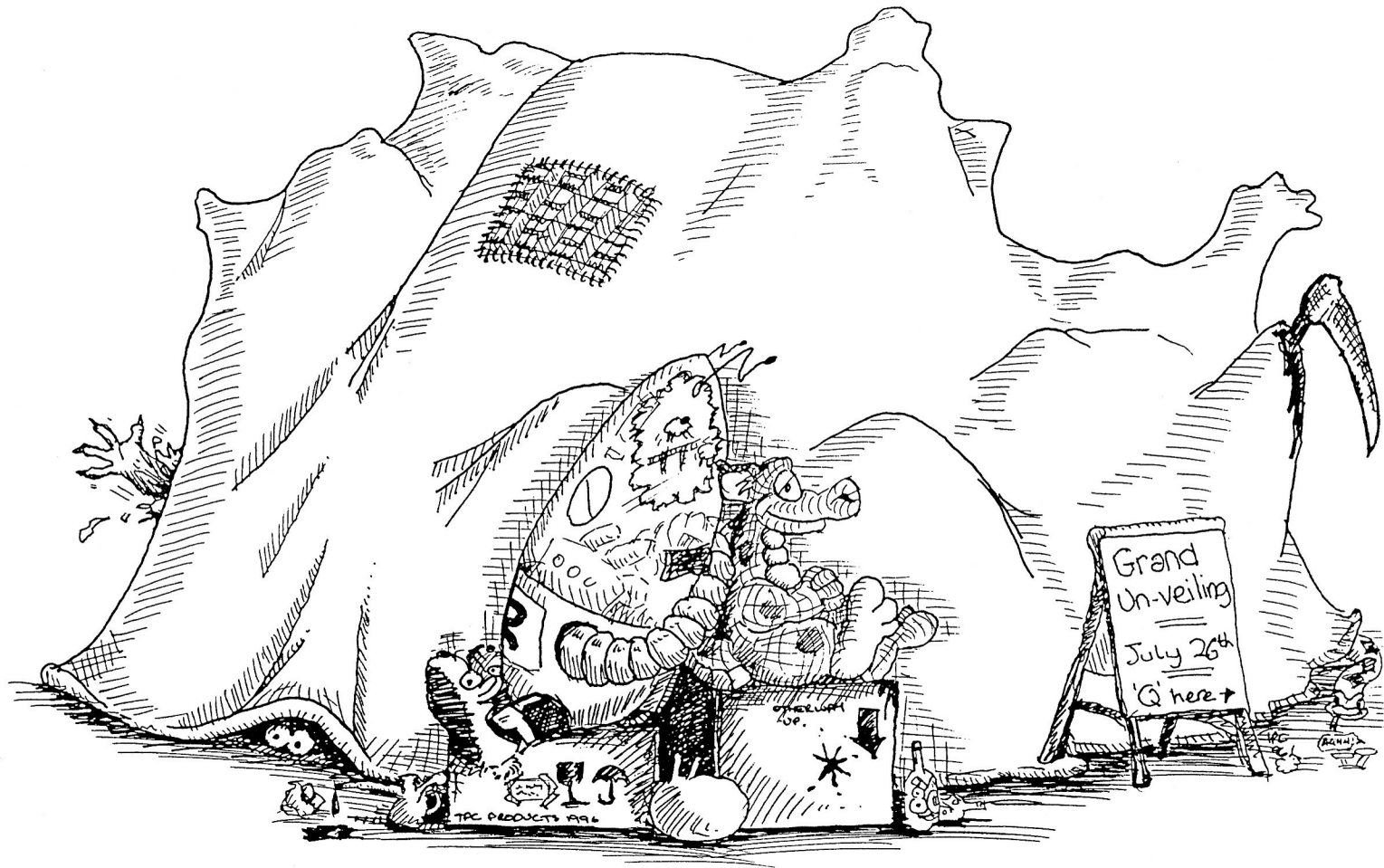

Consequently, his appearance at the convention has had to be cancelled which is a disappointment to ALBACON 96 as well as Harlan & Susan, who were looking forward to the trip. If anyone wishes to withdraw their membership due to Harlan's cancellation, a full refund will be given.

The Championships will take place on Sunday from 9.30am.

A small administration fee will be charged by the organisers to all competitors. Those who are attending the Championships but not the convention, will be charged a nominal fee by ALBACON 96, to give access to the convention bar only. Special badges will be issued for these participants for security purposes.

PROGRAMME NEWS

The main programme is scheduled to start at midday on 26th July 1996. It will probably open with a movie but video rooms, the computer network & gaming rooms should be getting started slightly earlier.

The registration desk will open at 10am on Friday but members who arrive on Thursday night will be able to collect their membership packs that evening. Traditionally, the Glasgow SF group THE FRIENDS OF KILGORE TROUT, will hold their regular weekly meeting in the Ailsa Bar at the Central on the eve of the con. Since most of the committee are TROUT's, it goes without saying that they will definitely be there, no doubt working through the night with setting up the convention, ably assisted by anyone who offers and alcoholic support!

Other highlights for the first day of the convention: the animated movie WIZARDS, which has been long absent from ALBACON's, the APOLLO 13 Crisis Game and a special production by Iain Sorensen & Phillip Raines, who are following their hilarious success of DUNE - The Sands of Music, which they performed at INTERSECTION. Belly laughs all round!

