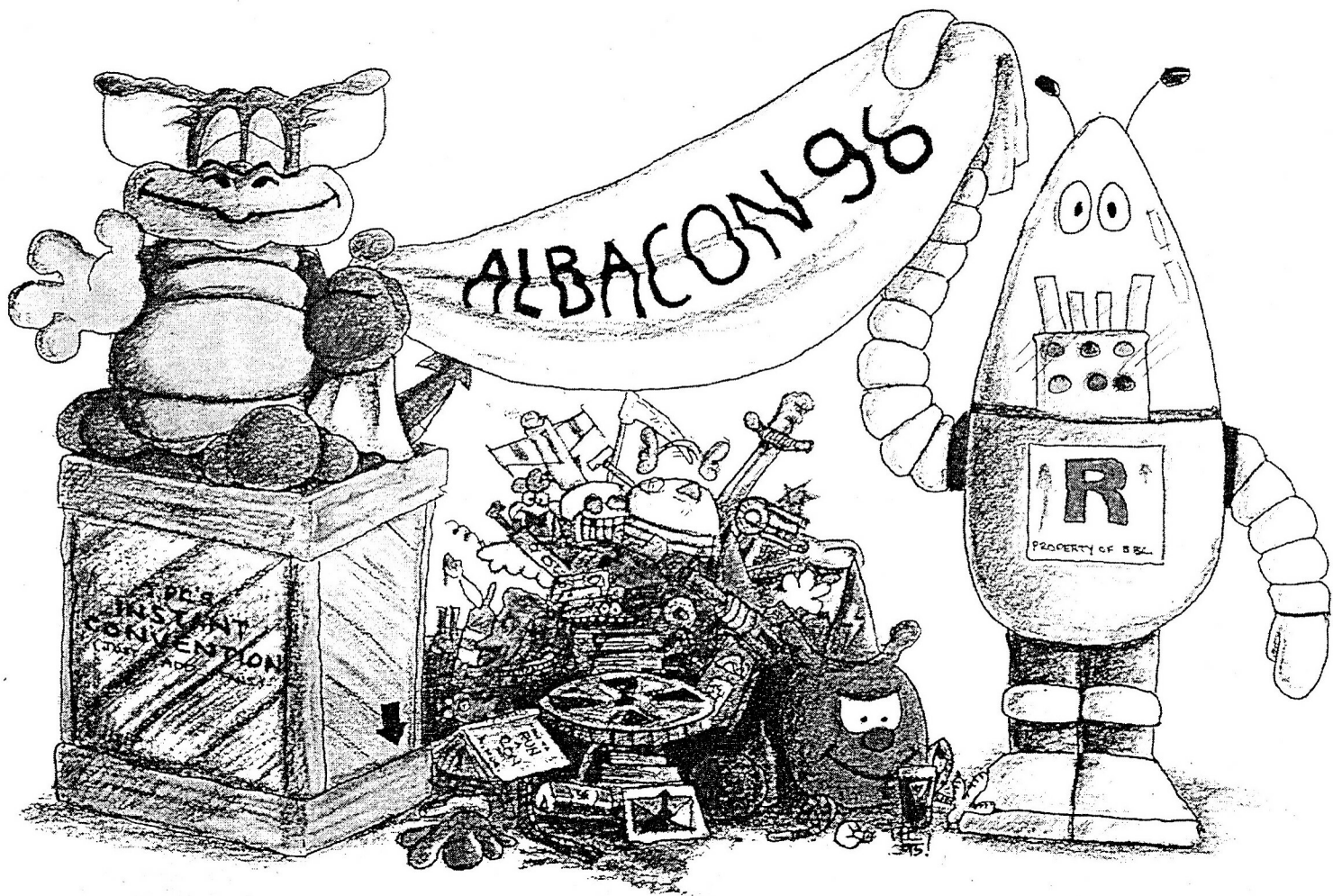




INTRODUCTION

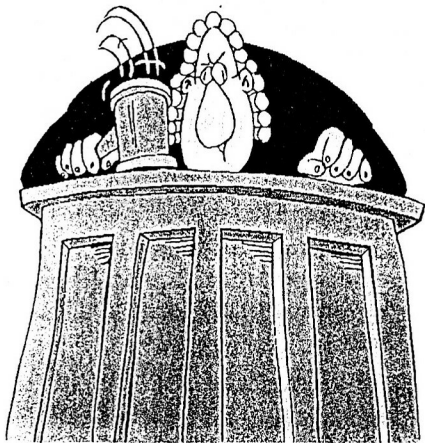


SECURITY STATEMENT

Our Security Chief, Gordon Nimmo, has asked us to announce the Weapons Policy, which will be in use during the convention weekend. This Policy will be adopted for the benefit and well-being of all attendees, guests, hotel staff and members of the public using the convention hotel. Any person who disregards, does not abide by, or blatantly ignores this Policy, will be subject to a fine which may include the confiscation of weapon(s) for the duration of the convention and in extreme cases, expulsion for the event.

