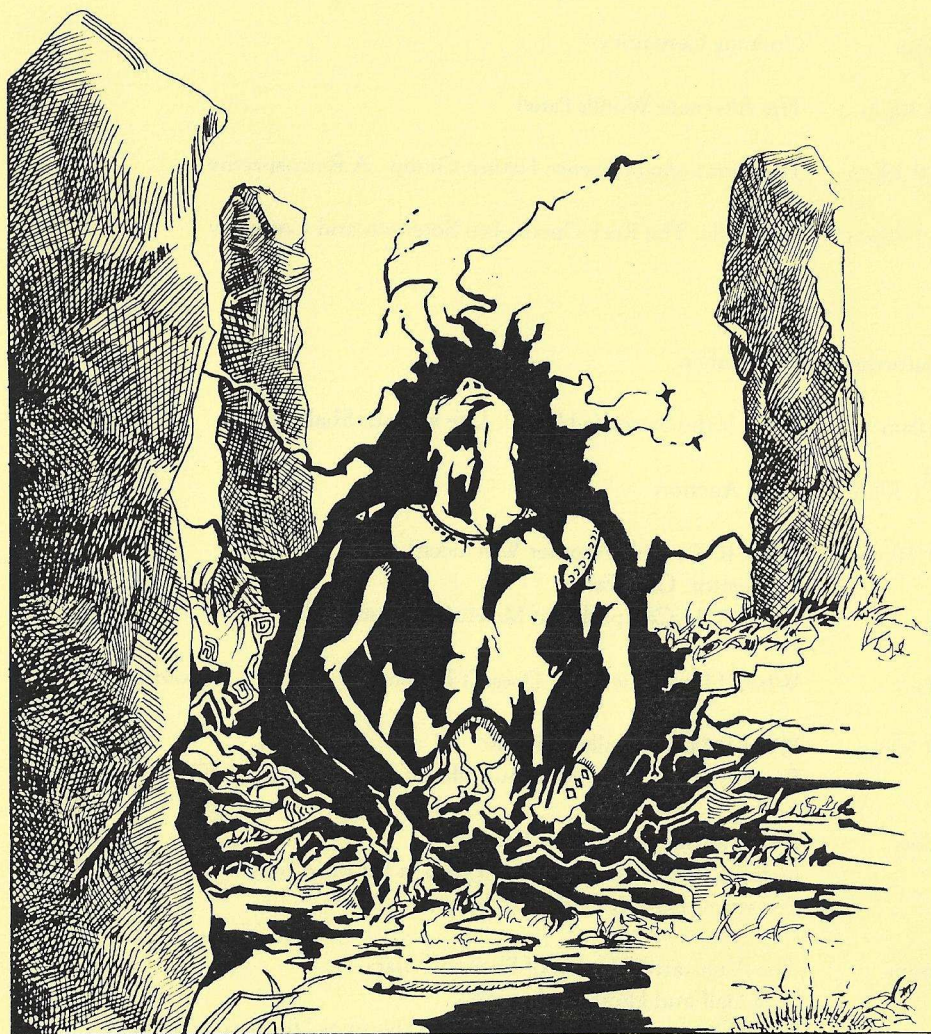

For those not "in the know", the Hotel Ibis lies within Birmingham's Chinese Quarter. There are therefore several good restaurants in close proximity. The area also boasts some good - for wants of a better expression, "Other" restaurants and cafes, etc such as Mr Egg (you probably passed it on the way here..) which is cheap, close and opens VERY late (see map). 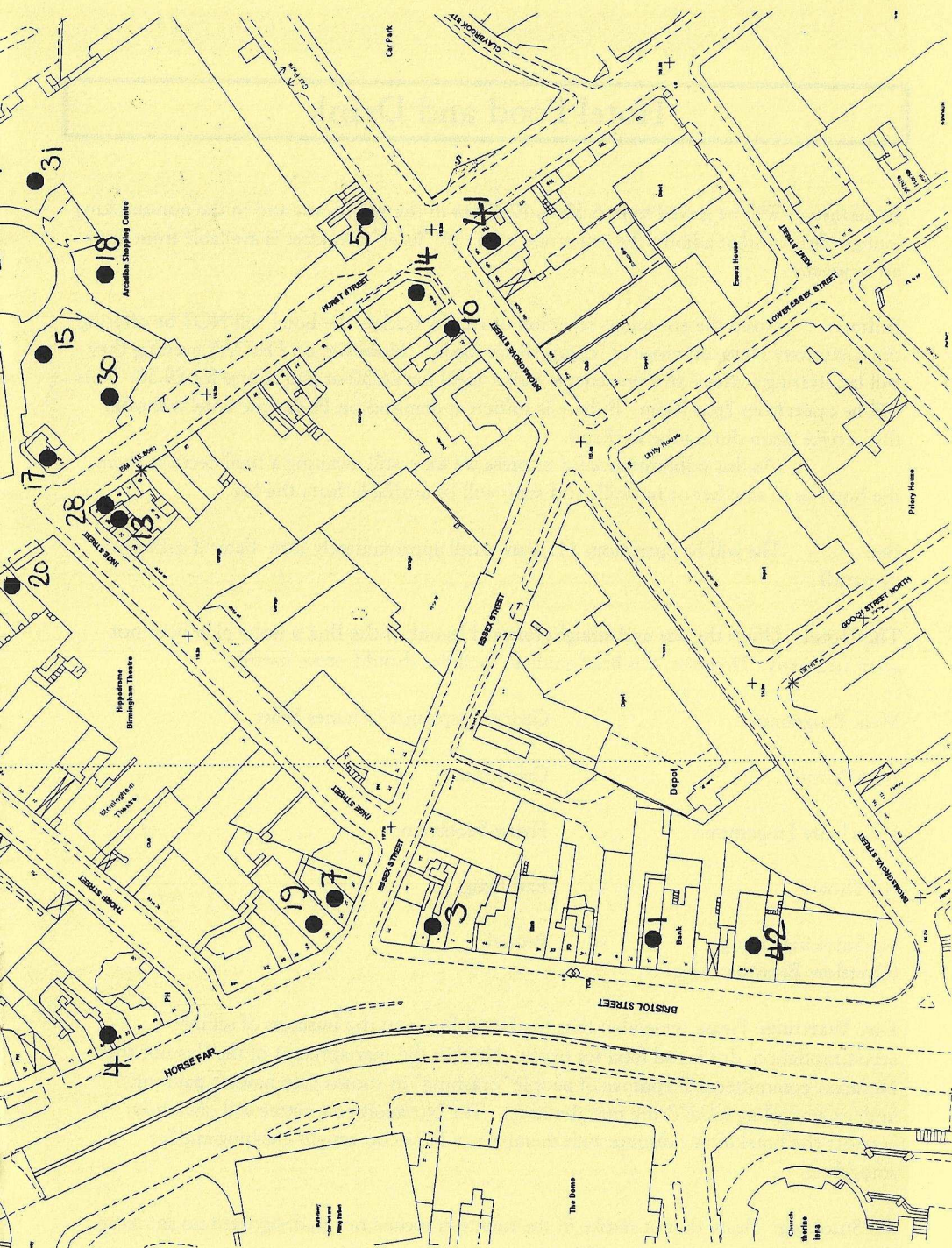

Hotel Food and Drink

Breakfast: Will be served from 6.30am-10.30am in the restaurant and in the non-smoking lounge (Brunel) that adjoins the restaurant area. (A "light" breakfast is available from 4am on request.)

Buffet: Given the enormous selection of nearby outlets the hotel will NOT be offering the customary Novacon range of "cheap snack foods". However, on FRIDAY evening they will be offering a choice of a one course buffet meal for £6.50 or two course for £9.50. This will be open from 7pm-10pm. If there is sufficient demand on Friday the hotel will offer this service again during the weekend.

(As this publication went to press we were still awaiting a final decision from the hotel as to whether or not rolls and soup will be available from the bar.)

Bar: The will be open from 11.30am until approximately 2am (later if sufficient demand).

