#### INTRODUCTION

This is the second Progress Report for Albacon, the 31st UK national Science-Fiction Convention. It will be held in the Albany Hotel, Glasgow over the Easter weekend 1980 (April 4-7).

Albacon is run by a group of enthusiastic Glaswegian fans, and we welcome aid and advice from any source. If you think that you can contribute to the weekend in any way then please contact Bob Shaw at 2/L 244 West Princes Street, Kelvinbridge Glasgow G4 9DP or phone him on (O41) 334 6874.

Albacon welcomes SF fans of all types; we hope to offer something for everyone, from the most jaded trufan to the first-time attendee!

### THE PROGRAMME

Albacon has always been seen as very much of a programme event. We hope to give you the opportunity to see and partake of a very full and unusual set of activities over the weekend. Even so, we're fully aware that for most fans the Programme tends to loom less large than the all-important business of meeting people, and so we're keen to provide, firstly, a set of real alternatives, and secondly, a relaxed and sociable atmosphere for everyone. Thus, we're trying to span the gap between the best of the very relaxed Conventions and the densely programmed events which are also about.

The Albany is replete with fine bars and lounge areas (see the map) and the surrounding City centre offers a variety of diversions.

The Main Programme is currently in the final throes of planning. It starts on Friday morning, and runs through to Monday night. The official end to the Main Programme is normally about 3 am, except on Monday when matters close about 9 pm. The events of the day start about 9 am most mornings. The bulk of the late night (and early morning!) programme are films. We've booked the following: 2001; Beyond the Time Barrier; Dr Strangelove; The War Game; Twilight's last gleaming; Wizards; Kama Sutra Rides Again; The Rocky Horror Picture Show; Young Frankenstein; Forbidden Planet; The Creature from the Black Lagoon (in 3D!); Soylent Green; The Car; and One flew over the cuckoo's nest. Needless to say, we may be frustrated with these at the last minute (Dark Star was delivered to the first Faircon two days late!) and so have a couple up our sleeve to fill any spaces that Securicor create.

Films take up only a fraction of the Main Programme. We have the usual spread of talks, panel discussions and so forth, plus a quiz and debate.

The debate - Nuclear or Not? - will take place on Sunday afternoon. If you are interested in taking part then contact Bob Shaw.

Jim Barker, our Fan Guest of Honour, will present an entertainment as part of the programme.

Running beside the events in the Main Con Hall are the highly varied Alternative Programme items. We've arranged things so that, as far as possible, there will be as large a difference as possible between the Main and Alternative Programme at any time. For example: against the films we try to put talks or discussions. In addition, we can amplify various of the ideas put forward during Main Programme items during the somewhat more relaxed Alternative Programme.


Events include a debate (who needs women?), a series of talks and discussions on Home Computing, the Film Quiz, cartoons, several panel discussions, and auctions. We generally expect a lower audience for all of these than would justify inclusion in the Main Programme.

Destination Moon (a bad b&w version) will be shown to damage the digestion of anyone who doesn't go to the Banquet!

The Video Programme will feature as much SF and related material as we can obtain. We may have a projecting TV system, but this will depend on the Albacon kitty closer to the event. If you have any tapes or equipment for loan or hire then please contact Bob Shaw.

There will be closed circuit TV coverage of activities in the Main Con Hall both on remote monitors spread through the public rooms of the Albany and over the fourth channel of the internal TV system.

The programme events are under the direction of Bob Shaw (main) and Bob Jewett (alternative). The Video Programme is in the hands of Dave Ellis and all offers of help and material should go to him at 6, Talisman Walk Saltcoats KA21 6HT.

#### HOTEL

The Albany is now essentially full; there are a few places left, and if you are really keen on beirg bouser at the Albany we'll make every effort to help you. Our overflow Hotel is the Glasgow Centre Hotel, some 200 yards away. Should this also be filled the Ingram, \( \frac{1}{2} \) a mile away, will be used. The Albany is situated two blocks from Clasgow's Central Station, and the Centre lies on Argyle Street.

Rates at the Albany (and Centre) are £11.70 FER PERSON per night. This includes VAT and nervice, but not breaklast. There will be a supplement of £5.40 on the above rates for anyone staying one night only. Deposit is £5.00; this is set against your bill.


