

Ken is a fan - and was one before the word was invented Before me as I write is a copy of Ken's fanzine 'Operation Fantast' (contributors amongst others included Carnell, Keller, Newman, Rayer, Williamson, Campbell M'Intosh, Jeeves, Reynolds Clarke and Brunner 'Kitian Houston Brunner that is') - not the original 'Operation Fantast but the new series which started in July 17-18 1949 costing six demarai (one fortieth of a pound or two and a half pence) This is of course whilst serving in HMF in B.A.O.R. (If you don't know what the initials mean, buy Ken a drink and he'll tell you) Ken was axed from the army during the fifties purge - but the Army's loss was definitely our gain. Moving to Wisbech he opened the bookshop Fantast (Medway) Ltd which he still runs. Upon leaving the Army Ken took an active part in fandom, being a founder member of the BSFA and has been made a Life Member of that organisation for services rendered. Taking a less active part now, he still holds a watching brief but feels that the true spirit of fandom has departed with the arrival of the so called 'intelligensia' He holds strong views that S.F. is fun or prophectic story telling but when it requires analysis it is destroying the genre. As for the 'new wave' I cannot repeat his comments;

He has, at one time or another done practically everything in fandom - running a successful convention 'Petercon' 63 and dare I tell it! took his charming wife Joyce to a convention for their honeymoon. K.F.S. is also K.SF., in other words a Knight of the Order of Saint Fantony, but not, I hasten to add, for the honeymoon caper.

Ken has a phenomenal knowledge of SF of books, of people who write them and of people who read them and has many an interesting tale to tell - some of them definitely sub rosa. As I said in the beginning Ken is a genial character - but if he starts to chew his mustache; take cover - as I am going to do before he reads this.


