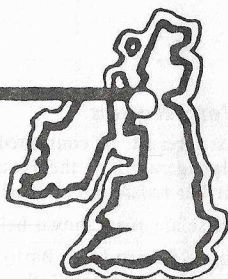


FAIRCON '82



PROGRESS REPORT 3

Introduction

Welcome to the third and final Progress Report for Faircon '82, Glasgow's sixth Science-Fiction Convention. To be held in the luxurious surroundings of the Central Station Hotel, Faircon offers a wide selection of attractions. We have a Main Programme, featuring talks, films, and other items of general interest, plus an Alternative Programme, Fan Programme, Video Programme, Computer Room, Art Show, War-gaming Room, Star Trek Room, and much, much more. Faircon's Guest of Honour is *Harry Harrison*, while our Special Guest is *Naomi Mitchison*.

Our guests are both internationally known authors, and in addition Hugo-winning SF author

Bob Shaw and the ever-popular *Jim White* will be attending. Faircon takes place over the weekend of ~~Saturday~~ July 23rd to Monday July 26th, and about 400 Members are expected to attend.

Hotel Rooms

As a result of continued negotiations with the Management of the Hotel we have procured a further reduction in Hotel Room Rates.

Food and Drink

The Central will provide light snack-type food at set times during the day and evening; these times will be displayed in a prominent position at Faircon.

A typical choice of food is shown in the box opposite. If these don't grab your salivary glands then you can always go outside the Hotel to a variety of local eateries. In addition, the Malmaison restaurant within the Central offers a fine selection of good food at reasonable prices.

Outside the Hotel are a number of Chinese, Indian and European eating-places. There are a host of take-away burger joints, and for anyone who actually dislikes food there is of course the British Rail Buffet. Faircon does not carry insurance against funny food...

If you're particularly lucky then Theme World Consultant's *Buck Rogers Burger Station* may be open by Faircon; visiting it should be an interesting experience. Food of a terrestrial type is liberally mixed with space station decor, and the entire enterprise is at least as daft as Faircon!

Bar patrons will be pleased to hear that Faircon '82 has a private bar just off the Main and Alternative Programme sites. Located in the curved and spacious Court Lounge, the Bar offers drinks at moderate prices. Typical costs include 62p for McEwans Heavy, 66p for Lager, and 72p per fifth gill of blended whisky. Coke costs 30p per bottle.

Faircon Members will be able to make use of the bar during all normal Scottish opening hours (morning opening may vary due to glasses being collected etc) and right on until 4 am each morning. Sunday afternoon opening will also take place.

University Challenge

noted ability to confuse the most clear-thinking, may make University Challenge an event to remember. Of course, he could have meant *hastily*!

Entries should be directed towards *Henry* at the address shown above and he'd greatly appreciate as much warning of teams proposing to compete as possible. So write in NOW! Depending on the number of teams competing - and remember that



last year we had a *Didn't go to University* team - we may be able to cope with last-minute entries; remember, however, that we won't be able to guarantee a place if you don't give us advance warning.

As well as organising University Challenge, *Henry* has announced that there will be a 'mystery competition'. He won't tell anybody about it, and so we must simply wait and worry.....

Lord of the Rings Quiz

There will be a Lord of the Rings Quiz at Faircon. Questions will be put by LoTR enthusiast *Douglas Gray*, and details regarding entry etc will be available at Faircon's registration desk. Read up on LoTR, and prove yourself an expert!

Albacon II

Many Faircon members will already be aware that at the Channelcon Bidding Session on Easter Sunday the Glasgow-based Albacon Eastercon Bid won against London's Metrocon. As a result, in 1983 the national UK SF Convention will again come to Glasgow. Like the first Albacon in 1980, Albacon II will be a large event and has already attracted 300 members. It will be held in the

Central Station Hotel, but unlike Faircon will make use of *all* the Hotel facilities.

Guest of Honour at Albacon II is that old friend of Faircon, *James White* and special Guest is UK fantasy writer *Tanith Lee*.

