Art show panels (a panel is 4 ft. X 4 ft. flat brown pegboard) my be reserved for a fee of \$5.00 per panel. 3D artwork can be displayed on a limited number of 6 ft. X 2.5 ft. tables, with a fee of \$5.00 for 1/2

table. The convention will take a 12% commission on these sales. We will feature a print shop - an area for artists to sell multiple prints of some of their more popular work, with the convention taking 15% commission on these sales. There is no fee to display in the print shop.

GETTING THERE


Okay, most of you can probably do this one in your sleep by now. However, as a service for the new and the directionally challenged, we present... directions! Yes, for all of you who've never been there before— and for those of us who get lost at the mall— there is help! (And since nobody complained to me about the lousy directions, I'm ripping them off verbatim from last year, when I ripped them off verbatim from CopperCon. If you like the directions and the accompanying map, be sure to thank Matthew Frederick. If you don't, let me know, and we'll find other directions for next year.) New addition this year: the overflow hotels.

THE CONVENIENT MAP TEAR-OUT PAGE

From Phoenix: Take I-10 south to exit 194 (you'll see several exit signs for Casa Grande, but wait for this exit). Now follow the directions marked "Then..." below.
From Tucson: Take I-10 north to exit 194 (you'll see several exit signs for Casa Grande, but wait for this exit). Now follow the directions marked "Then..." below.
From San Diego/Yuma: Take I-8 east to I-10. Then take I-10 north to exit 194 (you'll see several exit signs for Casa Grande, but wait for Casa Grande, but wait for this exit. Now follow the directions marked "Then..." below.

Then...: Turn west onto Florence Blvd. After traveling for about three miles, you'll have passed through most of Casa Grande. The road will automatically become the Gila Bend Highway (Arizona 84). Continue west for another four miles and you'll see the tower on the north side of the road. (Barring power failures, you should be able to see the lights after dark.)

This route purposefully takes you through Casa Grande so you can see the restaurants, banks, and other area businesses. Watch the speed limit~ it changes a couple of times through town and (small town) police patrol it.