Cheaper forms of accommodation are available and if you're interested then write to *Lisanne*, or phone Steve Miller on (041) 762 2451 after 7pm.

Not shown on these maps- Foyer Area, Video Room, and Art Show. The Foyer Area is the site of the Albacon Registration Desk (the Albany function suite has it's own entrance outwith the Hotel general seating and the (almost) non-stop D&D demonstration by the Glasgow Wargames Club. In addition a spaceflight exhibition will be staged here. Video Room lies off the Foyer and comprises two rooms, one of which offers secure storage for video equipment. The Art Show is on the Penthouse level of the main Hotel block, beside the Fan Room and Alternative Programme.

The Hotel has two further Bars, one Pub style and serving both real ale and cheap food, and the other somewhat more of a 'Hotel' Bar. The latter remains open as long as Residents require it to; our own Con Bars will close in the early hours of the morning and are somewhat cheaper.

Cheap food will be available at lunchtimes and at selected times over the weekend in the Con Suite. The Albany has The Carvery, where vast amounts of food may be consumed for a modest sum.

Jimmy Robertson writes. For the Fan Room at Albacon I'd like to have a map of the UK showing where fan groups meet and where fanzines are edited and produced from etc.— The object being to show the size and activity of Fandom in the UK at present. To do this, however, it is essential to have the cooperation of such groups and Editors.

This would give everyone at the Con a chance to see what is actually happening—and who is making it happen. Ideally it would be a comprehensive reflection of fandom, but that—of course—is up to you. Make sure your group or fanzine is represented by sending me the following:

GROUPS: Information, type of group (formal/informal), committee (if any), where/when you meet, what you do, how/when your group got started, events you've organised and any other information you'd like made public.

FANZINES: Type of fanzine, editorial address, how often you publish, how to get your finz, boll you publish (briefly) plus any other relevant information you'd like made public.

Please send this information whether you're coming to Albacon or not. If you're coming would you please -if possible- enclose a photo of yourself. This will let a face be put to a name, and a passport style picture would be fine.

There isn't much of a precedent for Fan Room programming other than that it should be informal, which it will certainly be, but if you would like to see any particular subjects discussed- eg size of conventions, fandom, BSFA, or any other interesting or controversial points you can think of then please contact me. Ideas in general for the Fan Room are greatly a appreciated (they make my job easier and that can't be bad!) and, if they're used they'll make for a better Con all round.





This is the Albacon 80 Membership application form. You use it to become a member; study it carefully, as there are several options open to you.

PRE-SUPPORTING MEMBERSHIP was available before Albacon won the Bid for the 1980 Eastercon. You can no longer become a PRE-SUPPORTING member. If you paid 50p at Yorcon (or before) you can reduce the final total for FULL membership by £1.00. You will not be included on the mailing list after PR2.

SUPPORTING MEMBERSHIP costs you £3.00. For it, you get all current Albacon literature (eg PRs) and the Programme Book after the convention. You are retained on our mailing list throughout, and if you SUPPORT at any time then your eventual conversion to FULL is at the rate in operation at the time you SUPPORT.

FULL MEMBERSHIP costs £6.00. It is the only type of membership which entitles you to attend. You will have all convention literature, and if you decide to become a FULL member you have no more to pay, even if the rate "at the door" is considerably higher.

ALL RATES ROSE AS OF DECEMBER 1st 1979. If you send the wrong rate(s) then you'll be met with a claim from us for the outstanding sum at the door. A further rise of £1.00 will take place on 1 February on all rates. No postal memberships will be accepted after 20 March 1980. We will probably increase the at-the-door rate still further.

Rates rise because we are running an ambitious Convention, and if we're to provide you with the best possible service then we have to know as far in advance as possible just how much money we can afford to spend. By raising the rates we can "encourage" you to help us in our financial plans:

Remember that PRE-SUPPORTING membership does not entitle you to a freeze on final rates, but merely to a £1.00 reduction overall.

Formal receipts detailing overall charges and payments will be given at Albacon. Should you require a receipt in the meantime tick the box marked R and enclose an SAE.
