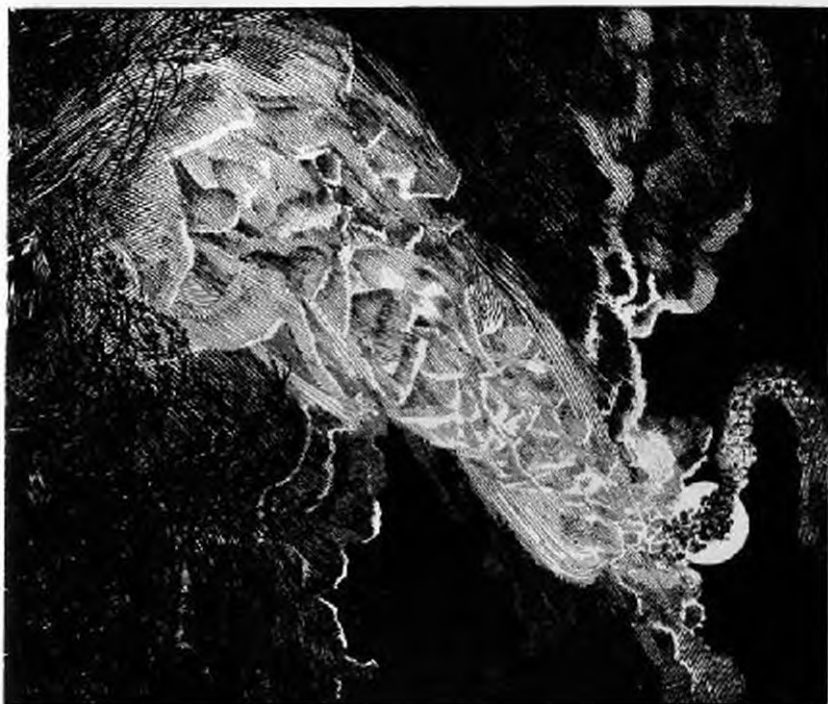

ALFRED E. VAN VOGT, the Pacificon's Guest of Honor, is a Canadian born author whose stories have captured the imagination of the English reading science fiction and fantasy public.

Beginning with "Black Destroyer" in the July 1939 Astounding Science-Fiction, his rise to popularity was rapid, and September 1940 saw the start of his 4-part, 70,000 word serial, SLAN. This engrossing novel of "the man after man" was quickly acclaimed a classic.

"Coöperate or Else", "Asylum", "Weapon Shop", "Weapon Makers", "Far Centaurus", "The Changeling" and a score of others followed, and last year he produced the 90,000 word novel, "World of A" --the year's most controversial story.

His complete works total approximately 700,000 words.

Arkham House is soon to release his "Slan" in book form, while Pegasus Publications has his "Weapon Makers" and others scheduled for hard covers.

EDNA MAYNE HULL, wife of A.E. van Vogt and our Co-Guest of Honor, has collaborated with her husband on no less than 10 tales, all of which have seen print in either Astounding Science-Fiction or Unknown Worlds.

"The Flight that failed" marked the initial appearance of E. Mayne Hull in Astounding, December, 1942. Her first was followed by "Abdication", "Competition", "The Debt", "The Contract" and--her greatest success to date--"The Winged Man", the 2-part future conflict drama which appeared in the May and June 1944 numbers of Astounding.

In Unknown Worlds E. Mayne Hull has contributed "The Ultimate Wish", "The Wishes We Make" and "The Patient".

It is a little known fact that, besides writing, Mrs van Vogt is a ceramics artist whose clay figurines are sought after by particular customers throught the entire State of California.

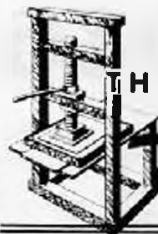