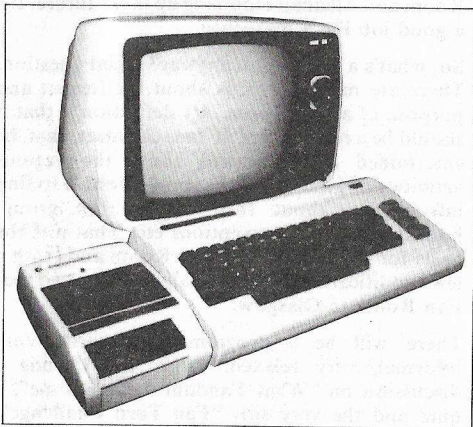

The Computer Room

There will be a Computer Room at Faircon '82. We have promises of a number of machines, including Apples, PETs, VIC-20s, and ZX81s. More machines are, however, always welcome - we anticipate a lot of demand for those that we'll have. Membership Records

In common with Albacon II, Faircon '82 is keeping both Membership and mailing list records on a computer. The computer - an Apple II - will have made itself known to you already by virtue of the nice, readable name and address on your mailing envelopes!

Our records are based on a number of sources, including past Faircons, Albacon 80, and a number of other mailing lists maintained by other people - there are, for example, now Channelcon Members on our mailing list. Our listing retains your name until you cease to respond. In other words, if you don't take out Membership of Faircon (or, indeed, Albacon) you'll cease to be sent Progress Reports. So if you don't respond to the Albacon II mailshot then you should expect no more....

We don't propose to publish our mailing list, although we will use the Faircon data for Albacon, and the residue of information will be passed on to Eastercon in 1984. Your name and address won't be revealed to anyone else - we won't sell your soul to the owners of Time-Life!

If you want to amend your record, or even have it deleted entirely, then please write in to us or see *Doug McCallum* on the Faircon registration desk at the Convention itself. It is but the work of a moment to forever change your particulars! Similarly, if the latest envelope shows an incomplete or inaccurate address then do let us know.

One immediate benefit from the computerisation of our records has been the lower number of letters returned by the GPO; from a peak of about thirty on our first computer mailing we have reduced these numbers to only half a dozen on the second. Not all that thirty can have moved between Faircon '81 and our first PR for '82, and so it seems likely that for years we've been sending nonsense out into the world. If nothing else, think of the sheer cost!

Dealers Room

Dirty Dealer Neil "Did I hear money" Craig, veteran despoiler of youth and purveyor of the collected works of Lionel Fanthorpe, is in charge of our Book Room. Tables cost £9.00 each, and Dealers must also be Members of Faircon. We carry insurance and offer a secure room. We will provide help with loading and unloading.

The Art Show

Mike Molloy seeks contributions for the Art Show. We do not charge any form of hanging fee, although should your work be sold we will take Commission of 10%. Our Art Show carries insurance and is supervised at all times. If you want to show your paintings, fanzine illustrations, models (glass cases available), or whatever, then contact Mike c/o Faircon as soon as possible. Although space limitations are not so severe at the



Central as they were in earlier years at the Ingram Hotel we have still to finally allocate the room for the Art Show. Depending on response we'll have either a large or extra large room (well, small or middlin').

Safety

Possibly mistakenly, Mike "Molotov" Molloy has been chosen to be the Faircon Safety Officer. Despite his reputation for mayhem, Mike has never been known to accidentally kill anyone...

Seriously, though, SF Conventions are potentially dangerous. Consider the reaction to fire during a crowded film in the Main Programme. Not a nice idea, but one that must be met and overcome. Three SF Cons of one type or other have had fire alarms and evacuations within the past year (remember the Faircon '81 special rude awakening on the Sunday morning?) and each time we have luckily had no panic and no fire. Even so, you are strongly advised to locate fire escapes during your stay and to at once report any incident to either the Hotel staff or the Faircon Committee.

Trailing cables and lost glasses will be ruthlessly hunted down; cables are inevitable at a Convention where you're powering machinery and will, where possible, be taped to the floor or lead well away from the scene of activity. Glasses are more dangerous in some respects, as empties are regularly left in the dark during films etc. If you empty your glass then please take it back to the bar. We'll regularly ask you to move glasses during the hiatus before and after the programme items.

A number of weapons enthusiasts carry makeshift ray guns around Cons. These are seen by the Committee as a harmless perversion so long as they fire NOTHING and are blunt. They can flash and whoop as much as you like, but if they are remotely explosive or dangerous then you'll be asked to put them away. Similarly, part time Goths, Huns, Vandals, Visigoths, Picts, and Vikings are NOT to display any weapon in public. If we see any display of sharp pointed weapons, or anything we consider dangerous, then the owner will be asked to put his gear away. Continuing dangerous behaviour (and remember that we judge who's dangerous, not you) will result in your immediate expulsion from the Convention. So if you want to wander round in hewing and cleaving gear, whilst accompanied by companions bearing strange death-rays, then by all means do so. But remember that if we think you aren't safe then you'd better get ready to go home.

