

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# Introduction

Welcome to WesterColt.45, the 45th Western Regional Science Fiction convention. I have some good news for those of you who have attended past Phoenix Conventions. There has been a big change! Phoenix now actually has a downtown that possesses life after the office workers go home. Just north and east of the Omni you will find the new ARIZONA CENTER, see their ad elsewhere in this guide. This center stays open into the evening hours seven days a week.

# Transportation

The nearby restaurants and useful merchants are all within six blocks of the Omni. It is unfortunate that you will have to use walking to get around. Phoenix provides a shuttle bus service, called the DASH, that runs every 15 minutes during working hours. But with the July 4th holiday it will only run on July 2nd not on the 3rd, 4th nor 5th.

# Restaurant Prefix Coding System (W/E/-/+/\$/!)

The heading line for each restaurant has a prefix that identifies its price range. The pricing indicator is my own subjective rating for the overall feel of the price for an entree and dessert with beverage.

# W Only open during Normal Working Hours

The "W" Indicator implies that the restaurant caters to office workers and is open only for breakfast and/or lunch. Be warned they may only be open on Thursday since Friday is a holiday. This field is only used for Downtown within walking distance restaurants.

# E Open Extended Hours

The "E" indicator implies at least some evening and/or Saturday service. It does not insure they will be open on Holidays nor Sunday. This field is only used for Downtown within walking distance restaurants.

# El Cheapo = McDonald's

Prices are less than or equivalent to McDonald's.

# \$ Reasonable = Denny's

Prices are generally equivalent to a Denny's.

# + Moderate = Red Lobster

Prices are generally equivalent to Red Lobster's.

# ! Expensive = Upscale

Prices generally exceed Red Lobster's. (The more expensive, the more !!!s.)

# E - Amalfi Espresso

(257-0605)

Located on the street level of the Arizona Center. Expresso, Cappuccino and Italian desserts. Sun-Wed, 7am-10pm; Thur, 7am-11pm; Fri-Sat, 7am-12am. Luncheon salads and sandwiches from \$3.50-\$4.

# W S ATOP

(254-3475)

Actors Theater Of Phoenix, ATOP, provides a most interesting luncheon experience. Tue, Wed and Thur at 12:15pm you can bring or purchase a brown bag lunch and then sit down for a mini-play in the Rehearsal Hall at the NE corner of the Herberger Theater at 222 E. Monroe. July 1st & 2nd they will present the mini-play "Present Tense."

# E - Bickoff's Deli

(258-3069)

Fast Food breakfast and lunch sandwich shop located just across Central from the Omni at 108 North Central. They have been voted as "The Best of Phoenix" as a sandwich shop. Normal hours are 7am–3pm on working days. But for our convention, they will open up Saturday, July 4 for the same hours. If we keep them busy they may extend their hours. Their big "Egg Bic Bagel" for \$1.99 is enough for even my breakfast. Juice, coffee, and bagel all for only \$1.50 and the most expensive sandwich is only \$4.95.

# W S Brown Bag Sandwich Shop

Located in the lower level of the Valley National Bank Center, open from 7am-4pm serving snacks, salads and sandwiches. Luncheon specials range from \$2.40 to \$5.25.

# E + Cactus Cafe

(257-1525)

The Omni Hotel's coffee shop. There are no surprises here: the normal Hotel Coffee Shop for both prices and menu. An adequate breakfast buffet is available for \$6.95.

# E! Cafe La Tasca

(340-8797)

Located in the Mercado — one block north and six blocks east of the Omni. Open Mon–Sat, 11am–10pm; and Sunday, 12pm–5 pm. We really enjoy Cafe La Tasca. The food and service make dinner here an especially enjoyable experience. I am not a fan of Tex-Mex cuisine, so finding Castilian and central Mexican food in downtown Phoenix was a great treat. They have made a special arrangement for all members of WesterColt.45. If you wear your Con Badge they will give you a FREE MARGARITA with each meal.