ALL WEAPONRY MUST BE CHECKED BY SECURITY AND REGISTERED BEFORE BEING WORN IN THE HOTEL. Bladed weapons must be sheathed and peace-bonded (this facility will be provided on the day) and replica guns, water pistols or similar projectile weaponry, must never be loaded at any time, nor waved around in an irresponsible manner.

Permits will be issued for a small fee. Spot checks will take place throughout the weekend and your permit must be produced if requested. To make identification of peace-bonded items easier, we are currently investigating the use of a tagging system.



Minor breaches of the Policy will be subject to a fine. More serious breaches or recurrent offences could result in a heavier fine and/or confiscation of your toy(s)! All decisions made by the Security Chief or his deputy in these matters will be fully supported by the convention committee.

Special allowances will be made for masquerade entrants and participants of live role-playing scenarios, which will require weaponry, subject to security supervision. Advance notice of RPG or Costume weaponry would be appreciated.

All money raised by the sale of permits and fines imposed, will be donated directly to the convention charities.

This delightful little convention, held at the Central Hotel on July 1st & 2nd, almost never happened but thanks to support from ALBACON and the GLASGOW IN 95 Bid Committee, the weekend was saved! What a relief - it was great fun! Anyway, their committee have asked to say a few words about:

Diplomats and guests are requested to wear a badge of honour or ceremonial sash to indicate the planet or country they are representing - it's amazing what you can do with crepe paper! - to make formal introduction easier. Mr. Garibaldi, the Security Chief of Babylon 5, is compiling a selection of his favourite toons for vid-viewing and Ambassador Mollari has arranged for the provision of native refreshments.

ALBACON hopes that some of our members will be in attendance on Sunday 27th August at the CNC, THE CENTRAL HOTEL from 10pm onwards.

STAYING AT THE CONVENTION HOTEL

There has always been a big debate about the benefits of staying in the hotel where the convention is taking place, even if you are a local resident. It certainly makes life easier:

- the room rates are cheap compared to normal accommodation rates charged by the hotel *and* other conventions.
- you don't have to worry about getting home in the wee small hours of the morning.
- you don't have to worry about where to store your stuff where it won't get nicked, broken or damaged.
- you will have access to all the hotel facilities including the leisure club.
- you are guaranteed somewhere to crash if you overindulge or need to catch a few hours undisturbed.
- there is no need to carry around valuable items or large amounts of cash. The hotel can offer short term use of deposit boxes to all residents.

Not only does it benefit the attendee to stay in the hotel, it actually benefits the convention itself! The Central Hotel has just over 200 bedrooms and if all those rooms are filled by con members it means no mundanes. (Except in the cafe and Ailsa Bar, which are technically public areas.) This reduces confusion in the restaurant at breakfast time or in the bars: all the tariffs will be the same and all the arrangements will be specifically tailored to the needs of con attendees, according to those agreed between the hotel management & the con committee.

ALBACON would like to urge all attendees to stay at the convention hotel. The convention rates we have negotiated are much cheaper than anywhere else across the country, especially at such a peak period! The rates are inclusive of VAT and full Scottish breakfast (a continental option is available for vegetarians). In 1994, many people booked at the very last minute, or arrived on the day, still expecting a room in the Central but most had to be placed in other city hotels. To avoid disappointment in 1996, we strongly urge you to book early, paying a minimum deposit of £10. If you won't know until much nearer the time whether you can attend or not, better to lose a small deposit than arrive on the day and end up miles from the convention, in a hotel that isn't as convenient, friendly or might not honour the special rates!

The convention rates are as follows:

SINGLE, TWIN or DOUBLE ROOM	£22 per person/per night
TRIPLE ROOM (limited number available)	£20 per person/per night
QUAD ROOM (limited number available)	£18 per person/per night

A booking form is included with the progress report. Please send the completed form to the convention address first! This will ensure that there is a back-up copy of your requirements should problems arise at the hotel on arrival. Thanks very much.

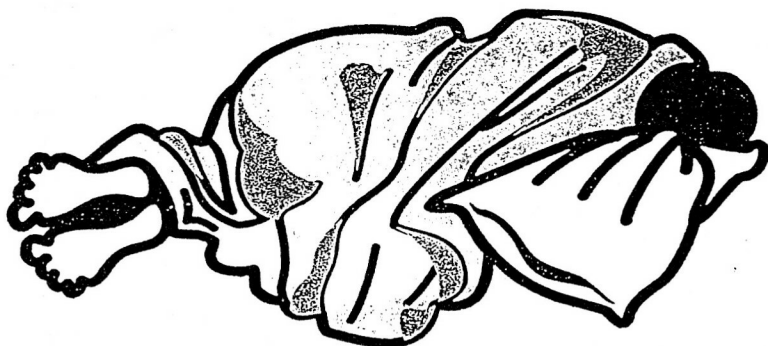