Those of you who were at HYPOTHETICON in 1995 will have experienced the excellent ceilidh band, Steep the Feet, who will be providing the dancing music for Saturday night's ALBACON ceilidh which will be held after the Masquerade competition and

convention lottery. ALBACON decided to inject a bit more humour into the convention, which seemed like a good idea with Terry around. The Lottery will be presented by Peter Morwood, who is definitely a lot cuter than Anthea Turner and a lot funnier. All the money raised from this daft programme item will be donated directly into the charity pool.

Making his first appearance at a science fiction convention is Professor Edwin Dawes. A biochemist by profession, he is also a member of The Magic Circle and will be making a special presentation about magic through the ages on Sunday evening. ALBACON promised something different and we always deliver!

We are now taking entries for the following quizzes:

- 2000 A.D.: this will be a chance for the joint winners to have a rematch but if you feel up to the challenge, why not join in the race.
- INTERACTIVE TRIVIAL PURSUIT: six teams of 2
- APOLLO 13 CRISIS GAME: three teams of 3

Following the success of the special Gay & Lesbian programming at INTERSECTION, the committee has approached the local chapter of Delaney's Children to do something similar at ALBACON 96. This will hopefully provide an even broader range of programming to the convention. There are local meetings in Glasgow and details about joining will be available at ALBACON 96]

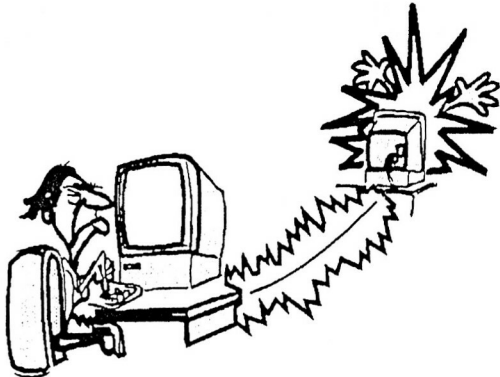

GAMING EVENTS

ALBACON 96 hopes to have some demonstration games for beginners scheduled in the gaming rooms as well as a range of card & dice games to fantasy role-playing games including: Vampire - The Masquerade, MAGIC, ROBO RALLY etc. If you would like to utilise the role-playing room, please contact Ralph at the convention address and let him know what you would like to run and when.

The Computer Network Room will be running games such as DOOM, HERETIC, DUKE NUKEM 3D and HEXEN. Strategy games such as WARCRAFT 2 and COMMAND & CONQUER will be used. If there is something people would like to see included, please let us know in advance and we will see what we can arrange. There will be a small usage fee for network games, which will be donated to the convention charities. This fee is being imposed to ensure that everyone gets a chance to use the room and a games timetable will be enforced.



HOTEL REMINDER



If you have not already booked hotel accommodation, do so quickly. Bedrooms allocated for ALBACON 96 will only be held for a limited period. If you delay your booking until the last minute - BEWARE! - you could find yourself in another hotel. Where possible, try and return a booking form but phone Cuddles if time is pressing. GETTING TO THE CONVENTION HOTEL

The Central Hotel, Glasgow is situated at the corner of Gordon Street & Hope Street, adjacent to the Central Station. There is a complex one-way system in the area, so pay attention to the instructions.

BY TRAIN from the South: these rail services terminate at Central Station and there is direct access to the hotel from the passenger concourse.

BY TRAIN (arriving at Queen Street Station): it will take you no more than 10 minutes to walk. If you have heavy luggage, there is a shuttle bus between the two stations.

BY MOTOR VEHICLE from the South or north of Glasgow: come off at Junction 19 (SECC). Turn left into Argyle Street then left at the lights just before the station canopy into Hope Street. Parking may be difficult, especially at peak times.

If you intend to park in the NCP car park, Oswald Street, take first right after turning into Argyle Street, then left onto Broomielaw (parallel with the river). Turn left at the lights before the rail bridge then first right to get to the entrance. The hotel has negotiated special rates for convention attendees which is slightly cheaper than the standard rates (ask at reception). Direct access into the station from level 5.

BY MOTOR VEHICLE from the airport and south of the city: take Junction 18 (City Centre) and turn 5th right down to Argyle Street. Turn left then left into Hope Street. If you intend parking in the NCP, continue down to Broomielaw and follow the directions given in the previous paragraph.

There is a shuttle bus from the airport which can drop you off quite close to the hotel if you ask for Central Station. The adult fares are: £2 (single) £4 (return). Taxis fares from the airport normally start at £10.

DISABLED ACCESS SERVICE

ELECTRICAL EGGS (UK)TM will be providing a basic service during the convention. The services will include Priority Seating, 1st Entry, Line Jumping and Medical Alert Registration. If there is sufficient demand, a large print publication of the Programme Book will be provided. At this time, no guarantees can be given about the provision of equipment such as wheelchairs.

Any members who registered to use the service at INTERSECTION can use the button badges they were issued with but please inform ALBACON 96 if you plan to use the Access Service©. Newcomers to the Access Service© should use the Registration Form provided with this progress report and return it to the convention address as soon as possible. Access Badges will be issued in the membership pack, with advice on using them, on arrival at the convention registration desk.

Please note: the Medical Alert details are vital for first aid purposes and any information provided will be treated as confidential. Access to the information will be restricted to Cuddles and made available to first aid volunteers or paramedics in emergencies only. If you have a medical condition such as diabetes, it is important that you complete the form. Alert labels will be provided at the registration desk for you to stick on the back of your membership badge.