We're going to organise the Fancy Dress Competition in such a way that any sword-fighting or similar scenes take place well away from the audience; you'll still have a good view, however! The instructions regarding entry to the Fancy Dress Competition will be strictly adhered to in the case of war-like entries.

Vogon Poetry

No safety precautions whatsoever will be taken during the third Vogon Poetry Competition. The winners of this annual hour of torture should expect ritual disembowelment at the very least, and worse if they fail to recant. If you are so unpleasant as to wish to enter this most childish and popular of events then contact *Frances-Jane Nelson* c/o Faircon as soon as possible. Faircon carries no insurance against poetry.

The Faircon Movie

Raiders of the Lost Con has now been completed. It is as bad as *Faircon Strikes Back* and will be shown as a special double bill at Faircon. Persons of a nervous disposition, or anyone who likes a good film, or anyone at all, are advised to avoid both these epics....

Amateur film-makers normally take their activities rather more seriously than do the Faircon Film Crew, and if any serious attempts at films are provided then we'll be pleased to show them. In fact, we'll show anything!

This material we hope to slot into the alternative programme.

So come and be mortified along with the committee. Prizes for the worst and critical acclaim for the truly dire. We dare you to better our worst.

All films will be carefully looked after and will of course be returned in their received condition or better.

Membership Costs

Membership rates for Faircon '82 are at or even below the 1981 rates in an attempt to provide even better value for money. Postal applications for Membership will be accepted only until July the 15th, after which date we will charge the at-the-door rate. So if you're not a Member as yet then write NOW enclosing a cheque or PO payable to Faircon.

You must, of course, be a Member in order to attend Faircon.

Two forms of Membership are now available: Full Attending and Supporting.

Full Attending Membership costs £9.00 and entitles you to attend Faircon '82. Once obtained, you have no more to pay and may come and go as you please over the full four days of the Convention. All Faircon publications are given to you at the door. Full Attending Membership costs £10.00 if you pay after 15th July.

Supporting Membership costs £4.00, and freezes your eventual cost of conversion to Full Attending. A balance of £5.00 is payable to convert no matter when you Support. Supporting Members who do not attend the Convention are sent all Convention literature after Faircon is over. Supporting Membership is not available at Faircon.

A further form of Membership is available at Faircon itself: Day Membership. This costs £5.00 per day, and is valid for one day only. If you pay for two days then we'll make you a Full Member at the at-the-door rate of £10.00 (which, of course, you'll have paid already).

