#### SECURITY STATEMENT

The Justice Department will be responsible for implimenting security measures during the convention weekend, including Thursday 20th October and Tuesday 25th October.

Their two most important duties will be:

- ensuring that attendees wear a badge visibly in any area of the convention.
- enforcing the convention weapons policy.

ALL bladed weapons must be peace bonded. Replicas and water pistols may not be loaded at any time. Weapons should not be pointed at anyone. Breaches of policy will result in your license being revoked and your toys confiscated. The Judge's decision, as to weapon classification and imposing a fine, is final!

In both these circumstances, the Judge's decision will be fully supported by the committee. ANY convention attendee who does not adhere to either of these policies or persistantly challenges them, risks being expelled.

These security measures have been drawn up for the benefit of all parties involved, including con attendees. The committee cannot be held responsible for the loss/damage of personal items such as handbags, wallets, etc., but access to temporarily store valuable belongings in the convention's secure store, will be provided. All money raised from Weapon Permit applications and fines will be donated to the convention charities: RNIB SPEAKING BOOKS FOR THE BLIND and THE SCOTTISH CHILDREN'S HOSPICE APPEAL (CHAS).




# THE ULTIMATE SPACE & FANTASY LIVE COMBAT GAME.

Add to this, "ALL BLOODY NIGHT!" - a vampire movie fest to keep you awake until dawn.



# SPECIAL MESSAGE FOR DEALERS

This is a reminder for those of you who have booked tables for the convention. Outstanding memberships either for yourself and/or helper(s), must be paid BEFORE the convention itself. This new policy is for security purposes, to avoid anyone trying to enter the room illegally. The allocation of tables will be on a first come, first served basis and whilst every attempt will be made to provide for all requests, prompt payment is the way to guarantee your booking and should be made no later than 7th October 1994. The committee is currently negotiating with the hotel to produce a permit, which will be used for parking access in Hope Street for off loading purposes. If this is approved, these permits will be issued within two weeks prior to the con.

# HOW TO GET TO THE CONVENTION BY CAR, TRAIN, BUS AND OTHER FORMS OF TRANSPORT


No matter where you live, or how you are travelling, getting to the convention is fairly easy, honest! Problems could arise if you are using levitation spells, mutant powers, dimensional gates or space faring craft! For the latter, please use the global map before referring to the detailed map.

FROM SPACE: head for the planetary system of the star known as Sol and establish a high orbit above the third planet (refer to the VOYAGER diagram if you possess a copy). Take all counter measures against detection—military types here tend to be trigger happy—and beware of artificial satellites, functional or derelict! ALBACON is taking place in Glasgow, which is situated on the west coast of Scotland, part of the island group known as GREAT BRITAIN.



BY PLANE: there is a direct bus service from Glasgow Airport to Buchanan Street Coach Station but, if you ask him nicely, the driver may let you off in Hope Street, literally on the hotel's doorstep. A black hackney cab could cost anything from £10 so unless you have a big budget to spend, take the bus! There are a number of car hire companies in the terminal building, again for bods with loadsamoney!

BY TRAIN: trains from the South terminate at Central Station and there is a hotel entrance directly off the concourse. Trains from the North, terminate at Queen Street Station and there is a bus service between the stations, although it would be just as quick to walk. The hotel is appoximately 10mins away. Local services (low level) from the East and West coasts, arrive at either/or Queen Street or Central Station. The Glasgow Underground, fondly known as "The Clockwork Orange", is simple and easy to use and can take visitors to a wide range of city sights including the Hunterian Museum at Glasgow University; Kelvingrove Art Galleries & Museum and the Transport Museum.



BY CAR (from Glasgow North and England): take the Clydebank & SECC exit at Junction 19 and turn left at the first lights into Argyle Street. Turn right at the 3rd traffic lights then 1st left and again 1st left, into Oswald Street. The NCP car park will be on your right. Take the next turning right for the entrance to the car park. The hotel is negotiating a cheap weekend rate for residents and there is a pedestrian access into the station concourse on the 5th level.

BY CAR (from Glasgow South and the airport): take the City Centre exit and take 4th right into Wellington Street. Go straight down towards the river, turning left into Broomielaw. Take first left into Oswald Street then the next left, to the entrance of the NCP car park.