# E \$ Char's Thai Restaurant

(252-6053)

Located directly across Central from the Omni. They have just opened this outlet. Their normal business hours are Mon–Sat, 11am–9pm. They offer over 45 entrees ranging in price from \$4.95 to \$12.95.

# E \$ Chinese Cafe/Teriyaki Temple

(252-0872)

Part of the Arizona Center's FOOD COURT. A selection of Chinese and Japanese foods (no sushi). Combination plates are \$3-\$5.

# W \$ Coin Room Restaurant

Located in the lower level of the Valley National Bank Center, they provide upscale company cafeteria food for breakfast and lunch.

Although their reason for existence is to support the workers in the Valley Bank Center, they will serve anyone else as well. Prices range from \$2.50 to \$6.00 for lunches.

# E !! Compass Room (252-1234)

Located in the Hyatt, this is Arizona's only revolving roof-top restaurant. The food and service is up to Hyatt's standards and the view provides a good overlook of the Valley of the Sun. Normal operating hours are Mon-Sun, 11am-12:30 am. The Compass hosts a very nice Sunday brunch from 10am-2pm. and a stable of

# W - Coney Island Sandwich Shop Abas M Sas to lambat

Located at 16 West Adams, just across Central and down Adams from the Omni, this is definitely downtown Phoenix on the cheap. Hours are 7am-4:30pm, Mon-Fri. Normally they are open on Saturday but since it's the 4th of July they plan to close. Breakfasts from \$1.79, sandwiches from \$1.35-\$3.30.

# E! Copper Creek Steak house (253-7100)

Located on the street level of the Arizona Center. They serve grilled steak, chops, and seafood. Personally recommended. Hours Mon-Thur, 11am-10:30pm; Fri-Sat, 11am-11:30pm; Sun 12pm-10pm. Lunches are \$5-\$7. Dinners are \$12.50-\$17.

# E - Dusty's Cookies 200 about 200 about 200 acres 200 ac

Part of the Arizona Center's FOOD COURT. Fresh cookies, soda, milk.

# E! El Bistro San Carlos (253-4121)

This is the San Carlos dining room. The menu is basically continental cuisine with a dash of Spanish. Lunches are \$6 -\$9 and dinners are \$11.50 to \$18.50. Hours are Mon-Sat, 11am-10pm.

# E - Fajita Willy's

Part of the Arizona Center's FOOD COURT, Mexican food (Tex-Mex), lunch and dinner plates \$1.95 to \$4.

# E \$ Fat Tuesday (256-2444)

Located on the street level of the Arizona Center. A little taste of New Orleans. Gumbo, salads, Cajun sandwiches, and a premixed frozen daiquiri bar. Salads are \$2.50 to \$6; sandwiches include PoBoys and run from \$4.95 to \$5.50; New Orleans-style entrees from

\$5.25 (red beans & rice) to \$7.25 (sampler platter). The daiguiri can be quite potent (small \$3.50 to large \$5.25).

# - Foul Play

(252-9115)

Part of the Arizona Center's FOOD COURT, Sandwiches \$3.60 to \$4.00, salads \$1.75 to \$4.00, chicken from \$3.50 to \$7.75. Open Sun-Thur, 10am-9:30pm; Fri & Sat 10am-10:30pm.

# E !! Goldie's 1895 House (254-0338)

Goldie's is a fine gourmet dining room in Phoenix's oldest Victorian house. They are located three blocks north and two blocks west of the Omni at 362 N. 2nd Ave. We personally recommend this restaurant — it's one of our long-time favorites. Reservations are required.

Goldie's plays host the "Big Kill Gourmet Murder Mystery Dinner Theater." You must call them at 423-8737 for dates and times.

# Greenhouse Restaurant (252-2742)

This delightful Yuppie class sandwich and salad house is located just one block east on Adams. They are open from 7am for breakfast and also for lunch on normal business days. Salads and sandwiches run from \$2.50 to \$5.50.

