Chairman's Welcome

Welcome to Progress Report 3 from Reconnect – Eastercon 76 in Belfast.

Whilst we have a lot to get through, I wanted to take a minute to reflect on what's in a name. We took a lot of time coming up with our name as we wanted it to highlight our vision for the convention.

Coming out of the dark years of the pandemic so much has changed, not only in the wider world but also with our community. People are more aware of the risks in gathering together, alternate technical solutions have been developed to allow us to continue to meet up and, sadly, some people have taken their own decisions to remain at home. We are very aware of these considerations.

That being said, we also recognise the huge importance of being together physically. Within our friends and family groups the vital social and mental health benefits of being around other people are profound. In our community Levitation, the Glasgow Worldcon and Novacon this year have shown the very real desire to gather together, in safe, airy environments can be achieved.

Eastercon in Belfast is a chance to extend that, a chance to meet up in person with over 600 other members (so far!) of our community and to reconnect with each other. We will therefore be focussing our efforts there and less on a virtual version of the convention. The main programme from the Belfast ICC will be streamed and, finances allowing, the main programme in the Belfast Hilton. All of these resources will be available to our attending and supporting members, and we won't be offering a specific virtual membership as Glasgow did.

More than that, however, it is an opportunity to reconnect with the roots of our community. Irish Fandom really kick-started a more social version of our hobby — moving away from books, magazines and 'serious and constructive' discussions about Science Fiction, Fantasy and Horror. We want to reconnect with that, nodding to our past but also welcoming our future — comics, cosplay, horror and a whole range of fandoms that make up our wider community. Eastercon has proudly been a very inclusive place and we want to reflect that in our guests, our committee and in the membership.

Notes:

The ICC and Hilton Belfast are connected by an indoor corridor and escalators. There is ample space at the ICC which has hosted up to 5,000 people.

The venue is central to Belfast, being 10 minutes' walk from the City Hall and main shopping and dining areas, with imposing views of the River Lagan.

There is a massive choice of hotels and other accommodations, ranging from the opulent to the frugal, within half a mile of the venue.

The discounted rates are available if you are: a resident in the island of Ireland; a first-time attendee at an Eastercon; under the age of 18; or have pressing financial reasons to need the reduced rate (no questions asked).

Membership portal: We took a lot of memberships at conventions, so may not have had the chance to take your address and country details — or may have recorded them incorrectly. Day rates: These will be announced in the near future, and confirmed in PR4.

Hotel Bookings and Accommodation

Hotel and accommodation bookings opened in late September for those with access needs, and in early October for the main membership. We sent out an email to all members announcing this.

<u>Hilton:</u> Because the Hilton itself does not have enough rooms for the whole membership, demand was high, as expected. However, as of mid-November there were still some King Deluxe and King Executive rooms available, so don't give up if you particularly want to be in the Hilton. <u>Click here for more information.</u>

Other hotels and accommodation: Our concierge service has put together a range of options to suit all budgets here: https://www.miceconciergeme.com/eastercon2025

The MiceConcierge team have been really generous in holding plenty of rooms in all their hotels for us. An excellent number of you have already booked through their very clear website; you will have plenty of fellow fans for company in two hotels in particular (with a good combination of reasonable rates and closeness to the ICC), but all still have lots of space left.

Don't leave it too late, though — they won't be holding the rooms for us forever; the block bookings for us lapse on the 19th of March (except for the Maldron which will open its books to others on 5th March).

Travel Connections To and From the Convention

Belfast has a new travel hub, Grand Central Station, which opened this October. There are regular trains leaving that station for the convention station, Lanyon Place, which takes approximately 8 minutes. These also call at Botanic station, for anyone considering accommodation in the University area. Walk-through tour of newly opened Grand Central here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=XBqkBIWerNw

Arriving at Belfast International Airport: the Translink 300 and 300a air coach service now connects to Belfast Grand Central station. They run every 20 minutes during office hours and up to 8 an hour at rush hours.

Arriving at Belfast City airport: there is an accessible bus, no. 600, every 20 minutes, which goes to Grand Central Station and stops at St. George's Market close to the

Hilton and ICC entrances. There is also a train service from Sydenham which will stop at Lanyon Place but this does require crossing a footbridge, and a bit of a walk. Taxis are also available.

Arriving by boat: the hotel is approximately 5 minutes' drive from the Belfast terminal and 40 minutes from Larne. Taxis are a good option for the Belfast boats, and there is a regular train service from Larne which calls at Lanyon Place three stops before terminating at Grand Central station.

