Twenty-Ninth British Easter Science Fiction Convention: 24th to 27th March, 1978 Venue: The Heathrow Hotel, Heathrow Airport

June approaches and the massive organisation of Skycon shifts up a gear. The Guest of Honour has been lined up, programme ideas have been tossed around with gay abandon, and all we have to do is wait till Easter. So, to keep ourselves occupied, we're putting out Progress Report 1. First, the Committee and co-opted support. GUEST OF HONOUR

Our cover photograph shows Robert Sheckley smiling happily at a convention; this was, of course, just before we told him politely but firmly that he was attending Skycon as the Guest of Honour. Warming to our theme, we explained that a writer as witty, imaginative and profound as Robert Sheckley could not be allowed to go unhonoured; conversely, we added, it takes a writer as hilarious, chaotic and downright silly as Robert Sheckley to withstand the appalling strain of the position.

The tales of the Sheckley "down-at-heel galaxy" (as Brian Aldiss puts it) have been appearing since the 1950's---where they stirred and convulsed innumerable Galaxy readers---and are now enshrined in these collections: Untouched by Human Hands, Citizen in Space, Pilgrimage to Earth, Store of Infinity, Notions Unlimited, Shards of Space, Grey Flannel Armour, The People Trap, Live Gold and Can You Feel Anything When I Do This? ---the last of these being retitled The Same To You Doubled in British paperback, presumably so that youthful fans could show the book to their mothers without fear.

His SF novels, to date, are: Immortality Inc. (Time Killer), The Status Civilization (Omega), Journey Beyond Tomorrow (The Journey of Joenes), The Tenth Victim (expansion of his short The Seventh Victim, later filmed), Mindswap, Dimension of Miracles and Options. Also not to be missed is his very funny spy spoof The Game of X.

If you've read more than a few of the above (and what fan has-n't?) you'll know the good and sufficient reason for our delight that Robert Sheckley will be Guest of Honour at Skycon.

FAN GUEST OF HONOUR

Skycon brings back the Fan Guest of Honour, to be to the Fan Room what the GoH is to the Con Hall. The man we have chosen for this awesome task, and the man we consider fully deserving of it, is (as all who attended the business meeting at Eastercon '77 already know) Leroy Kettle (right). Roy has been in fandom since 1969, and in all that time has never been less than active, producing fanzines (the earthshattering Fouler with Greg Pickersgill, the polltopping True Rat alone) organizing conventions (Seacon in '75, Seacon in '79) and causing inferior SF. magazines to fold (we name no names). A true fan indeed. Come and see him at Heathrow next Easter. The Skycon Fan Room welcomes all.

The book room and art show will be open at times throughout the con in different places entirely. AWARD RESULTS


Various awards were presented at Eastercon '77, the most important being the following...