#### Gyros 'n' Grill E -

(252-5220)

Part of the Arizona Center's FOOD COURT. Burgers \$2.25 to \$3.25, gyros \$3.75, salads \$1.95 to \$3.25. Breakfast specials (\$2-\$3) are available Mon-Fri, 8am-10am; and Sat, 9am-10am.

# E S Heart In Hand Tea Room

(256-7572)

Open Tue,-Sat 10am-6pm;, Sun 12pm-5pm. Tea room is a misnomer — they provide gourmet meals in a period setting in one of the original Victorian houses chock full of period antiques. They are located in Heritage Square at 622 East Adams. The food is delightful and the menu changes daily.

They offer a full Victorian High Tea, by reservation only, starting at 2pm. This tea should hold you until breakfast the next day. For \$9.50 they serve fresh-brewed teas, no tea bags, scones, citrus butter and jams, an assortment of tea sandwiches, appetizers and then a dessert tray (miniature pastries and chocolate-covered strawberries).

Part of the Arizona Center's FOOD COURT, Deli sandwiches from \$2.50 to \$4.50.

E \$ Hooters (257-0000)

Located on the street level of the Arizona Center. Specializes in wings, clams, oysters, shrimp, burgers and attractive waitresses in short-shorts and t-shirts. Normal loud bar environment. They have outside cool-misted seating. Lunch and dinner entrees from \$4–\$13, with the gourmet chicken wing dinner (20 wings and a bottle of Dom Perignon) for only \$100.01. Unfortunately my experience was not very good. A Philly cheese steak sandwich was piled high with tasteless ingredients. The following quote is not original, but I fully agree with it: "You do not go to Hooters for the food."

E - Hot Dog On a Stick

(253-3422)

Part of the Arizona Center's FOOD COURT. Hot dogs are only \$1.50 and the lemonade is some of the best available.

W \$ The Hub Second Floor Cafe

(254-1811)

The Hub is on the second floor directly across Central from the Omni at 130 N. Central. Sandwiches, seafood, burgers, salads and a gourmet Latino menu. Their hours are 7:30 am–3pm, Mon–Fri.

E \$ Jack & Jenny's

(255-0213)

Their full name is "Jack & Jenny's Barn & Grill." It is by no means a Barn, and the Grill won't be open in time for the Con. This is not a negative review: the sandwiches and salads are of the highest quality and satisfying for healthy appetites. They are run by the owners of the Heart in Hand Tea Room, and located just north of them in Heritage Square. Jack & Jenny's is offering \$1.00 off any sandwich or salad if you present your Con badge when ordering.

W \$ Jacque's Espresso

(252-0000)

They are located at One Renaissance Square. Open Mon–Fri, 6:30am–4pm; Sat, 9am–1pm. Gourmet coffee & teas. Continental breakfast \$2.25. Lunch sandwiches and salads from \$2.40 to \$5.25.

E - Kelly's Coffee & Bakery

(254-0328)

Part of the Arizona Center's FOOD COURT. Gourmet Coffee (by cup, 1/2 lb, lb) and fancy bakery snack items. Coffee & roll combination \$2.50, best coffee in Phoenix (not my expertise but overheard from many customers), and the Cappuccino is delightful. They will be open from 8am-9:30pm and will honor a 10% discount if you show your badge.



Located just kitty-corner across from the Omni, at 50 N. Central Ave. This is the newest fine Italian dining establishment in downtown. They just opened the week before press time for this review. We have not yet tried their food. This is the second location for L'Assaggio — the original is in Los Angeles in Beverly Hills.

# Lombordi's

(257-8323)

Located on the street level of the Arizona Center. I personally recommend this Italian restaurant. Moderately high prices, but very good and creative food. The entrees are available for \$8-\$15. This is a small chain — if you like them here look them up in Orlando.

# **Matador Restaurant**

(254-7563)

Tex-Mex Mexican food. Voted "Best of Phoenix" since 1979. Their normal hours are Mon-Sun, 7am-11pm. This is a moderately

priced, large quantity, high quality establishment, found on the corner southeast of the Omni at 125 E. Adams. Their breakfasts run from \$2 to \$7.45, lunch from \$5-\$7, and dinners \$4.75 to \$9.75.

