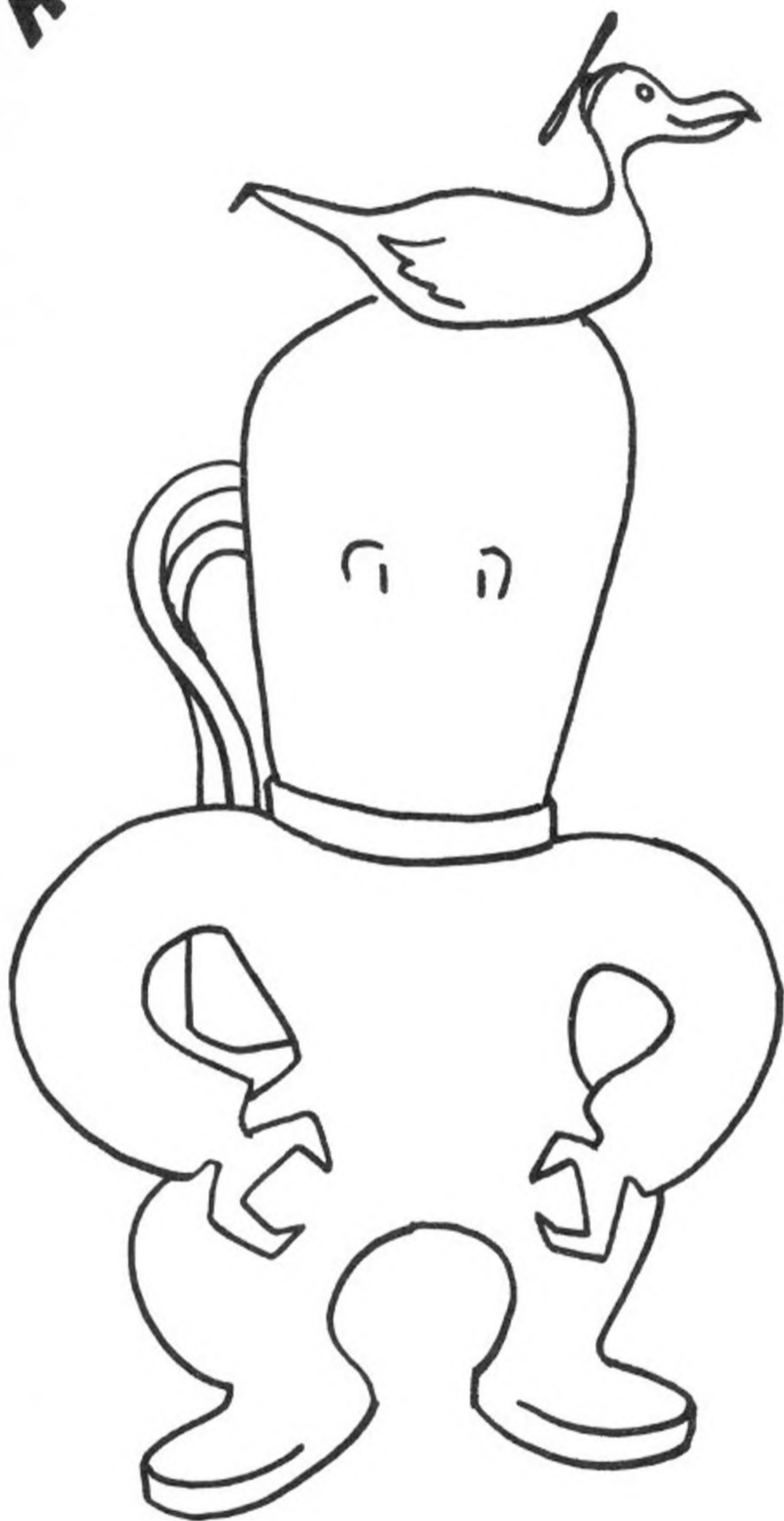

You've attended many science-fiction conventions, both Worldcons and regionals, over the years? They're great, you say, and you expect to enjoy these science-fiction gatherings in future as well as you have in the past -- but you don't see how any s-f convention could hold any surprises for you?

Good friend, we are honored to announce that You've Only Just Begun to Live! The SeaCon, Seattle's 1961 world convention, will be a new and unique experience for even the most case-hardened convention-going science-fiction fan!

SeaCon's Guest of Honor will be Robert A. Heinlein, whose Hugo-Award-winning novel "Starship Trooper" is the latest of a succession of s-f tales that began way back in 1939 and includes many of the all-time top favorites in any fan's collection. Mr. Heinlein will address the SeaCon banquet meeting on Sunday, September 3rd, at the approximate midpoint of the convention.

John W. Campbell, Jr., will cheerfully try conclusions with a selected group of panelists at one of the major program sessions. This panel will be chosen for durability as well as for overall knowledge of the subject under discussion.

The SeaCon Committee has arranged for a really fabulous site for the 19th s-f worldcon. HYATT HOUSE, a "fly-in hotel" newly constructed and opened in 1960, offers advantages and attractions never before available at a convention-site hotel:

All rooms soundproof and air-conditioned, with free radio and TV.

All rooms are large, with bath, and available for multiple occupancy.

Unlimited free parking -- no garage fees or garage-tipping.

Free transportation to and from the Seattle-Tacoma International Airport.

Coffee Shop open 24 hours a day, every day (serving good snacks-&-meals).

Closed-circuit television from the main Convention Hall to the other convention rooms and to your own rooms, if required.

Outdoor heated swimming pool -- in the central courtyard patio.

Hyatt House is laid out in a hollow square of two-story wings; this also makes it easy to book the Convention in a solid block of rooms.
