Finnish trains to strike Monday & Tuesday

Workers for VR, the Finnish national railway company, will strike starting on Monday 18.00 for 24 hours in response to Finnish Government plans to privatize the state-owned railway system. VR will not be operating a replacement bus service. Please respect the strike and if you need to travel to Helsinki-Vantaa Airport

on Monday evening or Tuesday, use one of the Helsinki public buses or a taxi. HSL-operated Helsinki public transportation, including Metro, trams & buses, will not be affected by the strike.

WSFS BUSINESS MEETING REPORT

The WSFS meeting created a Hugo Awards Study Committee intended to begin studying all of the various proposals for changing Hugo Award categories, with a remit to report to next year's Worldcon. A new constitutional amendment regarding electronic payments failed. The resolution extending the Hugo Award eligibility of "Your Name" passed, as did a resolution making recommendations regarding the provision of convention publications to members. Debate time limits were established for the constitutional amendments pending ratification and new constitutional amendments, except the one killed and the three category revisions referred to committee.

A standing rule change speeding up the process of setting debate time limits passed. A standing rule change regarding distribution of meeting agendas failed.

The agenda is available online at http://www.worldcon.fi/wp-content/uploads/2017/08/agenda_2017.pdf and the first constitutional amendment up for consideration on Friday is item C1 (Best Series). Before that will be the elections to the WSFS Mark Protection Committee, a report dealing with one of the rule changes referred from yesterday, and a report from the Hugo Award Study Committee regarding their initial plans and organization.

After the gig I'm glad I went. Yes, it was a joy to see Diggs rap at break-neck pace, flawlessly.

But it was an experience otherwise as well. It felt like continuous experimentation and change, from the black-and-white backdrop based on white noise and pixels to the sonic wall based on noise, industrial, and power electronics. WHY “PAINOPISTE?”

“Painopiste,” a compound word of paino “weight” and piste “point,” is a term with multiple meanings in the Finnish language. Most often, and aptly for a newsletter, it means “printing press.” (To be sure, we use laser printers now – although sometimes I wonder if a manual press might be faster!)

The second meaning is a pun, because we're fans so of course it would be a pun. Our venue for Worldcon 75 is Messukeskus, which is usually translated as “fairground.” Messukeskus though is another of the Finnish language's beautiful compounds: messu “mass” as in a religious ceremony, keskus “centre.” Thus, “centre of mass” – the proper physics term for “centre of mass” being, in Finnish, Painopiste.

But a third layer underlies these two. This Worldcon, with over six

WSFS BUSINESS MEETING REPORT

The Saturday WSFS Business Meeting ratified the proposed Best Series Hugo Award category, which is now a permanent category effective with the 2018 Worldcon. Proposals to add an intermediate voting round to the Hugo Awards process for the purpose of down-voting nominees failed, as did a proposed change to the mechanism of the “EPH” system first used this year. The meeting also rejected attempts to suspend EPH for one year and to suspend the current “5 & 6” nominating system.

There will be a WSFS Business Meeting on Sunday, starting at 10:00 in Room 208. Remaining items of business are: Two changes to how the Retrospective Hugo Awards work; a proposal to prohibit Worldcons from selling an all-convention pass that does not include WSFS voting rights to adult members; a proposal requiring Worldcons to honor membership prices quoted in multiple currencies in those currencies; a change to the

“gray zone” between the Novel and Novella Hugo Award categories; and two technical amendments regarding WSFS service marks and the precise wording of the Nominee Diversity amendment that took effect this year.

The WSFS Mark Protection Committee will meet in Room 208 approximately 15 minutes after the final adjournment of the Sunday Business Meeting to elect officers for the coming year.

N. K. Jemisin wins Best Novel award

Nora K. Jemisin becomes a second-time Hugo Award winner as her book, *The Obelisk Gate*, is awarded the prize for Best Novel. Jemisin's triumph follows her 2016 win for best novel for *The Fifth Season*.

Women and authors of color were strongly represented among the award winners, with women receiving the Hugo in sixteen of the competition's eighteen categories. While Chinese author Liu Cixin's loss for

international character of the 2017 Hugos, noting that while Helsinki's is only the fourth ceremony held outside a non-English-speaking country, sixty countries were represented among the audience and WSFS membership.

