
Room rates for Chicon V will be \$70 per night single/double, \$90 triple and \$110 quad. Reservation forms will be sent to you when you join.

We're Baa-ack

This Progress Report is not as lengthy as our first two, in spite of being six weeks late. A distressing number of misfortunes has struck members of MagiCon's committee over the past six months, forcing us to adjust publication schedules. We've elected in this issue only to update you on our progress and answer some of the most commonly heard questions, and to refrain from printing less time-sensitive feature articles. By the time you're reading this, work will already be in full swing on P.R. #4, which will be in your hands before you leave for the 1991 Worldcon in Chicago.

I'm pleased (and relieved... and rather proud) to say that our preparations for MagiCon have continued in spite of illness, accidents, unemployment, the war, and other such adversities that have befallen the concom. In the past few months I've perceived a change in the way I view our orchestrations. Major exhibits and events, both those traditional to Worldcons and those unique to MagiCon, have crossed over from the realm of pipe dreams and brainstorming to the objective world of space allocation and budgeting. Appropriately, we have gone from "We will do it" to "This is how it will be done."

Committee and staff recruitment continues at an astounding rate, as it must considering the number of volunteers required for a five-day convention likely to exceed 6,000 attendees. I especially would like to welcome Theresa Renner as Division Head of the Services Division, Jayne Rogers as Office Manager, Don Eastlake III, who is our liaison with the Orange County Convention Center, and Bruce Pelz, who will preside at the WSFS Business Meeting in 1992.

While Programming, Events and Exhibits labor on the practicalities of creating the fascinating and exciting, Administration and Treasury have continued working to keep excitement out of those Divisions. Our humble office is at last equipped with photocopier, computer, laser printer and modem, and there are reports that the in-basket underneath the "To Be Filed" pile is sometimes briefly sighted. We've recently acquired a larger Post Office Box (this will not affect our address) and a small outside storage rental. At this writing, however, we are still unsuccessful in stopping the leak in the office ceiling.

With the office fully furnished, I've been moving my personal MagiCon files from my home. A couple days ago I unearthed a copy of a letter I had written on November 29, 1985 to the Orlando Convention Bureau. It begins "I am collecting research to support the possibility of bringing the World Science Fiction Convention to Greater Orlando in 1992."

MagiCon Dealers' Room Update

The following is a brief outline of the Dealer Progress Report sent out in late March to those who wrote **MagiCon** asking for information or to be placed on the waiting list:

Table reservations are now being accepted for the MagiCon Dealers' Room. The required deposit is \$50.00 per 8-foot by 2- 1/2-foot table. The limit is three tables per dealer (or any team or 3.0 up considered to be the same business or acting in concert.) Dealers may request additional tables by submitting a brief explanation of why the additional space is needed. If additional tables are available as of May 1st, these requests will be carefully considered.

MagiCon anticipates having 250-300 8-foot tables in the Orlando Convention Center. Depending upon the terms of the Convention Center Contract, we anticipate the cost of each of the first three tables at \$125.00 and any approved additional tables at \$175.00 each.

Additional charges for electrical outlets, etc. will be released at a later date.

All reservations are accepted with the understanding that the dealer in question will conform to all rules and restrictions set by the Dealer Room management. Table reservations are not transferable. Refunds may be obtained on request until February 1, 1992. After that date, refunds will be available only if the tables are resold.



Please note that all special discounts for site selection voters and **MagiCon** presupporters have expired.

Attending Membership: In addition to attending MagiCon, members in this category may nominate and vote for the 1992 Hugo Awards and, upon payment of the voting fee, cast a ballot in Site Selection for the 1995 World Science Fiction Convention. Attending members will receive an astonishing array of publications, including our Progress Reports and Program Book.

Supporting Membership: Supporting members have all of the rights and privileges of an attending member with one notable exception: supporting members won't be able to attend MagiCon. Supporting members may become attending members by paying the current attending member rate less the amount paid for the supporting membership.

Children at MagiCon: Children are welcome to buy attending or supporting memberships on the same terms as adults. Alternatively, Child's Memberships are available for children born after September 3, 1980 (under age 12 when the convention begins). A Child Member may attend Children's Programming and use MagiCon's babysitting services but has no voting rights and will not receive publications.

Babysitting (child care, if you prefer) will be provided for both attending members under age 12 and Child Members on the best terms that **MagiCon** is able to negotiate or subsidize. This service will almost certainly

not be free, but it will be professionally managed and reasonably priced.

Children born after September 3, 1986 (under age six when the convention begins) may be registered at no charge as Kids-in-Tow. Kids-in-Tow must be accompanied by a parent or guardian throughout the convention. They may not be left unsupervised at any event (including Children's Programming). Needless to say, they don't get publications or voting rights. Babysitting for Kids-in-Tow will be offered only on a "space available" basis at a fee sufficient to cover the full cost of the service.




Facilities

Ben Yalow, Facilities Division

MagiCon is using the Orange County Convention and Civic Center and the Peabody Hotel as its primary facilities. The large exhibits, events, and some program items will be in the Convention Center, and other programs will be in the Hotel.

We have over 800 sleeping rooms blocked in the Peabody, which is located across the street from the Convention Center, at a flat rate of \$98. A total of over 2000 rooms are currently reserved for MagiCon, including the Clarion Plaza adjacent to the Center property, the Quality Inn Plaza next to it, and the nearby Gold Star Inn International. Rates at the Clarion will be \$69 - \$85, \$33 -\$37 at the QI, and starting at \$48 at the Gold Star. All hotels have agreed to extend these rates at least one week before and after the convention.

We are still working on arrangements for making reservations at our hotels. All room bookings will be handled by the Convention Housing Bureau. A hotel card, along with information about all of our hotels, will be in a future progress report. Until that time, please do not contact the hotels or Bureau, since they are not ready to take reservations.