# S Michael's Restaurant/Tavern

(253-9580)

Michael's is a traditional coffee shop located at 25 W. Van Buren St., on the north side of the same block with the San Carlos. Normal hours are Mon-Fri, 6am-7pm; Sat, 6am-2pm. Closed holidays and Sundays.

# - In Mister Hot Dog op I'm I A St at 25. At aholes 22-32 miseg

Here we present one of the most inexpensive places to eat in our review. Mister Hot Dogs are pushcarts selling hot dogs (\$1.50-\$2.50) and polish sausages (\$2.50) with chips (50¢) and sodas (50¢). I have made special arrangements with them to have carts available just outside the Omni on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. These prices are subject to change with a policy of no checks and no credit. We aren't sure just what hours they will be available, but they talked about opening late in the morning and staying into the evening.

# E - Mrs. White's Golden Rule Cofe

(262 - 9265)

808 E. Jefferson, "Best of Phoenix Soul Food." Totally non-smoking neighborhood Soul Food restaurant. It's not fancy, in fact the furnishings are well-used, but clean. A good place for those on a tight budget and who are willing to walk a ways. The most expensive lunch is only \$6.30 and the breakfast special is \$2.79.

# E - One Stop Shop Deli (252-6600)

They are located at 31 E. Monroe, right in the middle of the north side of the same block as the Omni. This is very inexpensive (79¢ for a hot dog, hamburger or burrito). They are open Mon-Fri, 8:30am-5:30pm; Sat, 9am-5pm; and Sunday, 9am-3pm. They only make sandwiches to order from 10am-2pm — for other hours there is a selection of pre-packaged items. This is a small convenience store with drinks, smokes (ugh!) and film. They have free downtown delivery.

# W - Oriental Gourmet

(253-6968)

Located at 18 W. Adams, this "gourmet" (not!) restaurant is only open Mon-Fri, 11am-3pm. They serve complete oriental dinners/lunches from \$3.50 to \$6.00. I have not yet actually eaten here but others have told me it is OK.

# W - Philly's Finest (495-9212)

Located on the south side of the San Carlos, this deli serves foods associated with Philadelphia: hoagies & cheese steak sandwiches. Open Mon-Fri, 7am-5pm; Sat, 7am-3pm. Breakfast specials served starting at 7am.

# E + Player's (252-6222)

Located on the street level of the Arizona Center, Part of the Phoenix Live Complex. Steak, fish, chicken entrees \$8-\$13, burgers and sandwiches from \$5.25 to \$6.25, Mexican meals \$6.50 to \$12, pastas \$6-\$9, salads \$4.25 to \$7. Don't go here unless you want to watch sports on TV from your table... 10 screens so you can't escape it.

# E - The Purple Cow (253-0861)

New York kosher-style delicatessen located in the east side of the San Carlos Hotel. They are normally only open for breakfast and lunch on weekdays from 7am-4pm, but for us they will also be open on Saturday, July 4 from 9am-5pm. Sandwiches run from \$2.25 to \$5.00, hot dogs from 1.25 to \$2.00.

# E S Sbarro

Located on the outside of Renaissance Square, this national chain is expanding from the East. They support an Italian fast food menu with pizza by the slice, or whole from \$11-\$13.55. Stuffed pizza for \$23, pasta from \$3-\$4.89, calzones, heroes and salads.

#### Salads & More W S

(253-2531)

Located at 112 N. Central Ave., they provide breakfast and lunch for downtown office workers. Hours are 7am-3pm, Mon-Fri.

# + Sam's Cafe (252-3545)

Located on the street level of the Arizona Center. This is a full service restaurant with a creative southwest flavor. They have extensive outside cool-misted covered seating. I have enjoyed every meal here. Lunches from \$4-\$10, and dinner entrees in the \$10-\$17 range.