Jemisin remains the only black woman author to have ever won

the Best Novel Hugo. Jemisin has been a prominent opponent of the "homogenizing ghetto" of relegation to the "African American Fiction" category, writing in 2010:

"The worst racism is perpetuated not through intent, but through

“thoughtless, unquestioning adherence to old, bad habits. We always need to ask ourselves where those habits come from, and whether it’s a good idea to keep perpetuating them. We need to ask whether they hurt more than they help.[...] Booksellers and librarians: please don’t put anything I write in the AAF section. Not unless you want to hurt my career. And not unless you want to make it harder, not easier, for black readers to find good, diverse, inclusive stuff in the long run”

Jemisin also came in 2nd place in the Short Story competition for “The City Born Great,” losing to “Seasons of Glass of Iron” by Amal El-Mohtar

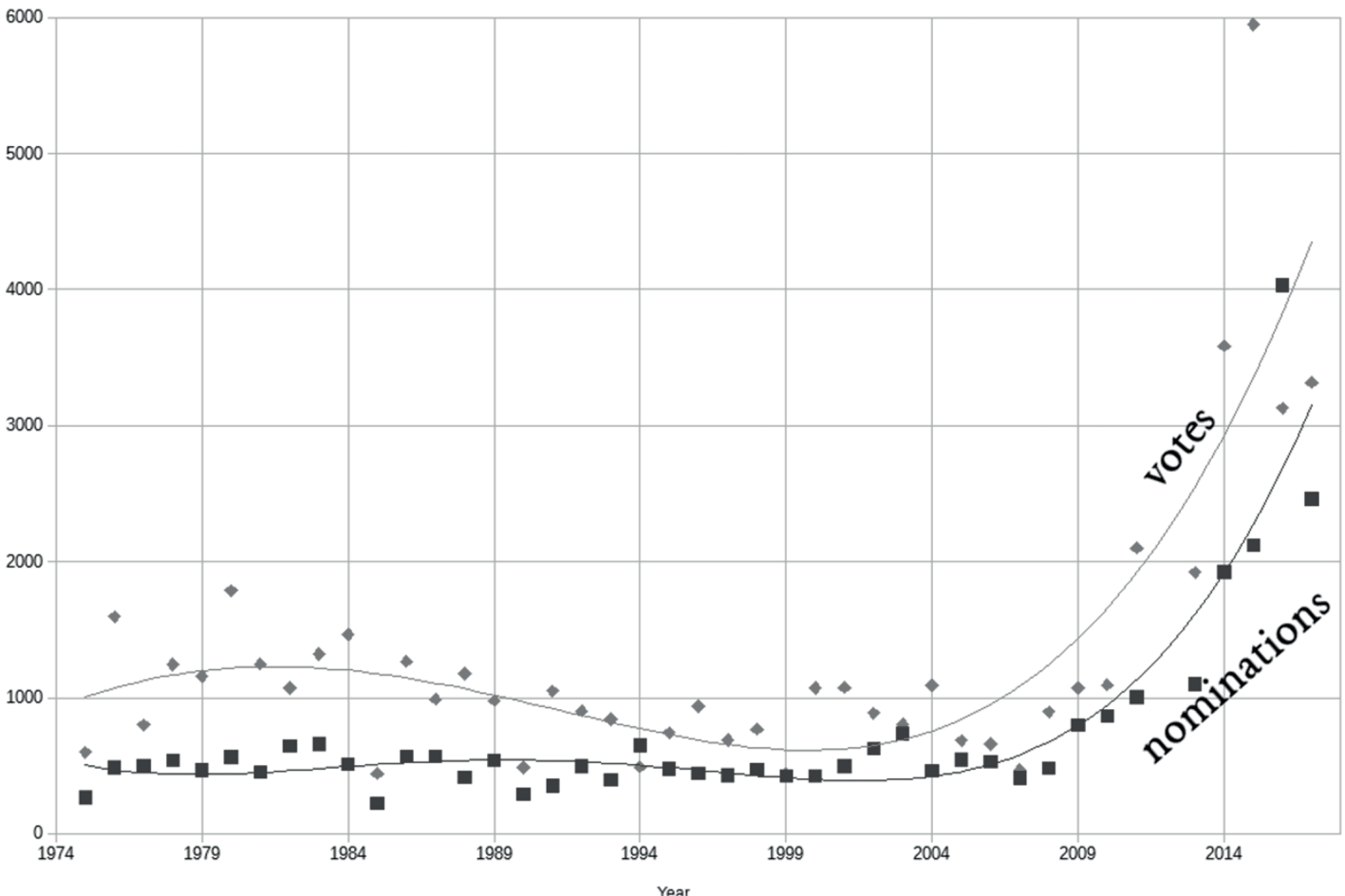
HUGOS RECOGNISED AS LONGEST CONTINUALLY-RUNNING GENRE AWARDS

The Guinness Book of World Records announced on Friday that the Hugo Awards have been recognized as the longest-running science fiction awards. The Hugos were inaugurated at Philcon II in 1953, and have been awarded in every year since 1955.

THE HUGOS: A GROWING TRADITION

With 2464 nominations and 3319 votes cast, the 2017 Hugos saw the third-highest number of votes cast ever. The Hugo Awards have been growing exponentially since their inception, with records showing growth for the past decade.
