Convention Facilities Update

Although Noreascon Three is over two years away, we have been continuing to work on securing the best facilities available in Boston.

Function Space

We have extended our reservation at the new John B. Hynes Veterans Convention Center to include all three floors. This gives us up to 156,000 sq. ft. of exhibition space in four exhibit halls plus a 5,000 seat auditorium, 24,000 sq. ft. ballroom, and 41 other meeting rooms not to mention the 145,000 sq. ft. of pre-function space and a 30,000 sq. ft. area dedicated to registration. In addition, the directly connected Sheraton-Boston hotel has major function space and the Back Bay Hilton, just across the street, has yet more function space.

These copious facilities guarantee that we will be able to concentrate all of the convention functions in one area and probably all under one air conditioned roof, even if Noreascon Three turns out to be bigger than we anticipate. You will never have to take a shuttle bus to get from one program item to another and probably will not have to set foot outside.

The renovation of the Hynes is proceeding on schedule and the new Hynes Convention Center expects to open in January 1988. The Hynes is going for *continued on page 7*

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Membership Information

Memberships

Noreascon Three has two types of memberships: Attending and Supporting. Both include voting privileges on the Hugo Awards and on site selection for the 1992 Worldcon. Members registered before the convention will receive copies of all our major publications. This includes all magazine-style progress reports, all newsletter progress reports published after the time you join, the Program Book, and any post-con publications. An Attending Membership also gives you the right to attend the convention and the World Science Fiction Society business meeting.

Conversions

A Supporting Membership may be converted to an Attending Membership at any time by paying the difference between the Supporting price (\$20) and the Attending Membership rate at the time you convert. If you plan on attending Noreascon Three and currently have

only a Supporting Membership, you should consider converting at this time, since the rates will only increase.

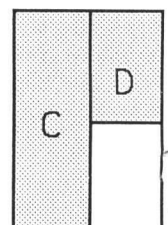
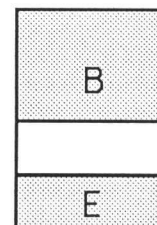
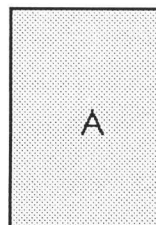

Membership

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sitting, for a fee which will be enough to cover what we have to pay the babysitters. However, they may not attend any convention activities alone and may not participate in Children's Programming.

Children can, of course, buy full Attending Memberships. This gives them the same rights as any other member. They can vote for the Hugos and future Worldcons and will receive all publications. They can attend any event (including Children's Programming) on their own. In addition, they can use babysitting with no additional charge.

The third option is to buy a Children's Admission, which may be purchased only in conjunction with someone else's Attending Membership. Currently, Children's Admissions cost \$20 less than full Attending Memberships. Children's Admissions entitle children (under 12 at the convention) to take part in any at-con activity on their own and to use babysitting for free. The difference from Attending Memberships is that the children do not receive any publications (including the Program Book), nor do they have the right to vote on the Hugos, or site selection. (Note that since they will not be able to vote on the 1992 site selection, they will not be eligible for any special voter rate.)

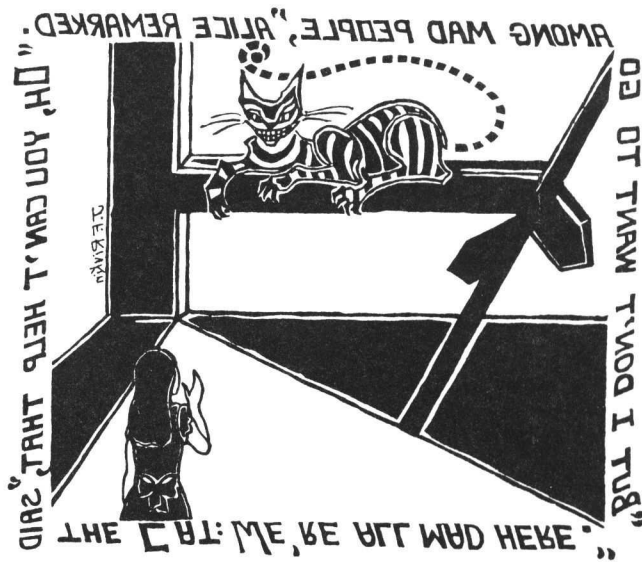
A Children's Admission may be converted to an Attending Membership at any time, by paying the difference between the price originally paid for it and the current Attending rate.