# E!! Sandpainter Restaurant

(257-1525)

Omni Hotel's fine dining room. This is one of our favorites — we have enjoyed many meals with them. They advertise Continental cuisine with a Southwestern flair. The Sandpainter is moderate to highpriced, but not out of line with hotels comparable to the Omni.

# E S Scotto's Pizza

(252-2755)

Part of the Arizona Center's FOOD COURT. They have the most creative and robust pizza (Spinach & Tomatoes, Broccoli & Tomatoes, Hot pepper & Black Olive with Onion & Tomatoes, Steak & Sausage). Don't let these weird ones scare you off — they have all the "normal" types of pizza as well. An individual slice of their pizza is a full meal for most, and two slices should even satisfy fen. Pizza (slices \$1.50-\$2.25, whole \$11-\$20) and Italian style sandwiches for \$3.50-\$4.

# E ? Seamus McCaffrey's Irish Pub

This Irish pub is not rated since as of publishing date they are not yet ready for full service. They are on the south side of the San Carlos. When open they will feature live Irish entertainment and Guinness on tap. Note for the non-Irish reading this: to avoid embarrassment, Seamus is pronounced, approximately, shame-us.

# Sesame Inn

(252-0111)

Located in the Mercado, one block north and six blocks east of the Omni. Normal upper middle class Chinese restaurant. Open Mon-Sun, 11am-10pm. Combination dinners are priced from \$7-\$15.

# Sing High Chop Suev House

Known for high standards since 1928. Mon-Thur, 11am-9pm; Fri, 11am-11pm; Sat, 12n-11pm; Sun, 12n-9pm. Located south and east of the Omni at 27 W. Madison. For attendees they will provide a free non-alcoholic beverage with any full meal.

# The Sweet Shop

Located in the lower level of the Valley National Bank Center, they serve Dreyer's ice cream, Miss Karen's frozen yogurt, popcorn and pretzels.

# Swensen's

Located just east of the Omni, on Adams between 1st and 2nd Ave. They are normally open the same hours as the Arizona Museum of Science and Technology since they are integrated with one exit to the museum. This Swensen's only serves ice cream, no solid food.

# E ! Theater Terrace Cafe (252-1234)

Located on the terrace level of the Hyatt, this is an expensive Hyatt-class coffee shop.

# W \$ Tom's BBQ Express

(258-9770)

Located just across Central from the Omni, but only open during weekdays from 10:30am –3pm. If you want BBQ, get there on Thursday. Sandwiches from \$3–\$5 and full rib dinners from \$6.50 to \$15.

# E \$ Under Three

(258-1046)

This is a bar downstairs at 3 W. Monroe, just south of the San Carlos. They advertise "The Best Hamburger in Town." They plan to be open for food from 9am-6pm, Mon-Sun. Burgers are \$4.25 to \$5.25, sandwiches \$3.50 to \$4.50, and large pizza from \$9-\$13. This is a bar and is open for drinks from 7am-8pm.


DOWNTOWN PHOENIX MAP

# At The Arizona Center, Van Buren & 3rd

Most, but not all, merchants at the Arizona Center will be providing a 10% discount for members of WesterColt.45 when they are wearing their badges. Since not all will cooperate make sure to ask for your discount and be nice if they say it does not apply in this establishment.

While the Arizona Center is four blocks away from the Omni, at Van Buren & 3rd St., the walk can be done mostly in the shade and

in easy stages. We timed the walk to be about 4 minutes and 45 seconds at an easy saunter.

They have succeeded in creating a true Desert Oasis. All central outside areas are misted. They have lush gardens with plenty of shaded walks, and many ponds and fountains. Basic shopping hours are Mon–Sat, 10am–9:30pm; Sun, 11am–6pm. Some restaurants and entertainment centers stay open longer.

For general Arizona tourist information the state has opened an Arizona Highways "shop" on the second floor of the Arizona Center. Many free handouts are available about our state and its many tourist attractions. They also sell books and souvenirs from and about Arizona.

they are not reviewed as a restaurant. The normal cover charge is \$5 on weekdays and \$8.50 on weekends. For our convention they will allow a flat cover charge of only \$3.00 if you are wearing your WesterColt.45 Con badge.

