IT'S GOING TO BE A GRAND CON

How can it fail to be, we are at Bristol and the Hotel (you guessed), is the Grand.

Bristol's Grand Hotel is situated on Broad Street (which belies its name), conveniently close to the town centre, almost next to the river and surrounded on all sides, within walking distance, by the rail and bus stations, parking facilities, the main shopping complex, a bowling alley, ice rink, theatre, cinema, slot palaces, numerous churches and a multitude of cafes and restaurants some of which must suite every taste. Included in our final OMPAgress should be a map should be a map showing many of these, together with a guide as to whether the various eateries are likely to be open on the Sunday.

The Hotel is of the four star class with all that this implies and highly suitable for our purposes. Not having been erected during the last decade the rooms are quite large, those we saw comparing favourably even with the ones this year at Chester, while in addition to sheer size most have not only private baths but also individual television sets. They were not dealing with a Con, of course, but the staff attitude was also very good when we were there, again I would venture so far as to class it with that of Chester, can more be said.

Perhaps if I am to make boasts it should be of the actual Convention facilities, which must be far and away the best ever for a British Science Fiction Convention. We have a main hall, naturally, but what a hall - the Hotel calls it. with justification, a ballroom; 36 feet wide and almost 70 long it will seat up to 350 people, since we don't really expect that number to attend, though it would be nice, you should all have plenty of leg room. In addition to this auditorium there is a conveniently sized stage for the speakersand a balcony where we hope to put the projection equipment, this will not only prevent latecomers from silhouetting their way across the screen but should also allow us to leave the equipment in situ throughout the Con. an important time saver. A seperate room will be used for meals, including the Banquet, so there will be no delay while the hall is cleared and re-set either. We shall have use of the Hotel's lounge areas and, in addition to

everything else, the Duchess Suite; this room is the same size as the Ballroom, divides into two or three as needed and will provide ample space for the book dealers, the art exhibition and anything else that turns up.

HOTEL BOOKING FORMS

In OMPAgress 1 I promised booking forms by the end of October, if no rush of enthusiasm occured. Since this report has been somewhat delayed I've decided to get enthusiastic, the forms are enclosed - ah! what vitality.

On several occasions I have said that those who joined early would have first chance at booking hotel rooms. Sending the forms out early will help to accomplish this and giving priority to the replies of members do the rest. However, others must have a chance too so the period during which the forms from those already members are given precedence will be restricted. Then dealing with bookings, priority will be given to members, providing their forms are received before the date shown at the top of them and that all those for whom accommodation is being reserved are either already members or have included their fees with the forms. I'm not going to guarantee that you will all get the rooms you want, obviously if everyone asks for a particular type we shall run out but, if you are already a member and return the completed form by the date given. I will guarantee you a place in the Con Hotel. Second priority will be given to those who join when this report goes out and book at the same time, being dealt with on the basis of first come first served. Since I have no idea of the numbers involved here I obviously can't guarantee Con Hotel rooms to everybody in this category but, since the Hotel is a bigger one than usual. those who return the forms quickly should stand a good chance. People who send them back late will not be given any priority, you have a month so anyone left in this position will have only themselves to blame.

Confirmation of all bookings arriving by 14th October will be sent individually, within six weeks of receipt; those which come later will be confirmed when OMPAgress 3, scheduled for January, is sent out. However modest your collection, it requires the special attention we alone provide.

It's very nice to be able to say we have such a lot of Convention space available in the Hotel, it means we can easily cope with a bigger and, we hope, better Easter gathering than has yet been seen. However, that calls for you people out there to both join and come, we're not the biggest yet by a long way - though membership figures could be a lot worse. The immediate target is 250 people of at least Associate status before Christmas and since we now have over 150 this should be possible.

Having a lot of people support a Con by taking out Associate membership is, of course, vital, however, a desire to know the number who will actually attend must loom large in the minds of any organising Committee. The simplest way to get an idea of this is to start things off early: which is why I said at least Associate member status, we want everyone to gain Full membership early. Full attending membership will be £2, as it was last year, which means another £1.50 for those who are already Associate members: however, as an encouragement to early payment, we will allow a reduction of 25p on this (which may not sound much but could quite easily cost us £50), providing you send the money quickly. This reduction will be available to each member for a short period only, to take advantage of it you must get the money to me by the date shown in that section of the booking form, despite any postal delay that may occur.

THE COST OF A CON

dveryone is obviously interested in how much things are going to cost so the Committee decided it would be a good idea to publish the prices of as many things as possible the trouble is that with almost eight months to go and prices skyrocketing in all directions it's almost impossible to get firm figures. Because of this and lack of space I am only attempting to cover items appearing on the booking form this time, even they must remain rather vague in some cases.

- Room and Breakfast this will be under 24 per person per night, which compares with the normal charge, at present, of 25.91 and even this will rise again before the Con with the introduction of V.A.T. This and any other increases will not be included on your accounts with regard to rooms.
- Full Board will be about £7, per person per night.
- Banquet Tickets these will not exceed £2.25 each but due to uncertain prices the menu has already had to be changed once and it is impossible to be more accurate.
- Car Parking Facilities we have been promised a reduced charge but as the 1973 rates have not yet been worked out it is impossible to say what the final charge will be.
- Cots and High Chairs cots will not cost more than 60p per night plus V.A.T., we have no prices as yet for the use of high chairs.
