

### INTRODUCTION

This is the first Progress Report for Albacon 80, the 31st UK national Easter Science-Fiction Convention. Albacon will be held in Glasgow's Albany Hotel over 4-7 April 1980.

Albacon has come to Glasgow because at the 1979 Eastercon (Easter and Convention go together to make Eastercon) in Leeds the Members voted that the next UK Convention should be in Scotland. The Committee for Albacon have already run two popular regional Conventions, Faircon 78 & Faircon 79.

The Eastercon is traditionally an event suitable for both a complete newcomer to the world of Fandom and for someone more used to the general proceedings. These include talks, films, panel discussions, quizzes, a banquet, and much else besides. There are also permanent events, such as the Art Show, Bookdealer's Room, Fan Room, and so on. The formal Programme starts at about ten o'clock each day, and finishes after midnight. The more informal aspects of the Convention tend to run right through the night:

## MEMBERSHIP

By September 3rd we had 245 Members. Membership application forms are either enclosed with this PR if you're not already signed up (or are merely Pre-Supporting) or are available from our Membership Secretary at the address above.

Three types of Membership exist: FULL, SUPPORTING, and PRE-SUPPORTING.

If you wish to attend Albacon you must be a FULL Member. You may, however, become a SUPPORTING Member and convert to FULL when you arrive. Should you do this, then your final Membership rate is pegged to the rate in operation when you became a SUPPORTING Member. PRE-SUPPORTING Members do not have the final rate fixed, but may reduce the sum required to attend by £1.00.

Current Membership rates are: FULL: £5.00

SUPPORTING: £2.00 (plus balance at door)

These rates WILL RISE AS OF DECEMBER 1st 1979.

#### PROGRAMME

We will run two distinct Programmes. The Main Programme takes place in the Main Convention Hall, and is to feature major talks, films, and panel discussions. An Alternative Programme will also take place during the Convention, and will have films, TV material (such as Star Trek on film, courtesy of the STAR TREK Action Group (STAG)) minority interest talks, and whatever else we find to put on.

A full list of our Film Programme will appear in PR2 in November.

Anyone willing to take part in the Programme is asked to contact Bob Shaw.

Albacon has grown by one day. Originally we had assumed that there would be little demand for any Programme on the Monday, but after various folk said they'd be about on the morning, and others stated that they'd be about in the afternoon and evening, the Committee has decided to extend the run of Albacon. This means that we will now start at mid-day on Friday 4th April (Good Friday) and finish on Monday 7th April (Easter Monday). In addition, The Friends of Kilgore Trout will move to the

The services of the Science-Fiction Foundation have been offered to us by Maleolm Edwards who proposes to aid us in Programme matters. The real Bob Shaw has kindly agreed to deliver a serious and scientific discourse during the Convention.

# GENERAL INFORMATION

Albacon is currently examining the possibility of closed-circuit TV coverage of all events. Representations have been made to various video contractors, and it now seems certain that we will be able to show all Main Convention Hall events on the fourth channel of the Hotel's piped TV system. To date it seems feasible to use two TV cameras, and to show film as well as live material throughout the Albany. Due to price and other constraints we are limited to black & white equipment.

Should anyone be interested in offering advice and/or assistance then please contact Bob Shaw. Consideration is being given to the possibility of taping certain items, and advice and aid is again solicited on this point.

A full guide to local eating establishments will be available at Albacon. The Hotel is conveniently situated to a number of take-away shops, and a short distance away from a large number of Chinese/Indian/etc establishments. A buffett snack service has been arranged with the Eotel for the period of the Convention, and Bar Lunches are available at moderate prices. The Hotel boasts The Carvery, where you may eat an unlimited amount for a flat price.

Each badge costs 25p, plus 15p P&P with each order. All cheques, POs etc should be payable to Albacon. All funds raised go to general use for Albacon.


