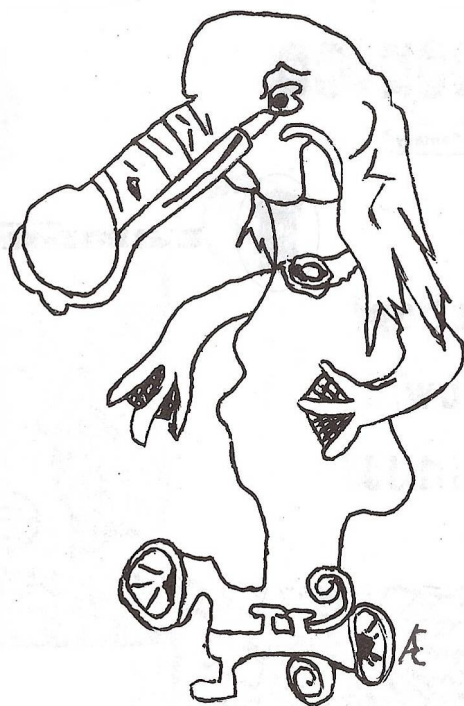
## FANCY DRESS