What details should be in our hotel agreements?

So, what else have we been doing? After all, we are the first ones with three years to get the convention organized. Here are a few things.

1. Publishing *The Mad Three Party*, where you can see various weird ideas discussed, like the right night(s) for the Masquerade, whether we should supply furniture to hucksters or let them bring their own, whether the art show should have a "juried" portion with better displays and lighting, and other topics which might involve major change. Given the extra time, we might as well use it to check out new ideas, and *TM3P* is our main forum for that.

2. Talking about convention structure and who should do what. You'll be seeing more people assigned to more jobs soon, in the next progress report or over the fannish grapevine.

3. Developing first-cut budgets for various areas, to get some idea of how we stand financially. These also require us to put down on paper some ideas of how those areas would work, and give people the chance to take potshots at them.

4. Watching the new Hynes Auditorium get built. It looks like it's near schedule.

5. Updating your address, which is a major reason for mailing progress reports every six months.

6. Buying stuff: a copier, a Mac, a PC; so we could keep data on you and prepare progress reports.

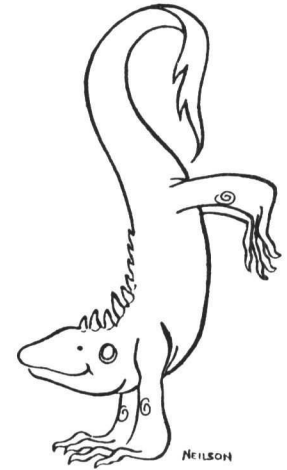
7. Collecting data on how many people do what at conventions, especially at the last Boskone.

8. Making little lists of things people want to see or do at the Worldcon. Don't worry, you'll be remembered.

9. Going to conventions, with an interest in what they do differently than we have in the past.

10. Debating various long-running issues like banquets, media programs, the role of the general press, the right way to do GoH speeches, etc., etc., and so on (Oh, I almost forgot: and fiscal responsibility).

So we've been busy, but we haven't made a lot of decisions yet. That means you still have time to give us your advice, and we wish you would. We are always looking for your input. Remember, this is *your* convention.

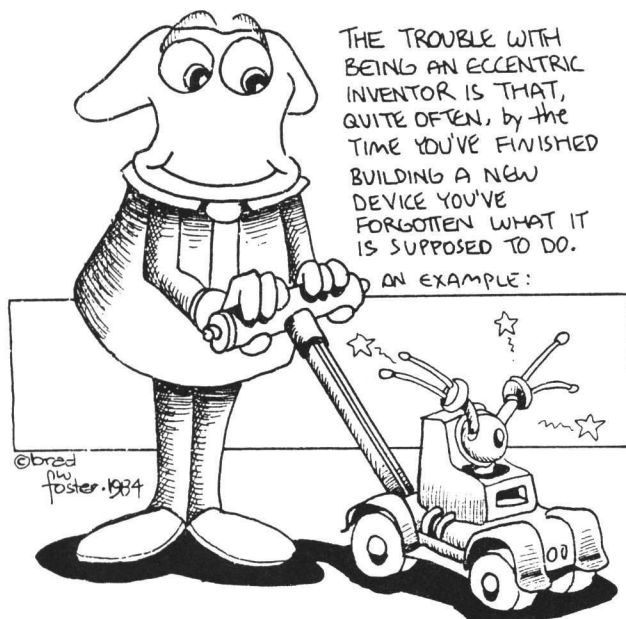

General Information

How We Are Handling Requests for Information

Noreascon Three is the first Worldcon with three years between selection and the convention. We will be appointing our major division and area heads through the end of 1987. It will be longer than that (remember, 1989 still two years away) before we set rates for Hucksters' Room, Art Show, etc.; or decide how many tables, how many panels, etc., we'll have. Things will still be in place in plenty of time—in many cases, with more lead time than Worldcons have had in the past.