Phoenix Live (252-6222)

This is a large sports bar entertainment complex with outside misted mini-mini golf, sand volleyball court and loud music. Inside you will find all the normal sports bar type entertainment but on a grand scale.

# At The Phoenix Mercado

Located just five blocks east of the hotel you find a Mexican-style center with shops, restaurants, the WesterColt.45 babysitting service (at Sunrise Preschool), and a Mexican museum (Museo Chicano). We can recommend the restaurants and the whole center does have the feel of Mexico. Many shops are vacant and though fairly new and clean, look like they need more upkeep, just like Mexico itself.

Each of them have restaurants of at least 3 star rating, unfortunately none are yet rated as five star.

#### + China Doll (264-0538)

Phoenix's best Dim Sum, available for lunch 7 days a week. This Cantonese restaurant is a favorite with the local Chinese community. They are located at 3336 N. 7th Ave.

# The French Corner (234-0245)

Voted one of Phoenix's 10 best restaurants in 1991. French cuisine at Central and Camelback.

# NOTABLE BUT OUTSIDE OF DOWNTOWN

Greekfest (265-2990)

Generally rated as the best Greek restaurant in Phoenix they are found at 1940 E. Camelback Rd. Feta cheese salads, exohiko, rack of lamb surprisingly moderate priced. It is a little hard to find as it is behind another building, but worth looking for.

# !! Havana Cafe

(952 - 1991)

This restaurant has been receiving rave reviews in the local press. As the name implies it serves true Cuban and Spanish food. I feel it should be mentioned but I have not yet personally tried them out., although friends I trust have. They are a small restaurant located at 4225 E. Camelback Rd. Come early as they do not take reservations.

!! Le Rhone

(933-0151)

This Sun City restaurant, at 9401 W. Thunderbird, has always delivered fine food with a European (Swiss) flavor. The food and service are remarkable. Their homemade rolls are delicious. Since most of their clientele are from Sun City (retirement community) you get slightly smaller servings, but as a unique touch they offer free second helpings for the Starch (potatoes or rice) and Vegetables.

# ! The Moroccan Restaurant

Here is a little piece of the Mideast — just south of Camelback and Scottsdale Roads at 4228 N. Scottsdale Rd. in Scottsdale. Enjoy belly dancers in an authentic setting. Complete dinners range in price from \$12.50 to \$23.

# !!! Uptown Dine Around

(468-0700)

For those staying over or on your next visit to Phoenix we must mention the most romantic evening in town. This evening starts off by checking into the Phoenix Ritz Carlton, located at 24th Street and Camelback. This is a very high class hotel with all the amenities. The lobby, restaurants, and halls are filled with beautiful antiques. After enjoying the pool and Health Spa you and your "significant other" take a leisurely stroll across Camelback to the Biltmore Shopping Center. There at RoxSand's restaurant you will enjoy appetizers with wine. Then a second stroll over to the northwest corner of Camelback and 24th St. for your main course at Christopher's Bistro. Of course this includes vegetables and more wine. Then it's back to the Ritz Carlton where a iced bucket of champagne and a platter of the Ritz's desserts is waiting in your room. # !!! The Grill @ Ritz Carlton

Slightly less pretentious than its sister restaurant but still a creative menu, superb service and delightful wine list. Just to tempt your appetite think of lobster and pumpkin chowder. The setting here is as if you were in a gentleman's club; polished brass lighting fixtures and stuffed armchairs enhance the atmosphere.



# !!! The Tack Room

This is the only restaurant I will mention outside of the Valley of the Sun. The Tack Room is the **only** Mobil Five Star restaurant in Arizona. And as the definition of Five Star implies, they are worth a trip to Tucson just for the meal. You will find them at 2800 N. Sabino Canyon Rd. in northeast Tucson.