The Hotel: Given the size and straight-forward layout of the Ibis, a hotel plan does not seem necessary. However, this brief guide to facilities should prove useful:

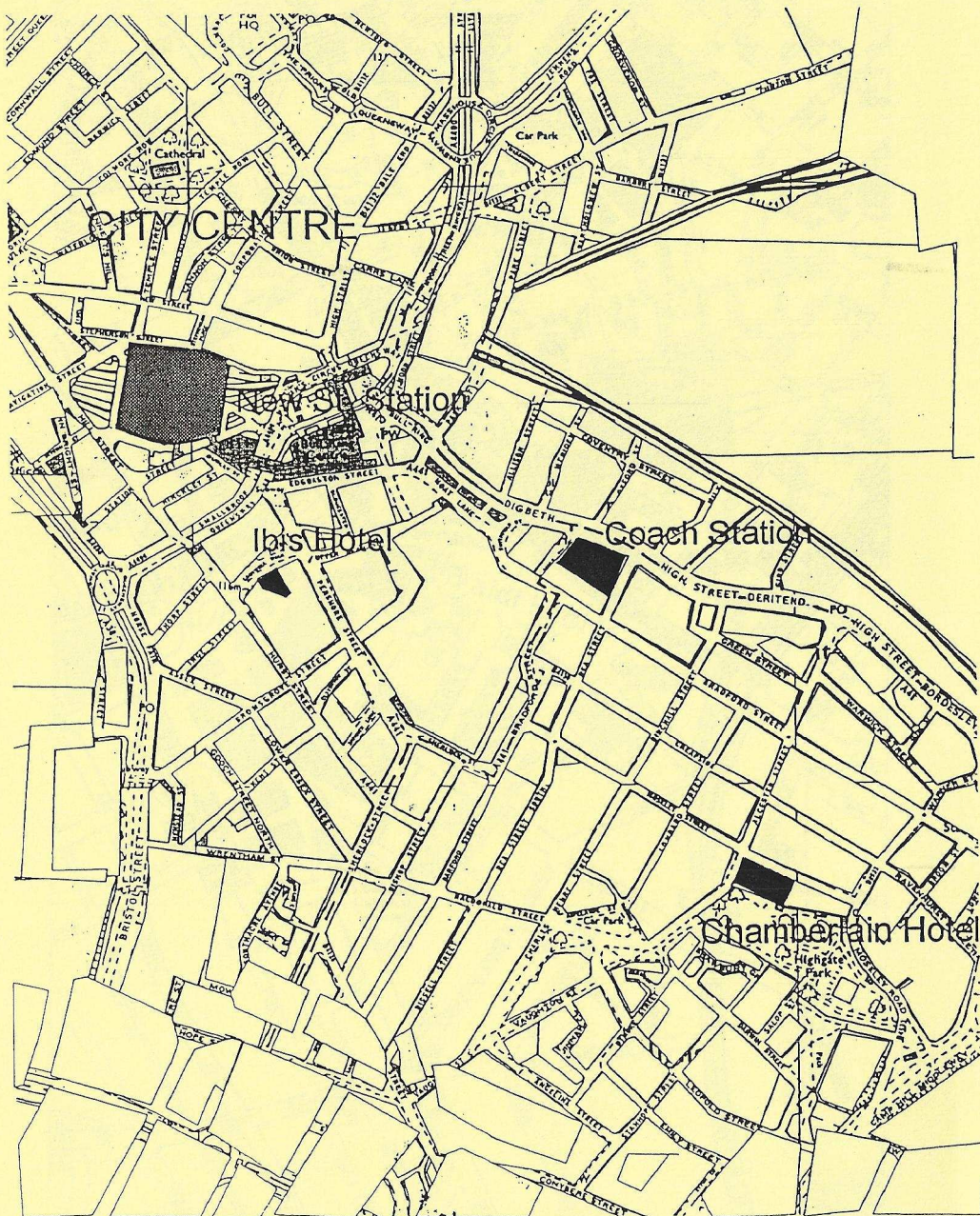