However, fans are already writing to us, asking for details, volunteering, etc. Please, wait until early 1988 before writing for information.

What happens if you do write? We'll file your request, and when we have information, we'll send it to you. This may take a long time. If you move, be sure to send us a change of address or we may lose track of you.

Volunteers

We're handling volunteers similarly. When we choose our division and area heads, they will select people to work in their areas. Until then, we appreciate your volunteering. Your letter will be kept on file until the appropriate people are appointed.

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whole new look, similar in many areas to that of a five star hotel. Some interior areas will be marbled and have wall-to-wall carpeting and there will be a large glass foyer. All-in-all a great improvement on the bare concrete look of the old Hynes.

Program Allocation

It is too early for detailed planning of exact program item schedules and locations. However, we plan to have registration and most of our program in the Hynes along with the Art Show, Hucksters' Room, and exhibits. The auditorium in the Hynes is the planned location for opening and closing ceremonies, Hugo Award ceremonies, Guest of Honor events, and the Masquerade.

Hotel Rooms

We have also been securing an ample supply of sleeping rooms in the vicinity of the Hynes. At the present time we have commitments, of one sort or another, for over 3,000 rooms at nearby hotels, including the Sheraton-Boston, Back Bay Hilton, Lafayette Swissôtel, and others.

There has been a misunderstanding between Noreascon and the Sheraton-Boston due to a problem the Sheraton had with a local convention. We are meeting

and discussing this with the Sheraton and are confident that the misunderstanding will be resolved. It is likely that in the Sheraton and other hotels there will be a strict separation of party areas and non-party areas.

Reservations

We do not expect to have room rates set until sometime around Labor Day weekend, 1988. We will be sending out hotel reservation forms in late 1988 or early 1989. Because of the number of hotels involved, these reservations will have to go through a central organization to be allocated to hotels. We will do the best we can to put groups that want to be together in the same hotel and we guarantee that a prompt acknowledgement will be sent out as soon as a reservation form is received.

This sort of arrangement was used very successfully by Noreascon II in 1980 which had six hotels and used the Greater Boston Convention and Tourist Bureau as the central organization. Please do not try to reserve directly with any of the hotels at this time.

Summary

We have secured sufficient facilities for a successful Noreascon Three and we are continuing to work to improve the facilities we have by, for example, increasing our sleeping room commitments at the hotels which are most convenient to the Hynes. If you are interested in more details of this or other aspects of planning for Noreascon Three, we suggest that you subscribe to *The Mad 3 Party* as advertised elsewhere in this Progress Report.

Joe founded Tropicon (and has chaired most of them) and was one of the founders (and named) SMOFcon. Joe has a great deal of interest in fanish history and is the author of a comprehensive article in THE SCIENCE FICTION REFERENCE BOOK on SF Fandom. Joe has published a number of his own fanzines as well as a two volume collection of Lee Hoffman's fanzine, "The Complete Quandry" and other fanhistorical publications. Joe has his own research and publications firm.

Becky Thomson, of Orlando, has worked in over twenty conventions since 1976 when she was Chairman of Operations for that year's Norwescon. She was a programming department head for Chicon IV ('82) and an assistant shift manager for Constellation ('83). In 1986 she worked for the hotel liaison committee of Confederation.

Outside of conventions and fandom Becky received her BA in 1977, worked as executive assistant for a large political organization in Seattle and currently holds a similar position in a major Orlando real-estate firm. Becky holds the honor of being the founder of the **MagiCon** Bid, an idea which she claims came to her while showering. Must be something in Florida water that inspires magic.

Tom Veal, of Alexandria, Virginia, served as chairman of Windycon X ('83) and hotel liaison for Windycon VIII and IX as well as Chicon IV ('82). From 1981 to 1984 he served as General Counsel for Chicon IV, Inc. and from 1982 to 1984 was Director and General Counsel for ISFiC, the parent organization of Windycon.

On a more mundane note, Tom received a B.A. from Yale in 1969 (he is a co-founder of the Yale Science Fiction Society) and graduated from the University of Illinois, College of Law in 1974. He has expressed a desire to be the first pension lawyer in the Alpha Centauri system.
