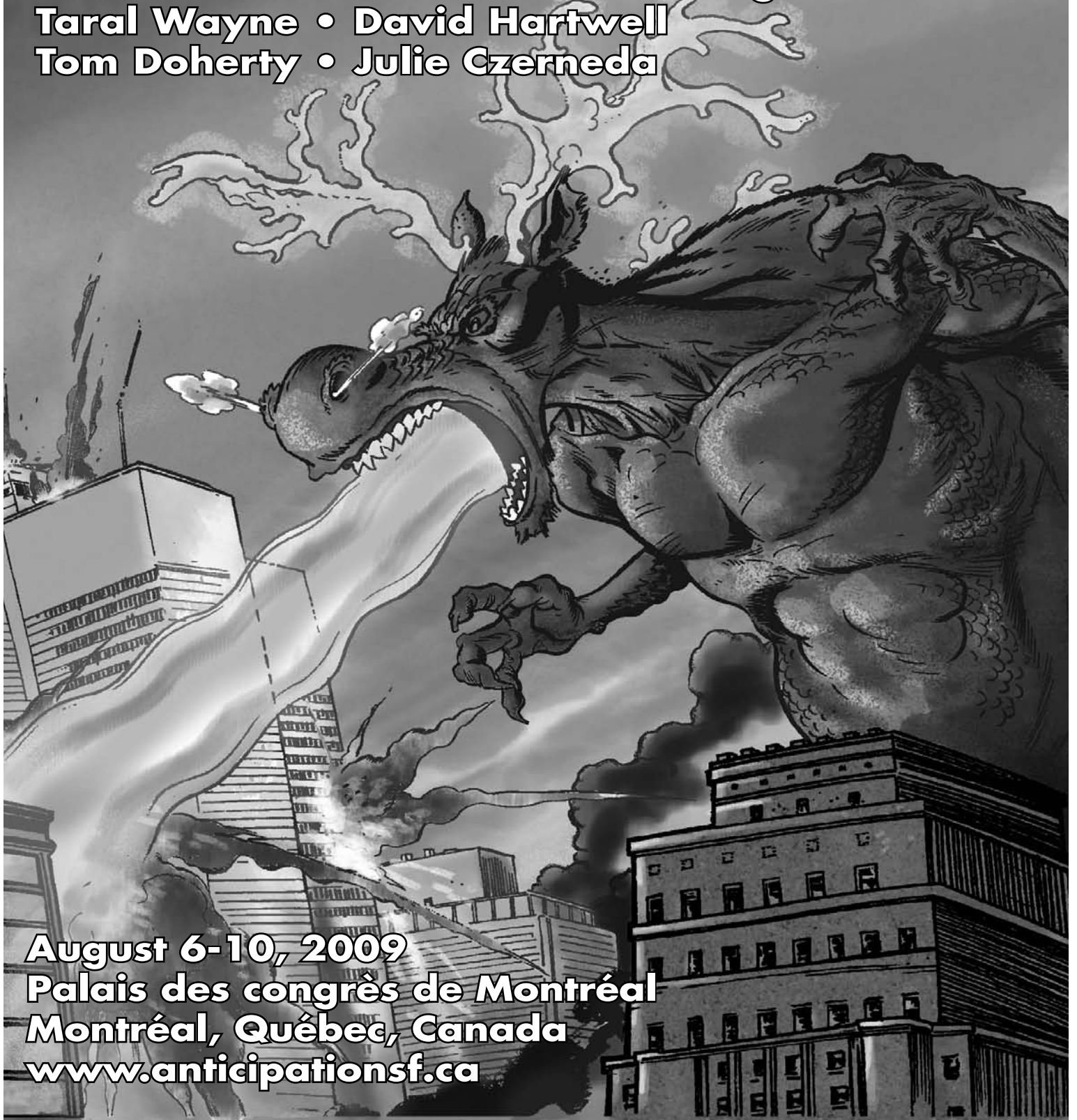

Neil Gaiman

Bestselling author Neil Gaiman has long been among the top writers in modern comics, as well as writing books for readers of all ages.

Gaiman was the creator of the cult DC Comics series *Sandman*, and has written several novels including *Good Omens* (with Terry Pratchett), *American Gods*, *Anansi Boys*, and *Neverwhere*.

Born and raised in England, Neil Gaiman now lives near Minneapolis, MN. He has somehow reached his forties and still tends to need a haircut.

Élisabeth Vonarburg

Élisabeth Vonarburg was editor for *Solaris* from 1979 to 1990, is now a full-time writer and organized the first Boréal convention in 1979.

Her novel *In the Mothers' Land*, received the Philip K Dick Special Award, the Boréal and Aurora awards, and was a finalist for the Tiptree Award. Other books include *The Reluctant Voyagers*, *The Silent City*, *Slow*

Tom Doherty has been in publishing for 50 years and founded his own company, Tom Doherty Associates, LLC in 1980.

He co-founded Baen Books with Richard Gallen and Jim Baen in 1982.

He received the 1993 Skylark, and a "Lifetime Achievement Award" at the 2005 World Fantasy Convention.

David G. Hartwell is the author of *Age of Wonders* and the editor of anthologies including *The Dark Descent*, *The World Treasury of Science Fiction*, two anthologies of the best of Canadian SF, *Northern Stars* and *Northern Suns*, co-edited with Glenn Grant, and nearly twenty others co-edited with Kathryn Cramer.

Hartwell is a Senior Editor at Tor/Forge Books and publisher of *The New York Review of Science Fiction*.