Arriving from Dublin, there are a number of bus services. From the airport, the Aircoach service now connects to Belfast Upper Queen St, approximately an 8 minute walk to Grand Central Station. The Translink Goldliner service runs to and from Grand Central Station. There is also an hourly Ulsterbus express service between Grand Central Station and Dublin that calls into Dublin airport.

Dublin City Centre: There are buses as above, and the Enterprise train runs on an hourly basis to Grand Central Station from Connolly station.

Car Parking: More information on parking rates and accessible spaces will be provided closer to the event. Members can avail of £12 per day rate. Nearby car parks: <u>ICC Belfast Parking</u>. The APCOA car parks at Oxford Street and Lanyon Place are right next to the Hilton but do not show up on a Google Maps search, nor does the Lanyon Place park and ride facility.

Round and About in Belfast and Elsewhere

Belfast, and Northern Ireland as a whole, have masses of interesting places to go and see while you are in the province. For example, a number of people have asked if we are thinking of organising a bus trip to the Giant's Causeway. We don't have the resources to organise trips ourselves, but plenty of options are available from local operators. For details, these sites give really helpful details. *VisitBelfast* and *Tourism Northern Ireland* also happen to be sponsoring us, so of course we think they will be helpful for you. They will have a stall at the convention if you want to ask further questions — or just ask the committee!

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Access Information

After a full team walkthrough, our Accessibility Team (Declan Meenagh and Cinzia Savonitti) have prepared an accessibility audit. This will be available on our website in early December, by the time this Progress Report is published. Essential details are below; our thanks to the Levitation audit team for the framework. Overview of Venues

The main venues for Eastercon Belfast are the **Hilton Lanyon Place** (Lanyon Place, Belfast BT1 3LP) and the **International Convention Centre** (ICC – Lanyon Place, Belfast, BT1 3WH) which are located back-to-back, connected by stairs or a single lift. There is also an external walking route between the hotel and convention centre, approximately 400 yards long, which includes pavements and ramps.

Estimated walking time: 5 minutes at a leisurely pace. **Mobility scooters:** The external route is more suitable, although it has some uneven surfaces, slopes, and changes in surface texture. A car park entrance must be crossed on this route.

Transportation and Accessibility

See Travel Information on pages 2–3 for main details.

Taxi Services: Both venues have a nearby taxi drop-off point. However, wheelchair-accessible taxis in Belfast may be unreliable, and booking cancellations are common.

Bus Services: The **number 600 bus** from the airport stops near the Hilton at St. George's Market. It is not a kneeling bus, does not have step-free access, and lacks a dedicated wheelchair space.

Train Services: The nearby **Lanyon Place Train Station** is connected to the Hilton by a ramp and bridge, approx. 250 yards. **Irish Rail** and **Translink** offer assistance for disabled passengers. You may need to book assistance 24 hours in advance.

Hilton Lanyon Place Accessibility Features

Check-in: Accessible check-in desk with a hearing loop. **Restrooms:** Accessible toilets are available on the ground and first floors.

Function Rooms: Located on the first floor, the **Lagan Suite** is equipped with a hearing loop.

Bars and Restaurants: The Hilton bar had loud background music, though quieter areas were available. The restaurant also featured loud music. Both gluten-free and non-alcoholic drink options are available. **Breakfast:** Buffet-style breakfast with a wide range of hot and cold foods. Staff were noted to be helpful to those with accessibility needs.

International Convention Centre Belfast (ICC) Accessibility Features

Function Rooms: Located on the first floor. All function room entrances are level and have wide, flat doorways (provided both doors are open).

Lifts: Size: 5 ft 7 in x 6 ft 3 in; capacity: 2 wheelchairs or 2 mobility scooters.

Toilets: First floor: Accessible restrooms are located next to Lift Hall 1C, with wider stalls and lower sinks available in the ladies' toilet. **Additional facilities:** A **Changing Places** facility is available in the Riverside Foyer, featuring equipment such as hoists, adult-sized changing benches, and space for carers.

Air Quality: The ICC features carbon dioxide monitoring linked to its smart air conditioning system, maintaining levels at or below 600 ppm for optimal air quality. There are no HEPA filters, but the air is filtered.

Acoustics: In rooms with high ceilings (e.g., Hall 1A/B), the sound can be difficult to hear, though curtains are installed to help reduce noise. **Hearing Assistance:** The ICC has a hearing loop system, but currently there is no Bluetooth streaming capability (e.g., Sennheiser Mobile-Connect). This may be added before the event, though it is not guaranteed.

Water Stations: Multiple water stations are located throughout the ICC.

Staff are JAM trained.