Star Trek

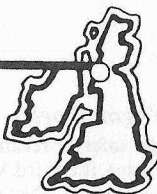

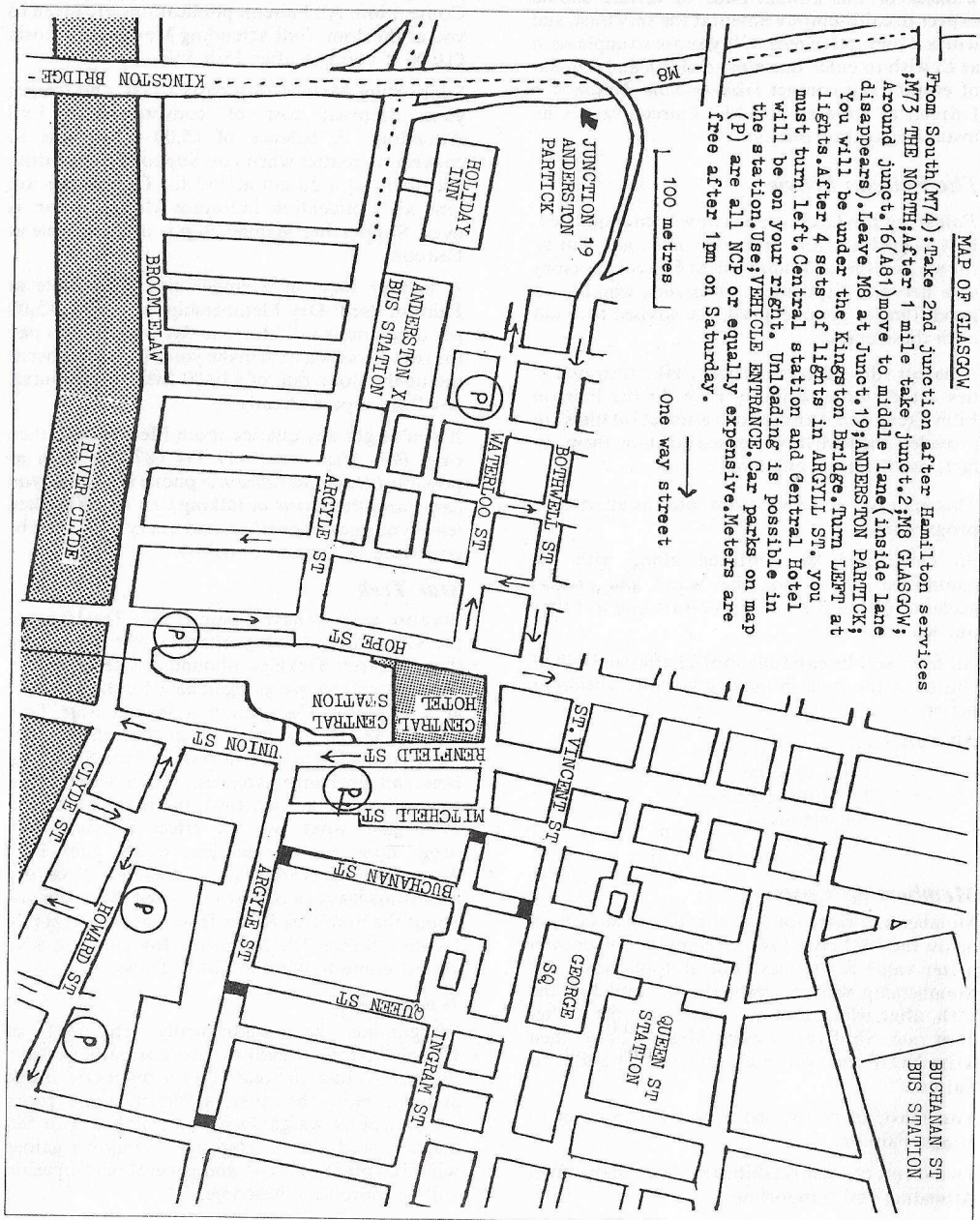
HOW TO FIND

From South(M74):Take 2nd junction after Hamilton services
M73 THE NORTH;After 1 mile take junction 2;M8 GLASGOW;
Around junction 16(A81)move to middle lane(inside lane
disappears).Leave M8 at junction 19;ANDERSTON PARTICK;
You will be under the Kingston Bridge.Turn LEFT at
lights.After 4 sets of lights in ARGYLE ST. you
must turn left. Central station and Central Hotel
will be on your right. Unloading is possible in
the station. Use VEHICLE ENTRANCE. Car parks on map
(P) are all NCP or equally expensive. Meters are
free after 1pm on Saturday.



The Programme

Under the benign sway of *Dave Ellis* the Main Programme has taken shape. Aiding him have been *Bruce Saville* (Films) and *Henry "Jeepers" Balen* (Alternative Programme), with help from a number of other sources including *Chris O'Kane*. The omnipresent Secret Master of Fandom, *Jim Barker*, is in charge of our Fan Programme.

The Main Programme will include talks, panel discussions, and major 16mm film presentations, and suchlike. Expect to see the Fancy Dress and Vagon Poetry Competitions, the Guest of Honour and Special Guest speeches, Committee's welcome, our big films (a quirky selection including such classics as *Dead of Night* (noon on Monday!), *Metropolis*, *Forbidden Planet*, *The Rocky Horror Picture Show*, *Wizards* and, of course, *Hardware Wars*. Showings of *Faircon Strikes Back* will be severely limited! The Main Programme takes place in the Central's Kintyre Suite (seating 225) and for particularly popular items the folding wall between the two halves of the Kintyre Suite will be pulled back in order to allow the full 450 seat area to be used.

On the other side of the Kintyre Suite is the area to be used by both the Alternative and Fan Programmes. The Alternative Programme will provide a less formal atmosphere and we hope to go for a seating 'in the round' layout. Specialist topics and less popular subjects will be aired here, such as yet more *Bob (fake) Shaw* Space talks, and the various quizzes. The Fan Programme will share the Alternative Programme location, and will operate in the evenings and at other times unsuitable for the tender.

Upstairs will be the Video Programme, where a wide selection of Video material will be shown. The Video Room seats 100 in comfort. Nearby are the Art Show, Computer Room, Star Trek Room, and Wargaming Room. No prizes for guessing the activities performed in these rooms (which all seat 20-30 folk!).

Audio Programmes have never been a success, and this year we will at best provide background music etc in the Art Show. If you want the world to hear your favourite music then bring a tape!
