Once upon a time there were three little fans.

Jophan has been told how wonderful Confabulation is going to be by all his mates, and decides to turn up at the Britannia International on the door on April 14th. Sadly, the convention is full, and we have to turn him away. Slowly and disconsolately, he turns away from the door, head hung low. He presses his little face against the windows of the Royal Lounge, looking inside at the happy scene of fans enjoying themselves. Suddenly, he realises that the Royal Lounge is thirty foot above the West India Docks, loses his non-existent footing, and falls in.

His mate, Bertphan, arrived at the convention a bit earlier. He'd been planning to come for months, but never quite got round to joining. He got to the registration desk, and found out what the rate was to join on the door. Unfortunately, his cash card only allows him to withdraw £250 a day, so he couldn't get in till Sunday.

Don't let this happen to your friends. We are already beginning to be concerned by the possibility of too many people coming to the convention. It's not designed to be a big con, and we'd like to keep the atmosphere as

friendly as possible. The hotel, while somewhat expandable, is not infinite in size. We would like everyone who joins Confabulation to join in advance; we're not encouraging people to join on the door.

In order to put your money where our mouth is, we *will* be charging an extortionate on the door rate. We're not kidding, folks. If the convention gets too large then we *will* close membership. Our day memberships for walkins will also be extremely expensive. However, supporting members will be able to convert to either attending or day membership at a considerably lower cost than the basic 'walkin' rate. If you aren't sure whether you can come, or can't afford to pay all at once, we strongly advise you to buy a supporting membership for a tenner and guarantee the lower rate.

Fredphan did this; he has a limited income, and had to save up to get to the convention. So he bought a supporting membership in February, and when he arrived at Confabulation he converted to attending for a perfectly reasonable amount of money. And he had a wonderful time and lived happily ever after.

Masquerade

We will be having a masquerade on the Sunday night of the convention, which will be combined with the awards ceremony. We will be offering prizes for all the normal Best of Show sort of stuff, but also special prizes for the Best Costume based on the works of our Guests of Honour, Best Costume that Didn't Exist at Lunchtime and Best Moose. These may be combined; an impromptu Vor Moose in Imperial Whites might well be a winner.

If you are planning to use any special equipment or sound effects, please let us know well beforehand. We will not be having an elaborate lighting rig at Confabulation, but we will do what we can to help you. It would be useful to know if you are planning to enter the Masquerade, but in traditional Eastercon style, we will be able to take entries on the day.

We realise that many people will be keeping their best efforts for the Worldcon, so we would be glad to see old costumes being brought out for another showing. There will be a special prize for the best vintage costume but they will not be eligible for other prizes.

Bob Shaw

Confabulation's UK Guest of Honour is Bob Shaw. For many years, Bob has been one of the UK's leading SF authors and SF fans, and we are proud to have him as a Guest of Honour.

He was born in 1931 in Belfast, and grew up and was educated in Northern Ireland. He worked as a structural engineer, aircraft designer, and journalist before becoming a full-time author in 1975.

His first published story was "Aspect" which appeared in *Nebula Science Fiction* in 1954. Since then he has published an impressive body of stories and novels, tackling a wide range of themes. His best known early work is the short story "Light of Other Days", published in 1966, which introduced the concept of "slow glass", a type of glass which retards the passage of light for a period which can range from seconds to years. "Light of Other Days" was nominated for both the Hugo and Nebula awards for best short story. Further stories followed and all of the slow glass stories can be found in the collection *Other Days, Other Eyes* (1972).

His first novel was *Night Walk*, published in 1967. It was soon followed by several more, of which *Orbitsville* (1975) is perhaps the best known. This was one of the best novels arising from the fashion for SF novels set in vast structures. The eponymous Orbitsville is a Dyson sphere - a shell of matter completely enclosing a star at such a distance that life can survive on the inner surface, giving a habitable area billions of times that of the Earth. The novel concerns the discovery of the structure and the effects of that discovery on human society. It was followed by two sequels, *Orbitsville Departure* and *Orbitsville Judgement*.

Apart from these, his best-known work is probably the *Ragged Astronauts* series, consisting of *The Ragged Astronauts* (1986), *The Wooden Spaceships* (1988) and *The Fugitive Worlds* (1989). These tell the story of two planets, Land and Overland, which orbit each other sufficiently closely to share a common atmosphere, making balloon travel between the two practical. *The Ragged Astronauts* was nominated for the Hugo award for best novel.

Most recently, he has published *Warren Peace*, a sequel to his successful 1977 novel *Who Goes Here?*. These two novels reveal that Bob can also write successful comedy, poking fun at many of the conventions of genre SF.

But this gives only one side to Bob Shaw's science fiction achievements. Even if he had never written a word of professional fiction, he would still be a worthy Guest of Honour for an Eastercon. With Walt Willis, he wrote the fannish classic "The Enchanted Duplicator" - for those with Internet access, this can be obtained by ftp from gandalf.rutgers.edu/pub/sfl/the-enchanted-duplicator.txt. He won the Hugo award for best fan writer in 1979 and again in 1980.

His "Serious Scientific Talks", featuring the great German-Irish scientist Von Donegan, have been a highlight of Eastercons for many years, although they are only occasionally scientific, and even less frequently are they serious.

We plan to have a fuller appreciation of Bob's work in the convention programme book. We are delighted to have him as a Guest of Honour and we are sure that you will all join us in welcoming him to Confabulation.

The room rates at the hotel are £31 per person per night twin or double, and £37 per person per night, including VAT and full English breakfast. Suites are available; price on application.

£10 supporting until 31/3/95