# !! The Wigwam Resort

(935-3811)

Located at 4344 Litchfield Rd. in Litchfield, Arizona, they were created as an executive retreat for the Goodyear Corporation. The "rooms" are actually individual bungalows with every service and device I have ever seen. Their dining room, "The Terrace," provides unusual meals in the new Southwestern style. The final preparations and some cooking are performed in front of the dining room. We enjoyed the show this provides.

I must mention their Summer Family Weekend package. This is a great deal — the price is just \$65 for each adult per night, and up to two children are included in the same bungalow for no extra charge. This low price does not include food but will cover the room and full daytime activities for both the adults and the children at their own Camp Pow-Wow. Horseback riding, hay rides, tennis, bike-riding, the best golf course in the valley, beautiful grounds, and a mammoth pool only scratch the surface for what the Wigwam offers.

# !! Marriott's Camelback Inn (948-1700)

"In all the World there is only one." This is their motto and they live up to it. Their Sunday poolside buffet, nominally in the Navajo room, is a family favorite. The "rooms" are actually small bungalow complexes scattered across their spacious grounds.

They host visiting exhibits and continuing exhibits for everything from Ancient Chinese to Modern Street Art. Two areas of special interest are the Thorne Miniature Room gallery for rooms from many periods of time and the ArtAttack Gallery providing hands-on activities for children.

# Pioneer Living History

(993-0212

The Pioneer Arizona Living History Museum is located north of the Valley of the Sun on I-17 at the Pioneer Rd. exit. They are open Wed-Sun, 9am-5pm. This is a recreation of a small pioneer town with costumed participants. In addition to the static displays there is a working blacksmith shop and melodramas in the Opera House. Western history buffs should enjoy this.

# **Pueblo Grande Museum**

This is an active archeological site from the Hohokam Indian period over 600 years ago. This site is located in east-central Phoenix at 4615 E. Washington St. Open 9am—4:45pm, Mon—Sat; and 1pm—4:45pm on Sun.

Our boys have enjoyed running around on the contoured and raised grass and planting areas. There is a large center stage covered with a futuristic-looking steel structure festooned with lighted globes. A large, powerful laser, mounted in the structure, displays various moving patterns and animations on flat panels above (on most Friday and Saturday nights). When the laser is in use, the beam finally shoots across the Phoenix sky and can be seen from miles away. If your kids need a wiggle-break or place to run, or if you'd like to see the impressive laser, this is the place. Now for the bad news: it is a favorite hangout for the downtown homeless. I advise keeping a close eye on your kids. Don't send them there alone!

# Rawhide

Located just south of Pinnacle Peak Rd. on Scottsdale Rd. this Phoenix mundane tourist attraction provides a stunt and comedy gunfight show in a Wild West town. Our children love this place. The best of Rawhide is found in the evening hayride and cook-outs on the desert. Also if your tastes run to large steaks, rattlesnake, or Rocky Mountain oysters try their restaurant.

# The Island at Big Surf

(280-9073)

1500 N. McClintock Rd. in Tempe. Very large sandy beach and man-made ocean wave park. This is my pick for the best waterpark in the valley. This was the original wave park that spawned all the others. National surfing championships were once held here in the Arizona desert.

# Golfland/Sunsplash

(834-8318)

155 W. Hampton Ave. in Mesa. In my estimation the second best water park in the valley. They also support at least four fine miniature golf courses, with a separate entry fee.

# AMUSEMENTS, PARKS, AND ATTRACTIONS

#### Water World USA

(230-4300)

Located in the far north of Phoenix at 4243 W. Pinnacle Peak Rd. In my estimation this is only the third best waterpark in the valley.

# Shooter's World (266-0170)

Rated as the best aun store in the southwest. I have used it to entertain businessmen from Japan. They provide full service gun sales, service, and shooting at their indoor range. For me the high point is the ability to rent guns and use them in their range. Renting and shooting a Thompson .45 caliber submachine gun is a real trip. I have not used their indoor paintball arena but others have given it a definite recommendation.
