From The Renegades to The Pirates of Fenzance



The days and dates for Bucconeer, the 56th annual Worldcon are Wednesday through Sunday, August 5 through August 9th, 1998.

When the National Guard negotiated an event at the Baltimore Convention Center for the 1998 Labor Day Weekend, they could not possibly have imagined the repercussions! The impacts for the 56th World Science Fiction Convention are still being investigated!

Requiring the Baltimore group to change the dates for our World Science Fiction Convention (or drop out of the bidding process) continues to encourage detailed revisiting of fundamental planning issues: "Why do we do this? How should we do this? What else is affected by this decision?"

We're sure that we haven't identified all of the issues which will be affected by the Wednesday through Sunday (instead of Thursday through Monday) change or by the August 5 - 9 (instead of September 3 - 7) and therefore need to be addressed.

Some of the important issues we have identified, so far, are:

The best day(s) and time(s) for the Guest of Honor presentations, the Masquerade, the Hugo Ceremonies, and a host of other activities during the Worldcon itself, need to be explored.

Dates for numerous administrative activities—Hugo Nomination and Voting Ballot distribution, filing deadlines for the 2001 bidders, Site Selection Ballot distribution, the deadline for Site Selection Voting—are all affected by our convention dates.

The Site Selection Voting Deadline has been, for many years, at 6:00 p.m. on Saturday evening. The official release of the results has been at the Sunday WSFS Business Meeting. The newly elected Worldcon then processed conversions from supporting memberships to attending memberships during Sunday and Monday.

Family vacations to a Worldcon, which were impractical or impossible over the Labor Day Weekend, are now being seriously planned.

Educators and students will not be forced to choose between classes and the Worldcon.

The European 'normal vacation time frame' encourages these fans to attend Bucconeer.

Arrangements for hotel rooms near the Smithsonian exhibits have been already requested by several members of BucConeer.

Requests for information about ground transportation between Baltimore, New York, Philadelphia and Washington, D.C. are being received.

Obtaining business services (e.g., newsletter copying) during the convention may be easier and less costly than during the Labor Day Weekend.

Set-up and Tear-Down will be done during "normal business hours," rather than paying overtime during Labor Day.

We encourage you to share your ideas and recommendations by completing and returning the Member Questionnaire in this Progress Report. Additional ideas and comments are welcome!

A Brief Introduction to our Honored Guests

C.J. Cherryh

CAROLYN CHERRYH and I go back a long and winding way. I think we've known each other for nearly twenty years now, almost as long as we've both been professional writers. We have a lot of other things in common too, like being about the same age, about the same height; having reddish hair, and last names that confound almost everyone who tries to pronounce them. The first I met her, I knew immediately that I was going to like her as much as I already liked her writing (needless to say, a lot).



Over the years since then we've seen each other mainly at SF cons. those floating small towns. But "quality time" can be as hard to get as the brass ring on a merry-goround: to score an entire dinner-hour is a rare prize. Too many of my memories are of ten minutes talking in a hallway,

an hour on a panel, a "see you later" promise that I never got to keep. But I'll always have Chicon—a perfect memory of standing on a stage to hand Carolyn a Hugo for Best Novel.

C.J. Cherryh, like Michael Whelan, is one of those people who really deserve their gifts from the Muses. Besides her creativity, she has intelligence, a wicked sense of humor, and real insight into human nature. She's also one of the most inspirational people I've ever met, although I've never had the chance to tell her so.

So, Carolyn, here it is: A few years ago I was deep in the middle of writing *The Summer Queen*,

a book I was beginning to think was going to take up as much real time as it covered fictionally (i.e., twenty years). One day at lunch time I opened a box of newly-arrived books, and included in it was your book *Rimrunners*. I rarely get to read for pure pleasure any more; but by the time I'd finished eating I was glued to that book. I couldn't put it down.

