ART CREDITS

DAVID LEE ANDERSON (September '89) is a visual futurist who paints cosmic landscapes involving technology and the architecture of utopian societies and the interaction of humanity in space and other worlds. He is illustrating paperback book covers of science fiction authors such as Gordon R. Dickson, Roger Zelazny, and Fred Saberhagen. He travels the country doing science fiction convention art shows and lives with his wife Carolyn and their three children in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

ALICIA AUSTIN (December '88) has a deep love of fantasy, fairy tales, folklore, and mythology. She is attracted by the spiritual and metaphysical aspects of the mythologies, as well as the joy and fun of the tales, especially those of the animal people in the "before time". She studied art at Sacred Heart Dominican College in Houston. Alicia's work has been published in magazines, books, and covers. An anthology of her work was published in *Age of Dreams: The Illustrations of Alicia Austin*. She has been honored with the Hugo Award for Best New Artist, the Balrog Award for Best Professional Publication, and the Howard Award for Best Fantasy Artist. She is currently living in California while augmenting her artistic horizons by working with etchings, acrylics, and Southwestern art.

BOB EGGLETON (September '88) is a full-time artist, much of his work is commercial art. His goal in science fiction art is scientific accuracy. He is also known for his fantasy and horror illustrations. Bob is a graduate of Rhode Island College and currently lives in Rhode Island.

FRANK KELLY FREAS (November '88) has won ten Hugos for his science fiction art work. His covers have appeared on *Astounding*, *Ace*, *DAW*, and *Lancer* books. Anthologies of his work include *Frank Kelly Freas: A Portfolio*, *Frank Kelly Freas: The Art of Science Fiction*, and *Frank Kelly Freas: A Separate Star*. Kelly's creation of Alfred E. Newman may be the best kept secret in fandom. He currently lives in California.

ALEXIS GILLILAND's (July) cartoons have won him four Hugo Awards as Best Fan Artist and have been published in two collections, numerous fanzines, and almost uncountable *Disclave* flyers. He has made the International Cookie Conspiracy famous in east coast fan circles. Following the precept "write what you know", all of the novels and many of the cartoons are imbued with the spirit of bureaucracy, reflecting Alexis's 28 years of working for the Federal Government. In addition to awards for his art work, Alexis received the John W. Campbell Award for Best New Writer in 1982. He lives with his wife Doll in Arlington, Virginia.

BARBI JOHNSON (June) was trained at the University of the Arts (then the School of Industrial Art/Museum School of Art). Her combination of pixel style combined with gruesome reality often haunts her audience. Still waffling between marriage and a career, Barbi is currently trying to get rich by selling vacation plans to support her art habit. She is a native of the Philadelphia area and currently lives in New Cumberland, Pennsylvania.

DON MAITZ (October '89) has done over 150 book covers. His portfolio includes covers for Gene Wolfe's *Book of the New Sun* series, Richard Cowper's *Corlay* series, and many of the *MagicQuest* titles from *Ace* Books. He has won four Hugos, three Howards, and the Society of Illustrators' Silver Metal Award. Rum drinkers may have noticed Don's work on the label for Captain Morgan's Spiced Rum. Don currently lives in Connecticut.

DAVID MATTINGLY (December '89) started to draw and paint at the age of 8. At 24 he became the youngest department head in Walt Disney Studio's history. He supervised the art work for such movies as *The Devil and Max Devlin* and *The Watcher in the Woods*. His first published professional art work was an album cover for "The Commodores' Greatest Hits". He has done numerous covers and currently lives in Hoboken, New Jersey.

RON MILLER (January and November '89) is a graduate of the Columbus (Ohio) College of Art and Design - the alma mater of Kelly Freas. After working for several commercial art studios he became art director of the Albert Einstein Planetarium at the National Air and Space Museum in Washington, D.C. He is the author or co-author and illustrator of *Space Art*, *The Grand Tour*, *Worlds Beyond*, *Astronomy*, *Stars and Planets*, and *Cycles of Fire*. Ron recently finished 37 paintings and more than 50 black and white drawings for a new edition of *20,000 Leagues Under the Sea*. He lives with his wife Judith (a master costumer) and six cats in Fredericksburg, Virginia.

MARK ROGERS (February) is the author and illustrator of two books and an art portfolio including *The Adventures of Samurai Cat* and *More Adventures of Samurai Cat*. *Samurai Cat* is soon to be a movie and a television show. Mark has also written two heroic fantasy novels *Zorachus* and *The Nightmare* for Berkeley Books. He and his wife live in Newark, Delaware.

STEVE STILES (October '88) currently works for Adventure Publications and *Xenozoic Tales* which has received great critical acclaim. His cartoons were first published in 1963 in *The Realist*. He was the TransAtlantic Fan Fund (TAFF) winner and Fan Art Hugo Nominee in 1968. He worked for Marvel Comics British Department for five years doing covers, posters, and interior art. BOB WALTERS (August) began his career as a medical and scientific illustrator and is best known for his dinosaurs. His work was shown in the "Visions of Other Worlds" exhibit at the Boston Museum of Science in 1984. He has been Guest of Honor at many conventions and has amused and intrigued audiences. He currently lives in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

DAWN WILSON (front cover) is an artist whose work reflects a personal vision and philosophy expressed in truly distinctive style. Her unusual and individual sense of color combined with thoughtfully developed subjects mark all her work. Her paintings' beauty and power have earned her many awards from both professionals and fans. She is best known for her pieces "Winter's King", "Secret Journey", "Queen of the Snows", and "The Bright Lands".

ROBIN WOOD (May) is best known for her fantasy art. Her rendition of the Tarot Deck brought a new beauty and richness to the field. Her artwork reflects a "worldly-wise Innocence" combining simplicity and intricate detail. Robin, a transplanted Washingtonian, plays the harp and currently lives in Cranbury, New Jersey.

JANNY WURTS is the author of five novels, one in collaboration with Ray Feist, and more yet to come under contract. Janny's *Cycle of Fire* trilogy is currently in production. She does the paintings for her own covers as well as working as a freelance illustrator for New York publishers. She lives in Plainville, Connecticut.
