Dear Mr. Yalow,

The Reno-Tahoe community is excited about the opportunity of acting as host city for the 2011 WorldCon. We look forward to welcoming your attendees and know you will find our city both accommodating and a destination that exceeds expectations!

I believe you have received the contract from the Reno-Sparks Convention Center and are currently reviewing the information. This letter is to confirm several points which we have discussed and I understand you would like in writing.

- 1 The WorldCon committee would like to build a computer network on-site without restriction.
  - a. The only restriction is telecommunications and data connections to the outside world use an exclusive in-house provider.
  - b. Power will be provided through your decorator.
  - c. There are no labor restrictions, as long as the doors are open according to your contract, you have access to design your computer network as needed for your event
  - d. Supercomputing designed and developed their own system, if you need a reference we can provide
- 2 Worldcon would like to bring in audio visual equipment rather than rent
  - a. Audio Visual equipment and staff are available at the convention center; however, they are not an exclusive contract. Customers are welcome to bring in own equipment. Applicable patch fees provided by the building will be charged.
  - b. Electrical is coordinated and paid for through decorator

We look forward to the membership vote next August and hope that Reno-Tahoe is selected as the perfect destination for 2011!