It was a terrific read, but it was also something more. It filled me with "bliss"—the word Joseph Campbell uses to describe the joy of doing the thing you were meant to do, the one thing that truly fulfills you. After reading Rimrunners, almost feverishly, I went back to my own writing like a woman possessed. I wrote and wrote and wrote, for about five weeks, staying up until 5:30 in the morning, getting up at about noon; at the pool with the kids, in the hush of the night. I wrote three hundred pages of manuscript that summer, and every day was ecstasy. Normally, I'm a very slow writer: I've never been "in the zone" for weeks on end, before or since. It happened because of your book, the gift of your writing that you share with us all. Thank you.

I know that Carolyn's work has given gifts of wonder to countless other readers, as well. When you see her at this convention, don't be afraid to tell her how much you enjoy her books. She deserves to hear every word, for all the unforgettable stories she's given to the world, and all the joy she's shared with us.

(P.S. Cherryh rhymes with "cherry"; Vinge rhymes with "stingy". Trust me on this.)

Milton A. Rothman

Seeing MILT ROTHMAN again after a time spent out of his company helps remind you of the varied interests of this modern day man of letters. In a recent visit he surprised his guest by commenting on how well the piano lessons have been going recently. After remarking that his music seems to be consuming more of his time, Milt went on to say that he is currently reading a lot of mysteries, as he knows too much science to enjoy a great deal of current science fiction.

This level of activity seems to characterize Milt's entire life to date. At age 16, Milt cofounded (together with Jack Baltadonis and Bob Madle) the Philadelphia Science Fiction Society, which just celebrated its 60th year of existence in October of 1995. In 1936, Milt chaired the first science fiction convention, the first Philcon, which was held in the living room of his father's house in Philadelphia. For the occasion Milt invited his friend, Donald A. Wollheim, to come down from New York with a number of other New York fans, including Frederik Pohl (the secretary of the first Philcon) and David Kyle.

He followed these historic firsts by chairing the two Philadelphia Worldcons, those held in 1947 and 1953. At the latter of these, the first Hugo Awards were presented.

In addition to his activities as an organizer of SF fandom, Milt was the long time publisher of the popular fanzine, *Miltie's Mag*, which ran from 1939-1945. He than changed its name to *Plenum* and continued publishing until 1950.

As a SF writer, Milt wrote two stories which were published in *Astounding* in 1939. He followed this early success with a number of other stories published in *Astounding*, *Analog* and *Asimov's SF Magazine*, the last of which was published in the 1970's.

Like the late Asimov, Milt is a popularizer of scientific principles in a variety of books he authored, including: Discovering The Natural Laws (reprinted by Dover Books) and A Physicist's Guide to Shepticism (Prometheus Books). Currently, Milt continues to write about the skeptical approach to the paranormal and the pseudoscientific in "Skeptical Briefs," his quarterly column for The Sheptical Inquirer. He now lives with his wife, Miriam, in Philadelphia.

His contributions to the world of science fiction make his selection as a Guest at Bucconeer an honor which is long overdue.

Stanley Schmidt

Being the editor of *Analog* isn't easy. I know. I've been there. Yet STAN SCHMIDT makes it seem as if he'd been born for the job—and just maybe he was.

There are three major qualifications needed to run Analog:

- (1) the editor must understand science fiction;
- (2) the editor must understand science; and
- (3) the editor must be able to handle new writers and help them to become successful in their craft.

John Campbell, my predecessor at the job and undoubtedly the most influential individual in the history of science fiction, once said, "The job of the editor is to find a good writer in a bad story." That is, the editor must be able to recognize talent even in a writer's awkward first efforts, to nurture that talent and help it flower.

Stan Schmidt meets all those requirements, and more.

Stanley is a highly-respected writer of science fiction, one of the precious few who has consistently blended real science with strong character-driven fiction. Tales



such as Newton and the Quasi-Apple and The Sins of the Fathers are science fiction at its intriguing and thought-provoking best.

