What's a Hugo PIN?

On the top line of your mailing label there should be a five-digit number after the word "Hugo PIN." A Hugo PIN substitutes for your signature on the online version of the Hugo ballot, available on the ConJosé web site. You must include your Hugo PIN with your electronically-submitted ballot or we will not count it. You don't need your Hugo PIN to vote on a paper ballot. Having a Hugo PIN on your mailing label does not guarantee your eligibility to vote. Some classes ofmembership, including any "guest of" membership or membership owned in the name of a club, corporation, or other "non-natural person" may not vote.

If you do not know your Hugo PIN, want to change your Hugo PIN, or have not received a notification postcard or a progress report with a Hugo PIN printed on the mailing label, or if you have questions about the Hugo Award voting process, e-mail *hugos@conjose.org* and we will be happy to help you.

CHANGES & CANCELLATION:



Hotel Update

Well, it's time to make our hotel reservations for ConJosé. We will be using the San José Convention & Visitors Bureau's Convention Housing office for all regular (non-Suite) room reservations. The housing office will accept reservations beginning February 15, 2002.

Our Hotels

The Fairmont San José is our headquarters and party hotel. The Fairmont is the only hotel where we have negotiated a corkage waiver. We will also have evening events in The Fairmont, along with filking. We have 750 deluxe rooms blocked for ConJosé. Rooms at The Fairmont are \$129 per night single/double, \$149 per night triple/quad.

The San José Hilton & Towers is connected to the San José McEnery Convention Center. We have 210 rooms blocked at the Hilton. Rates are \$129 per night single/double, \$149 per night triple/quad.

The Crowne Plaza is our closest hotel to the Civic Auditorium, where the Masquerade will be held and the Hugo Awards presented. We will be using the Park Center Ballroom in the Crowne Plaza for programming. We have 150 rooms blocked at the Crowne Plaza. Rates are \$119 per night single/double, \$139 per night triple/quad.

The Hyatt Sainte Claire is an historical hotel that originally opened in 1926. The Hyatt Sainte Claire was recently renovated and many of its historical qualities were restored. It is half a block east of the McEnery Convention Center and one block south of The Fairmont. We have 100 rooms blocked in the Hyatt Sainte Claire; we will not have any convention programming there. Rates are \$119 per night single/double, \$134 per night triple, \$149 per night quad.

All rates listed are subject to the City of San José's Occupancy tax, currently 10%.

Reservations

Room reservations can be made by mail, fax, and online beginning February 15, 2002. If you are mailing or faxing your reservation form, please use one form for each room being reserved. Online reservations must be made one room at a time. Reservation confirmations will be sent by mail, fax or email.

Parties and Party Suites

If you want to have a party, you must have a room in The Fairmont. If you want to hold your party in a regular room, make your reservation through the housing bureau and mark the "Party" box on the form.

The Fairmont has several different types of suites available for parties. One-Bedroom Suites offer a luxurious bedroom with a King bed and separate parlor. The parlor and the bedroom are each 450 square feet, for a total of 900 square feet. Two-Bedroom Suites are identical to the One-Bedroom Suite, with a connecting deluxe room with two double beds. The two-room suites are 1350 square feet. One-Bedroom Suites are \$249 per night; Two-Bedroom Suites are \$378 per night. All rates listed are subject to the City of San José's Occupancy tax, currently 10%.
