Art Show Rules

The following are the art show rules for LepreCon 9.

1. This is a science fiction and fantasy convention and all

art should adhere to that subject matter.

2. Entry fee will be \$3 per panel with a maximum of 2 panels per artist. Panels are 16 square feet of display space of 4'x4' dark brown peg board.

3. All art should be finished in an appropriate manner. flat work must be framed or matted with a secure hanging

device attached.

 Space will be on a first come, first served basis.
 All works will have an identification of artist's name and address, and title of piece. After entry fees are paid, forms will follow by mail.

Signed, numbered and matted prints or photos are acceptable, but only one of a design. Art for sale must not be in

violation of copyright laws.

7. Three-dimensional work is \$.50 each with a limit of ten per artist. If more is needed, please let the art director know. Three-dimensional works will be displayed on tables, smaller works in display cases.

8. There will be no smoking or cameras in the art show.

9. The convention committee has the right to refuse any art work for sale or display.

10. Awards will be given for Best of Show (artists' ballot), Most Popular, Best Fantasy, Best Science Fiction, and Best Three-Dimensional.

There will be no direct sales. Any work with two or more bids will go to auction. Pieces with one bid may be sold to the bidder. or may go to auction at the art show director's discretion. A commission of 12% will go to the convention.

13. All artists will have payment made to them no later than June 10, 1983. If you need money before then, please let

the art director know.

14. Artists not attending the convention must include a \$4 handling fee and sufficient return postage, in addition to panel fees. Unsold work sent without these fees will become property of LepreCon 9. Work will be returned the same way that it is sent. Work should be shipped to:

Masquerade Rules

- Costumes should reflect science fiction, fantasy or historical themes.
- 2. Presentations will be limited to 1 1/2 minutes maximum (more time may be negotiated for groups).
- Sound-effects tapes may be submitted to the director during orientation, or earlier.
- 4. Costumes must be homemade.
- 5. Contestants may appear in groups.
- 6. Presentations should be in good taste.
- 7. Costumes that have either won awards in previous masquerades or that have already been seen three times in the area will not be eligible, but wearers of same will be able to strut their stuff during intermission. (We love hall costumes but everyone wants to see new creations in the contest!)
- 8. Contestants will not use mikes.
- Contestants should present typewritten presentations to the director during orientation, or earlier.

And, always remember "Rotsler's Rules". We will try to have them reprinted in the program for everyone's benefit.

Babysitting Rules and Release Form

- LepreCon 9 requires that the parent of any child using the child care facilities read and sign the rule and release form.
- Parents cannot leave a child for more than four hours at a time.
- Parents must pick up children for outside regular meals of at least a half hour.
- Parents, by signing this form, give permission to take their child on supervised excursions around the hotel for recreation and exercise. This does not include the pool area.
- Parents also give the babysitter the right to discipline the child. Yes, folks, this does include spanking.
- 6. Snacks may be given to your child. If there is anything in particular you do not want your child to eat, please list it on the form.
- The babysitters must be provided with a full change of clothing for any child.

Security

The object of LepreCon 9 is for everyone to have a good time. Since there have been some problems in the past, we will be enforcing a strict security policy. Badges will be punched by security or committee for running, brandishing weapons, or acting in any anti-social way. If the offense is serious or if this is a second offense, membership in the convention will be revoked without a refund. All weapons, or anything which looks like a weapon, must be sheathed or holstered at all times. We are trying this policy to avoid a total weapons ban such as other cons have imposed. Please also remember that food from the con suite is not to be taken into hotel function areas. This is a policy of the hotel, but we will be enforcing it to maintain good hotel relations.

Video Room

We will have a video room, featuring past masquerades, foreign SF movies, and television programs.

Memberships

Memberships are \$15 until May 1, \$20 at the door. "Guest of" memberships must be changed to real names by May 1 or must be picked up by the named member. Mail memberships will not be available after May 1. One day memberships will be available, Friday and Sunday \$8 each, Saturday is \$12. Children's memberships are \$5 until May 1, \$7 at the door.

Go'fers

A convention needs volunteers to run smoothly. We encourage anyone interested in the convention to help us run it. Anyone volunteering will be gratefully worshipped and fed hot soup for lunch. Let the people at registration know that you want to help. Volunteers under 18 will require the written consent of their parents. If your parents will not be at the convention, please write for a release form.

Masquerade

Leprecon 9's Masquerade, "The No Muss, No Fuss, No Baloney Ball", is being designed as an entertainment as well as a costume show. The Masquerade will be Saturday night at 8 p.m.

A Evaluation and Orientation period will be conducted with Richard Rouse and all entrants Saturday afternoon. The time will be posted and attendance is required, without costumes. This time will be used to resolve both director's and costumer's needs regarding presentation, staging, intros, lights, tape, and whatever, so that the show will run smoothly for everyone.

Complete rules are elsewhere in the PR. If you have any elaborate or unusual staging requirements, definitely contact us beforehand.

Six awards will be given: Best children's costume (12 and under); Best humorous costume; Most original conception; Best interpretation of a book or film character; Best crafted; Best overall costume creation.

Art Programming

We have workshops planned on color printing and preparing art for reproduction, art prints, care of artwork, how to live with a working artist, and copyright law. Details will be available at the con.

Dealers Room

The dealers room will feature 24 tables full of all kinds of SF merchandise, including books, art prints, costumes, jewelry, and TV and film memorabilia.

Games and Stuff

An expanded gaming room will have lots of room for all types of games. Games will include fantasy role playing, war, and general interest games, such as backgammon, chess, and Monopoly. Please bring your favorites to share. If you might be interested in a live fantasy role game or any other specific game, please let us know.

Con Suite

We will feature our traditional open Con Suite. Come in and socialize with our other members and guests.
