Visit the Library of Congress, and use books unavailable in your local library. This research library handles books in hundreds of languages, and has Superman comics in its Rare Books collection.

He is illustrating paperback book covers of science fiction authors such as Gordon R. Dickson, Roger Zelazny, and Fred Sabherhagen. He travels the country doing science fiction convention art shows and lives with his wife Carolyn and their three children in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

ALICIA AUSTIN (December '88) has a deep love of fantasy, fairy tales, folklore, and mythology. She is attracted by the spiritual and metaphysical aspects of the mythologies, as well as the joy and fun of the tales, especially those of the animal people in the "before time". She studied art at Sacred Heart Dominican College in Houston. Alicia's work has been published in magazines, books, and covers. 
