

Welcome to the fourth and final Follycon Factsheet! Follycon will be the 69th British National Science Fiction Convention, or Eastercon. It will be held at the Majestic Hotel in Harrogate, from 30 March to 2 April 2018.

Although we're hoping for good weather, it's quite likely we won't get it. Make sure you've got clothes that will allow you to enjoy Harrogate and its surroundings if it's cold and wet.

# **Hotel Bookings and Access**

Please remember that Harrogate is a popular tourist destination: it will be very difficult to get accommodation over the Easter weekend at short notice, so everyone needs to make arrangements in advance.

The convention will be held at the The Majestic Hotel, which is now fully booked, but there are many other hotels and B&Bs nearby, many listed in the accommodation section of visitharrogate.co.uk. We have arranged special rates with some other hotels in the area, detailed at follycon.org.uk/hotels and in Factsheet 2.

If you need to be in an accessible room but have not already made a booking, please contact access@follycon.org.uk as soon as possible. If you expect to need to use a wheelchair or scooter during the convention, please make arrangements to hire one in advance: we will not have mobility aids available on the day.

# How to Get to Follycon

Harrogate is in North Yorkshire. The Majestic Hotel is on Ripon Road (postcode HG1 2HU), with road access via Springfield Avenue. If you're driving, the A59 and A61 both run through Harrogate and the A661 connects to the A1(M). Parking in the hotel carpark is free for all members of the convention.

The nearest airport is Leeds Bradford, about 12 miles away; the 747 bus is an express service to Harrogate bus station, and taxis are available. Manchester airport is around two hours away from Harrogate by train via Leeds.

Harrogate is about 35 minutes on the train from Leeds or York, which are both hubs for other rail services across the UK. There is a taxi rank at the station and the bus station is nearby, with several routes stopping 2-3 minutes walk from the hotel. At average pace it takes 12-15 minutes to walk between the station and the Majestic, although Harrogate is not a flat town.

#### **Code of Conduct**

## **Programme**

We have a programme. We have talks on Robert Heinlein, the James Webb Space Telescope, the science of toffee and Ray Harryhausen. We have panels on Utopias, cities, Victorian fantasy and future technologies. You can get out and about in Harrogate (bring walking shoes and a warm coat) and keep fit for fandom (bring loose clothing and a swimming costume). We'll celebrate Frankenstein's 200th birthday, the BSFA's 60th and the lives of Brian Aldiss and Ursula K. Le Guin. There will be a Poetry Open Mic (bring a poem) and critical workshops (see the website for set texts). You will be able to enjoy discussion of science fiction and fantasy in all their forms.

We expect to publish the programme on our website on 17 March, and recommend looking before you arrive if you can. Please note that some items will need you to sign up, either on our website or when you arrive at the con.