Stan is a physicist, and he has used his training in physics as a springboard from which he has expanded his interests into biology, sociology, and many other aspects of science. His book, *Aliens and Alien Societies* (Writer's Digest Books, 1996), is an invaluable guide for writers who want to know how to create believable aliens in their science fiction stories.

Above all, Stan is a teacher. He was teaching physics and science fiction writing at Heidelberg College, in Ohio, when I first met him. I once attended one of his writing classes, and immediately recognized that this is the person to edit *Analog* after I retired from the job.

There is another qualification that the editor of *Analog* must have: the editor must be able to deal with a hundred thousand or so readers who

have six hundred thousand or so opinions on every subject under the sun. Stan does that with much more equanimity than I ever had, and a lot of good humor.

Analog, of course, is known as the bastion of "hard" science fiction. But the magazine is much more than that. It is the central nervous system for a large, cantankerous, extremely bright and knowledgeable gang of men and women of all ages, all political persuasions, all socioeconomic levels, who are connected to one another, intellectually and emotionally, through the pages of the magazine.

Since Campbell's time, the editorials in Analog have been used by the editor to provoke, prod, inspire, ignite; and anger the magazine's readers into thinking, questioning their own assumptions, looking at the world with fresh insights. And maybe writing a publishable story. Many a writer's career began by responding to an Analog editorial that stirred his or her guts. Stan knows how to do that, as the angry letters -and stories-he receives prove amply. He puts on that bemused smile of his when he talks about the angry letters. He knows that the opinions expressed in the editorials are not necessarily the personal opinions of the editor, but many times the readers are too incensed at a given opinion to recognize that fact.

Analog is also the breeding ground for new writers, much more so than any of the other magazines in the field. Readers, writers and fans should be extremely grateful to Stan for that. Like his predecessors, Stan has sacrificed a good deal of his own writing time to help other writers to succeed. That kind of selflessness is rare, and should be treasured.

He spins off story ideas to writers. For example, he turned a chance meeting at a Chicago Worldcon into a writing partnership and a top-notch story. Stan bumped into Joseph H. Delaney and Marc Stiegler while taking his morning walk outside the hotel. Stan introduced them to each other and the three of them started talking about writing and stories (what else?). Stiegler mentioned an idea he had about a self-aware computer program, which he hadn't been able to get into because it required a detailed knowledge both of computers (which he had) and of law (which he hadn't). Delaney, the attorney,

allowed as he had been wanting to write a similar story, but he didn't know enough about computers to get started. "Godfather" Stan paired them, and the result was *Valentina*.

Stan is not helpful only to young writers, either. My latest *Analog* story began in a conversation we had in his office the last time I visited New York.


Moreover, he is a man of many talents. He plays musical instruments, mainly brass. He hikes in the countryside. He travels around the world. He is equally at home in a publisher's office, a physicist's lab, or a tent in the wilderness.

When "ordinary" people begin to travel in space, I fully expect to see this extraordinary man among the very first.

As I see it, there is only one thing lacking in Stants brilliant, multi-faceted career: he has never been awarded a Hugo. This seems a shocking failure on the part of science fiction fandom, and I certainly hope it is rectified in the very near future.



own inspiration. There is always a dynamic, well-thought-out design and color scheme that are held together with impeccable drawing and strong values. Values meaning both the visual play of light versus dark shapes and the not so visual but decidedly apparent dedication to make a worthy expression within each of his creative efforts. There have been three art book collections of his distinctive paintings published, Wonder Works; Michael Whelan's Works of Wonder; and most recently, The Art of Michael Whelan. Through these sources, Michael Whelan's background from early childhood, his personal insights, his awards (he's got enough to sink a frigate), and his techniques are readily accessible. These books are wonderful documentation of the artist and his work. Buy the books. They provide a much better account of Michael Whelan than I can here. If there is something

about him you wish to know, ASK him. That is one of the reasons Bucconeer invited him. He is

a friendly, approachable, individual who is

willing to answer questions. And now for the scuttlebutt!

