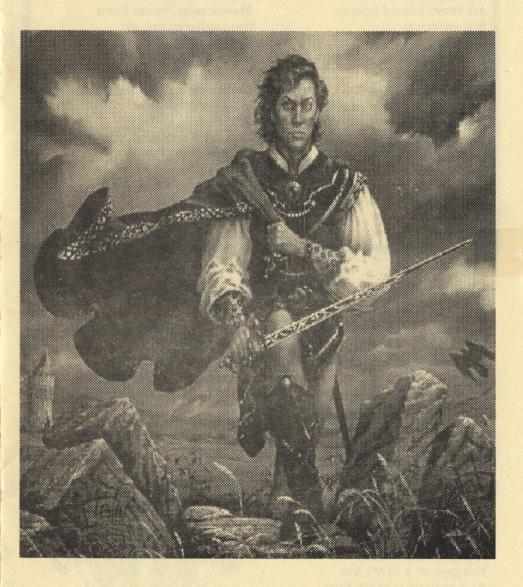

Artist Boh: Janny Wurts

Janny Wurts' cover for her novel, Master of Whitestorm, was awarded Best in Show at the World Fantasy Convention for two consecutive years. Her short story and illustrations for "Dreambridge" each received Cauldron Awards for art and writing from Marion Zimmer Bradley's Fantasy Magazine; and her painting "Wizard of the Owls" won a Chesley Award for Best Unpublished Color work, 1992. Most recently, her cover for Curse of the Mistwraith, won the 1994 Chesley Award for Best Illustration: Hard-cover Book.

Janny Wurts has published seven novels in the US and Great Britain, including the Cycle of Fire trilogy (Stormwarden, Keeper of the Keys and Shadowfane), and the most recent, entitled Fugitive Prince. Her collection of short stories, That Way Lies Camelot, was recently released in paperback from HarperCollins. At present she is at work on the fourth book on a multi book fantasy series, The Wars of Light and Shadow, forthcoming from HarperCollins.

While Janny's career with artwork has been aimed primarily toward illustrating fiction and creating covers for her own novels, she has also done fantasy and space hardware paintings that have been displayed in exhibitions the breadth of the U.S. Her paintings were included in NASA's 25th anniversary exhibit, Visions of Other Worlds; a show at the Delaware Art Museum; and also the Hayden Planetarium in New York. The Baltimore Science Center had one of her paintings on exhibition as part of a touring show, Art of the Cosmos.

Her work has also been reproduced on greeting cards, puzzles and bookmarks. Additionally, her images, in conjunction with those of her husband, Don Maitz, have appeared in two screensaver programs, Magical Encounters and Magical Encounters II that have been distributed worldwide by Second Nature Software.

Author GoH: Tim Powers

Tim Powers was born in Buffalo, New York, but has lived in southern California since the age of seven and was educated at California State University. Powers and his wife, Serena, live in southern California. His works include "On Stranger Tides", "The Stress of Her Regard" and "The Anubis Gates". The San Francisco Chronicle has this to say about Powers work:

"The fantasy novels of Tim Powers are nothing if not ambitious. Whether writing about zombie pirates of the Caribbean (On Stranger Tides), female vampires preying on Romantic poets (The Stress of Her Regard), or the escapades of a time traveler in 19th-century England (The Anubis Gates), Powers always goes the distance, never taking easy shortcuts that tempt authors with lesser imaginations. Meticulously researched and intellectually adventurous, his novels rarely fail to be strange and wholly original."

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Local Artist Goh: C.F. Yankovich

When C.F. Yankovich was a child in the sixties, she spent many mornings glued to the television, participating vicariously in the conquest of space. At the University of Iowa, she supported herself by working as a technician testing satellite packages for the space sciences group and selling paintings at student art fairs. Eventually, she received a Bachelor's in Physics. Currently she works as an automation projects coordinator for the State of Arizona.

Ms. Yankovich's works have been included in four cd-rom art collections from CD TITLES and have been published in ANALOG and MZB FANTASY MAGAZINE. In the past seven years, her art has also appeared in over thirty exhibitions including "Machinescapes" (Phoenix, AZ), "Art of the Cosmos" (New York, NY; Bridgeport, CN; Statesville, NC; Pavamus, NJ; Baltimore, MD), "To Touch the Stars" (Pomona, CA), and "Spacefest '92 Invitational Exhibit (Titusville, FL). Her works may be found at the Novagraphics Gallery in Tucson.

Media Boh: David Berrold

David Gerrold is a frequent guest at science fiction conventions. At every convention he attends he conducts an auction of science fiction memorabilia, donating all profits to AIDS Project Los Angeles.

David Gerrold wrote the Hugo nominated episode of Star Trek, "The Trouble With Tribbles" and has published numerous novels including Yesterday's Children, When Harlie Was One, The Man Who Folded Himself, Space Skimmer, and the novelization of Battle For The Planet Of The Apes as well as two non-fiction books about Star Trek, an anthology, and a short story collection.

He created Land of the Lost and wrote episodes for Star Trek Animated, Logan's Run, Tales From The Darkside, Twilight Zone, The Real Ghost Busters, Superboy, and Babylon 5. In addition he served as story editor for Star Trek: the Next Generation's first season.

