orchestral "Star Maker — An Anthology of Universes" which recently premiered in Washington.

As a performer, he made his conducting debut at the age of 19 with the Holland Symphony Orchestra. He has conducted the Cambridge Symphony Orchestra, the Bangkok Chamber Orchestra, and the Florida Atlantic University Contemporary Music Ensemble. In 1977–78 he was the director of the Bangkok Opera Society.

In 1977 he began writing fiction. He won the John W. Campbell Award for best new writer in 1981. Two of his short stories were nominated for the Hugo Award, and his book *Starship & Haiku* received the Locus Award for best first novel. Somtow has now published 25 books, including the complex, galaxy-spanning "Inquestor" series and the satirical *Mallworld* and *The Aquiliad* as well as the serious, philosophical *Starship & Haiku* and *Fire from the Wine-dark Sea*, a short story collection.

His last science fiction title was the Locus bestseller *The Darkling Wind*, a

novel on an epic scale from Bantam Books. His works have been translated into German, French, Japanese, Italian, Polish, Czech, Serbo-Croatian, Romanian, and Thai.

S.P. Somtow's career as a novelist has expanded far beyond the boundaries of science fiction. He has written a children's book, *The Fallen Country*, which deals with domestic violence in a sensitive yet realistic way. His second young people's book, *Forgetting Places*, was honored by the "Books for Young Adults" program.

His horror novel, *Vampire Junction* (its sequel *Valentine* is now out), was praised by Ed Bryant as "the most important horror novel of 1984," and the New York Daily News said it was "...sure to become a cult classic." His second horror novel, *Moon Dance*, has been hailed as a landmark in the field and was nominated for the American Horror Award. Somtow spent six years researching the novel, himself traversing every inch of his characters' odyssey from Vienna, Austria to California, and studying Native American languages.

FEATURED LOCAL ARTIST

Katrine Cady was born in upstate New York and moved to Arizona with her parents at age nine. She received her Medical Technician degree in Norman, Oklahoma and is a Medical Technician in mundane life. Her big brother Chuck points out that she's single.

A long time fan, Katrine has always been an enthusiastic Trekker. She has been drawing a recurring worm character since birth, but most of her creations now consist of dragons and other fantasy-oriented mystical beasts. Katrine created special illustrations for a children's book on hematology. She now resides in Glendale, Arizona.



S.P. Somtow continued

The horror film that S.P. Somtow wrote and directed, *The Laughing Dead*, has been called "a horror film for the 90's" by *Cinéfantastique* and "one of the best independent productions for a long while" by Michael Weldon of the *Psychotronic Review*.

His second mainstream novel, *The Shattered Horse*, was called "...a work of genius" by noted author Gene Wolfe. His recent *Jasmine Nights*, a semi-autobiographical novel was serialized in the *Bangkok Post* in Thailand and *Pulphouse* — *A Fiction Magazine* in the U.S. While the author steadfastly denies that it is a *roman à clef*, *Jasmine Nights* has stirred considerable controversy in its satiric portrayal of the lifestyles of Thai high society in the 1960s.

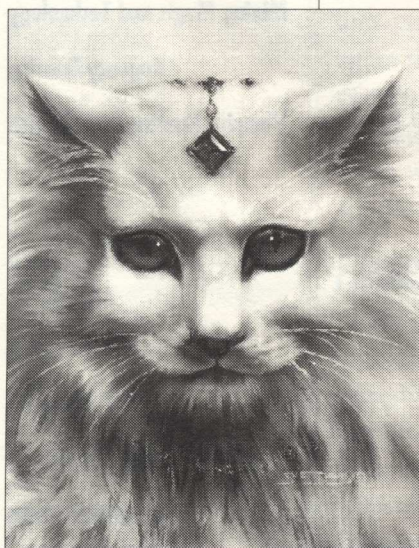

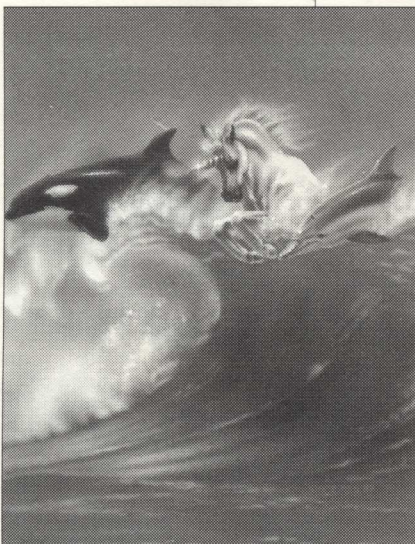

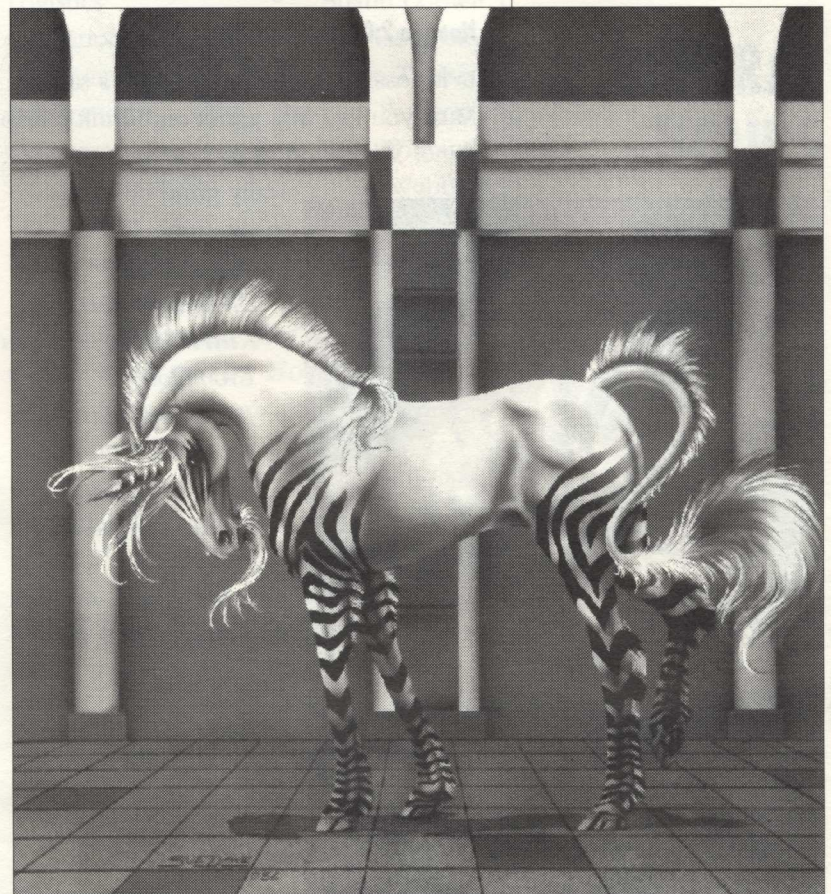