I met Michael Whelan in 1978 at a convention art show over art crates. It is a fact that more convention artists meet "over crates" than "over drinks". It was after this initial encounter that I discovered I had been introduced to this artist by Kull and the Barbarians. It was issue #1 of a Marvel magazine featuring a dynamic cover with a powerful, windswept barbarian with sword and shield who stood hunched over a slain, terrifically evil looking B.E.M. This striking cover painting was the first published offering by an illustrator I never heard of before. But that didn't matter. I simply had to buy a copy. Was it the fabulous cover that made me buy this particular issue? Nah! I snatched up the thing because MY first reproduced drawing was inside! Apparently, we each made our first splash in the same puddle.

Within the past twenty years of our acquaintance, we've shared time at art museums, galleries, universities, zoos, parties, parties that were zoos, art classes, photographic excursions, conventions, concerts, dinners, and visits to each other's studios. After all those encounters, you sort of compare notes and inevitably one naturally acquires a good smattering of scuttlebutt.

For example, we discovered we were both art school nerds. Yup, we were the quiet withdrawn types with squinty eyes (an art school conditionlooking through one's eyelashes simplifies shapes, values, and colors), sharpened drawing pencils, and noses to the grindstone. We were constantly off by ourselves working through lunch breaks, taking extra classes, and we always had paint unintentionally covering various parts of our bodies. It wasn't really anti-social behavior. Truth be told, at the time we entered art school, seventy-five percent of enrolling students did not remain till graduation. There were many reasons for this. Hard work, competition, long hours of effort to get frustratingly inept results, for example. Phrases like, "What makes you think you'll be any good as an artist", "you are wasting your mind", "you'll starve", "you'll never make it" were directed at us from authority figures. It is the dedicated individual who can overcome all this and then face the student loans and uncertain employment looming ahead. But we nerds are made of sterner stuff! In Michael's case, when the going gets tough, (and I understand at the prestigious Art Center School it can be tough going) the tough, and specifically talented, go to the San Diego Comic Con. It was a result of exhibiting his favorite works there for the first time, that he got an inkling that there just might be a career in this sort of thing. I saw that "inkling" framed on a wall in his studio a few years ago. It was in the form of a letter promising Michael work at DAW Books written by Donald Wollheim. Inkling in hand, Michael did what any budding, creative, and free-thinking spirit would do in the early seventies-gather all that one has and drive a Volkswagen van FROM (??!) California? A typically shrewd maneuver because the heart of the publishing marketplace can be found in and around the New York City area.

Whelan runs a tight ship. The armada of equipment in his studio is arranged like a control center with Michael at the helm. Within easy reach he has his own specially pre-mixed acrylics in squeeze bottles that vary with subtle increments in value and color. Piped-in air from his compressor alleviates excess noise, while a stainless steel hooded fan removes harmful paint particles from his environment. I watched him "test run" a drawing table at an art supply house

in New York City. He put the thing through all it's paces while making drawing motions with his arm at the surface area. This kind of focused attention to the process is evident in all aspects of his chosen profession.

Where does he get his ideas? That's obvious, his soul. Heart and soul are more evident in his work than the paint itself. He goes on unusual voyages to gain unique experiences for inspiration. His imagination allows these experiences to come to light in his work. He has been in a deprivation tank, he sneaked into a nearly completed giant empty water tank. On photo opportunities I have been with him as he climbed into jet cockpits, bombers, aircraft wreckage and was there as he got a behind the scenes look at a NASA facility. He toured the empty and desolate Alcatraz prison, and climbed Ayers Rock in Australia. All these experiences are as wind for his sails. However, music is the current beneath his keel. He carefully selects what he listens to so that it reflects the mood the painting is to express. He is convinced there is a direct, if interpretive correlation between color and sound.

Michael Whelan has spearheaded many exhibits and publications. In fact, no major endeavor involving fantastic art is without his presence. He has spoken publicly on many occasions for the benefit of all imaginative artists. He once confessed that he never prepares a speech but always seems to come up with something on the way to the stage.