Internal Route Between Venues: This starts at the Hilton Lobby, through the Hilton Bar, and up the lift to Hall 1. Hall A will serve as the Main Program Hall, with Hall B designated for dealers, and Hall C/D for the art show and exhibitions. Event-Specific Information

Room Allocations: Members with accessibility requirements will be given priority at the Hilton Lanyon Place. Contact us at <u>access@easterconbelfast.org</u> to request the booking link. We understand that some may need to decide late, so rooms will be held regardless of immediate commitment.

Streaming and Online Content: The main program will be streamed from the ICC, and a Discord server will be available for online participation, contingent on volunteer support. We are still reviewing further, enhanced virtual offerings, but these are cost and resource dependent.





Michael saw a ghost sometimes but Michael wasn't like other boys. He could do magic. He wasn't surprised he could see ghosts too.


The ghost never did anything and no-one else saw him. He was just there, watching Michael.






Support the SFE!



What's an Eastercon?

Eastercon is the annual British National Science Fiction Convention. It has been held over the Easter weekend every year since 1955, and is the original gathering of the clans of the UK science fiction field. Eastercon attracts 800–1,200 fans of Science Fiction, Fantasy and similar genres.

Programme events usually include panels, workshops, talks, quizzes, competitions, an Art Show, a Dealers' Room selling books and other items, and gaming and crafting rooms. Events range from hard science through writing workshops to the fun and silly. People are encouraged to take part. Authors, artists, dealers and other professionals in the field attend to meet both fans and colleagues as well as appear on the programme or exhibits.

As SF has broadened its scope to encompass comics, film, TV, games, cosplay, filk and other media as well as books and magazines, Eastercon has encompassed all these new forms of artistic endeayour.

Because it is considered to be a place for fans to meet and take part, rather than sit and listen to presentations, it's a convention and not a conference. Similarly when you pay your money to take part, you buy a membership in Eastercon and not a ticket. Each year the convention is run by a different committee, made up of volunteers from the community.

Dear Members,

It is with sadness and heartfelt feeling, that today we write to you to share the sad news that previous Eastercon Chair, Vanessa May, has passed away.

Vanessa has been an active member of the SF community for some considerable time, making important and significant contributions to the Worldcons in London, Helsinki and Dublin.

Vanessa was co-chair of the Concentric
Eastercon with John
Dowd. Concentric
was planned to
be the 71st British
National Science Fiction
Convention in April 2020
at the Hilton Metropole
Hotel, Birmingham.

As Co-Chairs, Vanessa May,
John Dowd, and their team made
an announcement on the 21st March
and in their own words took "the hard decision in
conjunction with the hotel to cancel Concentric 2020
for the health and safety of all of our members."

As conrunners ourselves, we know there can be very little as hard as having to cancel one's con, and the Covid pandemic was a situation that no one could predict or plan for. Regardless, Vanessa, John and their team facilitated the selection of an Eastercon in 2021, which Vanessa bravely committed to running.

The Eastercon team were not deterred. Eastercon continued, and in 2020 Vanessa and the Confusion team were considering a hybrid convention. In February the decision was taken that Confusion would be a fully Virtual convention. As Chairs of many conventions, we recognise that this pivot was unprecedented. The ambition and desire still to run a convention, using what were really very new and untested technologies, and try to deliver as much of an Eastercon experience as possible was admirable, and we respect that. We know how hard it is to run a con like this, to pivot and embrace so much that was different; trying to bring the community an Eastercon like this would, in all honesty be beyond us.

To run an Eastercon during the pandemic was hugely impressive, and Vanessa and her team's commitment admirable.

Confusion, the 2021 Eastercon was an ambitious undertaking. How hard 2020 had been...

the Covid pandemic, the worldwide situation, the illness, the loss —

it was an incredibly difficult

time; but many fans found many ways to connect and to stay in touch, and worked hard to keep being positive and looking forward.

Vanessa was
undeterred by the
challenges of this
experience, and
there were many. Yet
regardless, Vanessa still
wanted to Chair an in-person
Eastercon; but Persistence was

not to be. We hope that if she were still with us, she would have returned to see that desire and dream through.

Vanessa has supported the Belfast team throughout our time, as many have. Today we focus on Vanessa; indeed, we used Vanessa's superb presentation skills as a framework for our own bid winning presentation. Vanessa and John assisted Belfast ensuring we received funds from Concentric, sharing the situation with ourselves and other chairs as soon as we won our bid, and helping to create bursaries to encourage volunteers.

Reflecting on her commitment and dedication to Eastercon and to fandom, we say that with the full support of our whole Eastercon committee, that Vanessa's brightness, her purple, her spirit, her passion for the fantastic, Lego, fun, her loyalty, the loyalty she engendered and her dedication will be sorely missed by our community.

We will work to remember Vanessa well at Reconnect, honour her memory and let everyone know about that in our Progress Report 4, scheduled for February 2025.