Filk Golds: Jeff Bohnhoff & Maya Kaatherine Bohnhoff

The Filk GOH's are Jeff Bohnhoff and Maya Kaatherine Bohnhoff. They have tapes out and are well known West Coast Filkers. Maya is also an up and coming Science Fiction Author. She has four books out and was published in Analog three times last year. She will be taking part in panels and signings.

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Hugo-Winning Artist: Don Maitz

Acclaimed for his work portraying fantastic subjects, Don Maitz has twice won the Hugo Award for Best Artist; a special Hugo for Best Original Artwork; the Howard Award for Best Fantasy Artist; ten Chesley Awards; the Silver Medal of Excellence and Certificate of Merit from the Society of Illustrators. He created the Captain Morgan image for Seagrams & Sons Original Spiced Rum. His works have been reproduced internationally as book covers, posters, cards and limited edition prints. He has authored two art book collections First Maitz and Dreamquests. Best selling screensaver software entitled Magical Encounters and Magical Encounters II, compile a variety of his images with those of his wife, Janny Wurts.

Masquerade In The Park

LepreCon 24 will be having two Masquerades. Masquerade in the Park is going to be held outside in the late afternoon. It is PG rated. I am sponsoring a special prize for the best costume with the theme of "In the Park." Currently I'm thinking about either a gift certificate to be used in the Dealers Room or a light colored summer cloak, I am open to any suggestions people have. There will be a green room to change in and pre-judging for workmanship.

The standard rules apply -

- 1) Have Fun!!
- 2) This is a PG rated masquerade.

- 3) Do not slime the stage or leave bits and pieces behind. You need to provide someone to pick up the stage before the next presentation if parts are going to be left behind.
- 4) CLEAR ALL WEAPONS WITH THE MASQUERADE DIRECTOR AHEAD OF TIME!!
- 5) Limit your presentation to 60 sec or less. From personal experience short is good, short and funny is even better. If you feel you simply must go longer than 60 sec, clear it with the masquerade dictator ER, director ahead of time.
- 6) Have Fun!!
- 7) We will have some type of sound system. Please have your tapes queued up and marked "PLAY THIS SIDE." Working with a pre planned tape even if it is just background music helps. Even if you just walk thru it a few times you have a better idea of how to pace your self while on stage. If your presentation is a walk on and turn around for the audience presentation it helps you to slow down enough for the judges and audience to see you. If you intend to do dialogue the sound reaches your entire audience and lines don't get forgotten. Having made these mistakes my self and felt the presentation fall flat around my ears, I highly recommend having a tape.
- 8) By the way, did I mention have Fun!

The rules are -

- 1) Have Fun!!
- 2) This is not a B&D play room!!
- 3) Do not slime the stage or leave bits and pieces behind. You need to provide someone to pick up the stage before the next presentation if parts are going to be left behind.
- 4) Limit your presentation to 60 sec or less. Short is good, short and funny is even better. If you feel you simply must go longer than 60 sec, clear it with the masquerade director ahead of time.
- 5) No costume is no costume. If you want to start with a costume and work down that's fine but you must start with a costume. Please remember you time frames.
- 6) CLEAR ALL WEAPONS WITH THE MASQUERADE DIRECTOR AHEAD OF TIME!!
- 7) Have Fun!!

Part of the idea for this masquerade is to have a place to display costumes that have themes, visual puns, appearance, etc. that parents might object to having their children see, so that those costumes have a place to be displayed before an appreciative audience. Registration

Registration should be FUN, not a pain. It CAN be, just follow the established chaos. Fill out the semi-handy, usually white form, hand this form with some form of payment (Cash, Personal Check, Travelers Check, Money Order, or MasterCard, Visa, Discover Card) to the person at the Cash Register, and a custom "badge" will be made for you (unless of course you "PRE registered". 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The Convenient Map Tear-Out Page

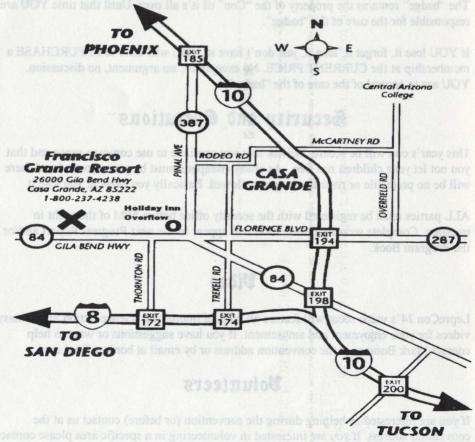
From Phoenix: Take I-10 south to exit 194 (you'll see several exit signs for Casa Grande, but wait for this exit). Now follow the directions marked "Then..." below.

From Tucson: Take I-10 north to exit 194 (you'll see several exit signs for Casa Grande, but wait for this exit) Now follow the directions marked "Then..." below.

From San Diego/Yuma: Take I-8 east to I-10. Then take I-10 north to exit 194 (you'll see several exit signs for Casa Grande, but wait for this exit). Now follow the directions marked "Then..." below.

Then... Turn west onto Florence Blvd. After traveling for about three miles, you'll have passed through most of Casa Grande. The road will automatically become the Gila Bend Highway (AZ 84). Continue west for another four miles and you'll see the tower on the north side of the road. (Barring power failures, you should be able to see the lights after dark.)

The route purposefully takes you through Casa Grande so you can see the restaurants, banks and other area businesses. Watch the speed limit - it changes a couple of times through town and (small town) police patrol it.