I have known him to refer work to other artists, in some cases very desirable work which he thought would better suit another's talents. He is professional, sincere and competent.

Enough about Michael Whelan. The real scuttlebutt resides with Audrey Price, his wife. I am sure Michael's ship would have sailed over the edge of the earth had he not been fortunate in his choice of an anchor. The small house Michael rented early in his career came with a very important attribute, the landlady! Soon Audrey provided more than the roof over his head. She became the invisible force that surrounds every painting. An artist can be free to have his head in the clouds, his imagination across the universe, his mind on the distant future, and his fingers in the paint—provided he

has a partner who is down to earth. Her practical influence, protectiveness, common sense, entrepreneurial spirit, and willingness to work long hard hours are only a few abilities to her credit. Anyone who stands toe to toe with printers deserves a great admiration. She has created Glass Onion Graphics (inspired by a Beatles song) and daily deals with print runs, distribution, sales, inventory management, catalogs, product shipping, frame and mat selection, manning dealer tables, and she recently opened a retail gallery to the public. Audrey maintains a beautiful home, has terrific kids, and I have always known her to be thoughtful and kind. I hope you take the opportunity to meet her.

I never could figure out which of them decided to put the things in the swimming pool at some of their parties. Things like realistic plastic frogs, glow sticks, and invisible water balloons that crept up on you. I guess I'll have to ask them to get the scuttlebutt on that.

Charles Sheffield by Kim Stanley Robinson

I got to know Charles Sheffield when I was living in the Washington, DC area, and he and Roger MacBride Allen and I used to get together for lunch. During that time Roger dedicated a book to Charles, calling him "the sanest man in the business." Either this is wrong or else the business is even stranger than I thought. Charles may seem normal—a British space scientist with American daughters, who knows



a great deal of poetry by heart and writes surrealist hard sf novels-but behind that ordinary seeming exterior lurks a truly unusual man. Actually I do not know exactly how unusual Charles is because he is British and it's





Now Charles writes hard SF, which as you know is science fiction played with the net up and with a handy portable device that will shrink any balls actually hit at the net so that they will pass through without impediment. This of course makes for a great game, in which anything is possible but everything seems real. Charles is

one of the best currently working this game, extending its limits and testing the possibilities. Once he entered a utopian novel contest by submitting a dystopia, and though the book did not win the utopia contest it did win an unrelated award for literary excellence. As a result the prize changed from half a million dollars to a trip to Kansas, but I am sure Charles enjoyed the trip to Kansas very much.

Since then he has made other trips to collect other awards, given for other stories that have tested boundaries and charted new ground. Once in conversation he observed to me that one could quantize SF aesthetics by creating a two-axis grid in which literary quality was charted along the x axis, while scientific understanding and originality were plotted along the y axis. We both sat stunned as we contemplated the awesome power of this graphing, its clarity such that neither one of us dared to suggest the location on the grid of even a single fellow sf writer, but only hoped that we could both hanglide out there into the northeast quadrant as far as we could go, for a few more passes.



We will highlight these items at the convention, with full credit to the convention and fans that created them.
- On-line. As Bucconeer comes closer, you'll be able to watch the program grow day by day. Starting in the coming months, watch for program information on our web site. We hope that as you watch the program mature it will help



you plan your time at Bucconeer and generate suggestions to help us improve the program.

One note for those who would like to be program participants: Thank you for your interest! We will send an acknowledgment to anyone who contacts us, but please don't expect to hear anything substantive until after the 1997 Worldcon in San Antonio. If you do write to us, please tell us a little bit about yourself — your work, your interests, and anything else that would help us decide where you best fit into the program. (Nobody can keep up with everyone in the field these days...)

We have many talented and creative people around Baltimore helping us create a terrific program for Bucconeer. But to make the convention a real success we'll also need your ideas. If you have suggestions for specific program items or more general ideas about how we should run programming, please let us know. 




