

John Brunner

a renaissance man



If you have never heard of John Brunner, if you think Stand on Zanzibar and The Sheen Look Up are aspects of the Common Market agricultural politic, then this introduction won't mean much to you as you are attending this convention for sinister reasons of your own—and with any luck, the police will take time out from confronting demonstrators and catch you at it. Bad cess to you.

For the *cognoscenti*, John's place in the front rank of British Science Fiction writers is indisputable, and though this introduction is supposed to be a personal one, I don't think it possible to separate the man from the writer. John is what he writes: a fastidious craftsman and a concerned and caring person.

For that faction within the Science Fiction readership who see SF as "just a good read", and who don't wish to exercise their minds with anything more strenuous than space westerns, John's consideration of political, ecological and sociological probabilities coupled with meticulous research and attention to style may well be wasted. They vigorously oppose the notion that the genre may indeed qualify as Serious Literature and its creators as Serious Writers. The fact is, good writing is good, and even compulsive, reading, and the world of books is large enough in any event to satisfy all tastes. Indeed, the spectrum of John's work is large and varied enough so that there is something for everyone.

John's later books predicate a bleak future for mankind. But those who deplore the "doom and gloom boys" as they call them, never entertain the proposition that the creative act is in itself an affirmation. Exposing the very real dangers that face mankind is, by definition, a plea for facing up to and solving the problems which confront us. It can scarcely be called scaremongering to point out the realities of pollution and the neutron bomb. Or do people seriously feel that a society willing to destroy millions of humans while leaving property intact has its priorities right?

I polemicize, but I do not digress. For John's work is a serious reflection of the honest concerns of his life. He puts his actions where his pen is.

He has been a CND supporter, upholder of civil rights (giving yearly Martin Luther King awards for writing of excellence in that area) and generally a champion of humane, just and often lost causes. He has, in fact, a strong social conscience——all the more interesting because his own background was not one of incredible deprivation. He has never has to suffer first-hand the contempt allotted to "inferior classes", nor has he had to endure the humiliation and uphill slog of oppressed minorities. More credit to him that, man and writer, he can empathize so thoroughly with those who have. Second-hand is better than none.

Downbeat? How does that square with a man who dresses like a Regency buck, enjoys the palate of a gourmet, chats wittily and knowledgeably on an impressively wide-ranging number of subjects (in a variety of languages) as is, in fact, as approachable and friendly a celebrity as one is likely to meet?

I don't pretend to give simple answers to complex questions, but I have known John since 1966 and I know this strong-minded, marshmallow-hearted man to have a great, voracious appetite for life---for himself and others. That quality of life is important to him and to Marjorie, his wife; perhaps seeing the erosion of it and sensing its possible destruction lends a desperation to him and to his work. That is only a suggestion to account for the feeling of urgency and purpose one draws from him.

He's thin-skinned (for this, read "sensitive") and has a precariously balanced ego (what genuine writer hasn't?). The full measure of my respect for the man is that I don't always agree with him (7 out of 10 would be a generous estimate) nor he with me, but I find his conversation always stimulating and his writing constantly maturing.

British Science Fiction is lucky to have him among its number.

This is not the first convention at which John Brunner has been Guest of Honour, and if good sense prevails, it surely won't be the last.

Read his books and chat him up. He's a man well worth knowing and a writer well worth reading.




squares of the city

John Brunner

an appreciation

John Brunner began selling science fiction while he was still in his teens and rapidly became one of the most prolific authors within the genre. He produced a great many novels for the Ace Doubles series in the USA and was a constant contributor to Ted Carnell's British magazines. Most significant, perhaps, was his contribution to Science Fantasy, for which he did a number of excellent short novels and lead novelettes, showing marvellous versatility. One remembers especially the ornate far-future fantasy "Earth Is But a Star" (revised as Catch a Falling Star); the novelettes "City of the Tiger" and "The Whole Man", which eventually became part of Telepathist; the allegorical myth-fantasy "Imprint of Chaos" which began the adventures of The Traveller in Black; the eerie "Father of Lies"; and---from Science Fiction Adventures---the three alternate world stories which became Times Without Number.

By the time he was thirty he had published more than a million and a half words of SF without ever submitting to the temptation of writing comfortably formularistic series. Some of the work was hurried (much of it has been repaired and revised for reissue over the years) but its constant inventiveness is nothing short of astonishing. In the late sixties he revised his priorities and invested a good deal of time and effort in Stand on Zanzibar, a novel which presents a panoramic vision of the overpopulated world of the near future. The novel developed an inordinately detailed background, providing a more intricate and comprehensive sociological context for the main narrative and its subplots than had ever been attempted before in SF (though the literary techniques he used had been available for more than half a century, having been used in the construction of contemporary backgrounds by John Dos Passos since 1925). Stand on Zanzibar won a Hugo, and he continued to use similar methods of presentation in a sequence of novels dealing with the ominous possibilities of recklessness in technological growth and progress. The others are The Jagged Orbit, The Sheep Look Up and --- most recently --- The Shockwave Rider. Contemporary science fiction is, of course, replete with bitter cautionary tales, but Brunner's work stands alone in its detailed analysis and its attempt to provide a map of real possibilities and hazards that extend from the imminent future into the pattern of our daily lives. This social concern has come to dominate his work of the last decade, but he remains an inventive writer and has produced other work of considerable interest outside this main sequence---Total Eclipse and The Stone That Never Came Down spring immediately to mind. His constant reworking of old material has turned several moderate pieces into good books and at least one good book---Times Without Number---into an excellent one.

John Brunner is a man who cares intensely about his work---he has taken publishers to task on several occasions for editorial incompetence and butchery---and such a writer is always worth reading. A man who cares deeply about what he is saying usually has something worth-while to say.





The Nova Award

The Nova Award is presented at each Novacon to the SF fanzine judged best of the preceding year's productions. It's the only award of the kind in Britain, though an informal (but respected) poll is also conducted annually by the newszine Checkpoint. The first presentation of the Nova Award was made at Novacon 3, and in each subsequent year a different panel of judges has decided upon the worthiest fanzine as listed below. That the award is worthwhile is shown by the atmosphere of hot debate surrounding more than one of the presentat-

This year your friendly Committee has made some changes in the rules, copies of which have been sent to all convention members (they are also available at Novacon itself). In short, the selection of the best fanzine has been thrown open to all of you, a ballot being provided with each copy of the rules. Any member of Novacon is entitled to vote provided he or she knows something about the state of fanzines in Britain---and can prove it by having published a fanzine of his/her own, or by having had contributions or letters printed in other 'zines. Details appear in the rules and on the ballot form; please note (if by some chance you're reading this at Novacon) that the voting closes with the registration desk on Saturday evening.

And what is a fanzine? Efforts to answer this question result in definitions as tortuous as the innumerable ones ones of science fiction itself. For the present, we offer the sixth of the new Nova Award Rules---

"For the purposes of this award a fanzine shall be defined as an amateur publication which is concerned with science fiction, fantasy, science fiction and fantasy fans and/or associated subjects, and copies of which may be generally obtained in exchange for other amateur publications or in response to letters of comment. Any paid professional advertisement in the current year shall disqualify the publication in which it is printed. The Nova Committee (see below) shall have the final decision upon whether a given publication is a fanzine."

The Nova Committee --- replacing previous years' judging panels --will strive to interpret this fairly, while upon the Administrator falls the vast burden of ballot collection. If you have a vote, use
